

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

Following the announcement that Fr. Zuccaro was being transferred to a new assignment, and the news that there was no priest to take his place, a number of parishioners contacted me to ask how they could help out in the parish now that I would be on my own while still having my diocesan responsibilities. At the time, I didn't have any specific answer to the question. But now that it's been three months, I wish to offer some suggestions on where I could use assistance in parish life.

First, and most importantly, pray for me. I know this may seem to be the most obvious request, but I wanted to make sure I said it. If there is one thing I have learned over the last 31 years as a priest, it is that, if a priest thinks he can get by on his own without the prayerful support of his parishioners, he is a fool. So, please pray for me that I continue in faithful service to the parish and the Diocese.

Secondly, our parish and school committees need new membership. The **School Board** needs parishioners who are passionate about Catholic education to serve on this board. It meets six times a year, and in this most challenging time, our school leadership needs the advice and support of as many people as we can get. Our Parish Council has been a bit of a flop under my pastorate, not because of the members, but because I haven't quite been able to generate enough interest among the parishioners to serve. The Parish Council is meant to help the pastor make plans for the future in every area of parish life. Again, the board is mean to meet six times per year and looks at every area of parish life to discuss how we can be more effective in our living out our faith, liturgically, socially, and pastorally. We need to add some new members to our Finance Council in order to ensure we are good stewards of the gifts given to us by our parishioners. It works on the budgets for the parish and school, reviews financial reports, and offers guidance on how best to spend our funds. It meets about six times a year. The Social Outreach Committee is our most active and effective board, looking at how we can serve the needy in our community. While it is highly effective, there's always room to improve. Finally, I would like to re-form a Buildings and Grounds Committee to look at how we can ensure the upkeep and improvement of all of our buildings and property. Anyone with some interest or expertise in construction, maintenance, architecture would be welcome.

Finally, although we are not yet back to normal for Mass attendance, we are always looking for liturgical ministers: lectors, servers, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. In particular, I would love to train people to serve as sacristans for daily and Sunday Masses, as well as adult servers for Funeral Masses.

So, here's the first of what I'm sure will be multiple cries for help and assistance. Let me know if you'd like more information about any of these opportunities to serve Christ by serving the parish.

### PUBLIC MASS PROTOCOLS—UPDATED

There are some essential requirements as we ease back into gathering as a community of faith:

- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still suspended until further notice. No one is obligated to attend Mass for now.
- If someone is not feeling well, out of love of neighbor, they should remain at home and watch Mass on TV.
- Those in higher risk categories, over 65, preexisting health issues, are encouraged to stay home.
- Churches can accommodate up to 50% of their capacities while maintaining social distancing.
- Social distancing must be maintained in Churches. A maximum of 4-5 people per pew. Family members may sit together, others must maintain 6 foot spacing, including in the communion line.
- Every other pew will be taped off.
- Hand sanitizer will be used. Please bring your own to church.
- Masks are to be worn in churches as an act of charity toward others.
- Holy Communion will usually be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive on the tongue are asked to approach for reception at the end of the communion procession or right after Mass.
- Collection baskets will not be passed, but will be placed near the backs of the churches to receive offerings.
- We ask that people bring their own wipes to wipe down pews after each Mass.

he Diocese of Burlington developed the Vermont Catholic Advance Directive to help you control your own health care if you become unable to communicate or to make decisions yourself. People avoid thinking about illness and death, yet we know that illness and death are realities.

### What is an advance directive?

An advance directive is a document you use to appoint someone to act for you if you become unable to communicate or to participate in decisions on your health care. You can also tell your doctor your choices for your care in that document.

### Why use the VCAD? Why not other forms?

The VCAD follows Catholic moral teaching on medical care. Other forms do not provide any specific moral guidance and may lead you to make immoral choices. The VCAD also follows Vermont law.

Most states recognize an out-of-state form that is valid in the patient's own state.

### Who can be my health care agent?

It can be a trusted family member or friend. But think carefully: Will that person do what you want and advocate for you and your Catholic values? This is explained in the form.

### What if I do not have any family nearby?

No problem. The person does not need to live locally. Instructions and discussions may be taken care of over the phone. The agent does not have to be a family member. In fact, many

people ask someone who is not a relative to serve as the health care agent.

### What about organ donation?

You may decide to donate organs; you can give that instruction in your form. The one critical issue is that the hospital follows "the dead donor rule" — i.e. does not take the organs before you die. If you have any doubts or misgivings, simply do not donate.

### What about my remains? Who can take care of my funeral?

You can also appoint an agent to handle funeral arrangements in the form. It may be a family member or other person. It may be the same person as your health care agent or someone else.

### What about funeral instructions?

You may give explicit funeral instructions in the form including the church for a Mass and instructions on burial.
