

As we recently celebrated the feast of Pope St. John Paul II (Oct. 22nd), now is a great time to check out “Karol,” a two-part movie which documents the life of this great man, or “The Jeweler’s Shop,” the film adaptation of his play about the struggles and triumphs of marriage. “At age 16, I thought that aspiring to holiness was out of the question. If you really wanted to be holy, I thought, you had to be a priest, nun, or brother. And you had to spend your days doing “religious stuff” like praying, preaching, teaching catechism, or serving the poor. But I had developed an interest in the opposite sex and was headed toward a career in music. So I was disqualified. The best I could hope for was to avoid breaking the 10 commandments, get to confession when I failed, not miss Mass on Sunday and toss a few bucks in the collection each week. That way, I could at least make it to heaven after a lengthy stay in Purgatory. But true sanctity? That was out of my reach.

“If holiness were about marital status or what you did for a living, I would have been right. But the Second Vatican Council made very clear that my assumptions were wrong. Holiness is not about what you do but with how much love you do it. Holiness is really the perfection of faith, hope, and sharing in God’s very nature, which is love (I John 4:8). We are talking about a special kind of love here, the love that gives freely of itself to another, that even lays down its own priorities, interests, and very life, for another.

“So is holiness difficult to attain? No. It is impossible. At least on our own steam. But that’s the thrill of it all. God invites us into an intimate relationship with Him through Jesus. He takes up residence within us and makes it possible to love with His love. Grace is the love of God that comes into our hearts as a free, undeserved gift and enables us to be like God.

“So that means spending all our time in chapel? No it means doing daily, ordinary things with extraordinary love. The Virgin Mary, our greatest example of holiness, was a housewife and a mother. Jesus and his foster father, St. Joseph, apparently spent most of their lives doing manual labor. But when Mary did the wash, she did it for love. When Joseph made a table, he did it for love. When hardship and danger threatened, they met it with faith, hope, and love.

“So holiness is for every baptized person, regardless of personality type, career, age, race, or marital status. In baptism, we are all reborn with the spiritual muscles necessary to get us across the finish line. Yet these muscles must be nourished and exercised if they are ever to develop and carry us the full distance. God provides the necessary nourishment in the Word of God and the Eucharist. And he sends us ample opportunities to exercise.

“But there’s the rub—many of us don’t want to exert ourselves. It can be uncomfortable. We stretch a bit to finish school, to excel at sports, to win the heart of the love of our lives. But when it comes to the things of the Spirit, we often settle with being couch potatoes.

“Leon Bloy, a French Catholic writer, once said “the only tragedy in life is not to become a saint.” Holiness is about realizing our deepest, greatest potential, becoming who we were truly destined to be. What a shame it would be to miss it!”

## Campaign Update

In the fall of 2020, the first-ever, diocesan wide campaign was launched after several delays due to the pandemic. The campaign was carefully planned for almost two years using the results of the Synod and a feasibility study which confirmed that a \$10 million campaign would be supported by the Catholic community. The priorities were: building vibrant parishes, faith formation and helping the poor.

“We were ready to launch the first wave of the campaign in March 2020, after several major donors committed large gifts and the parishes were prepared with their campaign objectives,” said Bishop Coyne. “Then we were forced to shut everything down because of Covid-19. When the churches began to open up again last May, we rescheduled the campaign for the fall. It was a difficult decision and we moved forward with advice from our clergy and lay advisory committees and our consultants.”

The first wave of the campaign ran from October through December and raised \$4.4 million towards the three priorities: building vibrant parishes (60%), faith formation (20%) and emergency aid (30%). The first distribution of \$1.270 million was made in February 2021 with the majority going directly to parishes to meet their immediate needs. A second distribution is being made to parishes by the end of this month.

Most parishes identified two to three tiered goals, allowing many parishes to start projects with this first campaign distribution. Examples include: a new boiler at Christ the King-St. Anthony; technology upgrades at St. John Vianney; neglected repairs to Our Lady of Good Help Church; St. Monica School heating upgrade; and

emergency funds for operations due to a loss of offertory during the pandemic.

Many donors have already been generous to the campaign, while others have asked that we make another request this fall with hopes the outlook with the pandemic will be even better. An invitation to donate will be mailed to parishioners this month to join the campaign and help our parishes reach their goals.

With generosity from people like Dan and Jeanette who were able to transfer stock as a donation and avoid capital gains tax, we know we can reach our goal:

“When we received the Christ Our Hope campaign information my wife and I were at first concerned about becoming involved in a third campaign pledge in one year. We were already involved in two ongoing pledge payments. Upon reflection it seemed to us that in actuality this was a perfect time. Here was an opportunity to live our faith at a time of greater need, by supporting the church’s efforts during the pandemic. While we urge the government to greater effort in aid, we should also do our part. Accordingly, we made a pledge and spoke to others about also becoming involved. Best wishes for a successful campaign.”
