

My dear family in Christ:

During this Lenten season, we are reminded that we are invited to be with Christ in the desert where he fasted, prayed, and was tempted. I know that this doesn't sound like an appealing invitation; however, if we accept it wholeheartedly, we can expect to find ourselves growing steadily in our life of faith.

This year, because we are using the Gospel of St. Mark, this weekend we are not presented with the three traditional temptations, i.e. turning stones to bread, leaping from the temple parapet, and bowing before the tempter; rather, we are just told Jesus went into the desert to be tempted. In some ways, St. Mark's more compact and less detailed description of the temptation in the desert offers us some greater flexibility in considering temptations in our lives. Very few of us have been asked to turn stones into bread or to leap off a tall building with no safety equipment, but we do face temptations to sin in other ways every day.

Last weekend, I encouraged us all to consider that one area of our lives in which we find ourselves struggling the most, and to pray especially about this area throughout the forty days of Lent. Reframing that encouragement, think about it this way: what is the one temptation we constantly find ourselves dealing with and failing to overcome? What is that one sin or failure that keeps hounding us and doesn't seem to go away? Well, that is the temptation we need to pray about fervently this Lent, because that is what the tempter is going to keep putting before us until, by God's grace, we are set free, or made clean.

Perhaps this Lent we will finally be able to move beyond that one thing we most struggle with and move on to the other areas of our lives that still need a bit more Christ and a little less us.

## PUBLIC MASS PROTOCOLS

There are some essential requirements as we ease back into gathering as a community of faith:

- *The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still suspended until further notice.* No one is obligated to attend Mass for now.
- If someone is not feeling well, out of love of neighbor, they should remain at home and watch Mass on TV.
- Those in higher risk categories, over 65, pre-existing health issues, are encouraged to stay home.
- Social distancing must be maintained in Churches. Family members may sit together, others must maintain 6 foot spacing, including in the communion line.
- Masks are to be worn in churches as an act of charity toward others.
- We ask parishioners to please use hand sanitizer and *sign the guestbook as they arrive.*
- Holy Communion will usually be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive on the tongue are asked to approach for reception at the end of the communion procession or right after Mass.
- We ask that people bring their own wipes to wipe down pews after each Mass.


## CHRIST OUR HOPE PROGRESS REPORT

### GUIDELINES FOR LENT

The time of Lent is to be observed by Catholics as a special season of prayer, penance, and works of charity.

\*Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, in particular, are the most important penitential days of the liturgical year. They are days of both fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

\*The rule of fasting states that only one full meal a day can be taken. Two small meals, "sufficient to maintain strength", are allowed, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals breaks the fast, but drinking liquids does not. The rule of fasting obliges all Catholics from 18 to 59.

\*Abstinence refers to the eating of meat. The common estimation of the community is used to determine what falls under the category of meat. The rule of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years or older.

\*The substantial observance of the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious obligation.

\*Self-imposed fasting on the other weekdays of Lent is recommended. Abstinence on all Fridays of the year is also highly recommended.

\*Parents and teachers should see to it that, even those who are not bound by the laws of fast and abstinence because of age, are brought up in an atmosphere that is conducive to a sense of penance.

## The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Trying to figure out who's who is a common human activity. We like to know who we are sharing our time with and what relationship they have to us. So it is with the Church that gathers on Sunday for Mass. Many of the faces are as familiar as our own, but as with any healthy group, new faces are to be expected and welcomed. Some of those new faces may be responding to a call to find out more about Christ and His Church. The Church opens its arms to these seekers with the wisdom and rituals of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (the RCIA).

People who desire to learn more about the Catholic faith and its mission fall into two main groups: catechumens and

candidates. A catechumen is someone who has never been baptized while candidates are those who have been baptized in another Christian denomination who desire to become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church. Catechumens and candidates undergo a period of formation involving a number of steps and phases. Then, after this formation — usually at the Easter Vigil or in the Easter Season — they receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. In 2020, the Diocese of Burlington had 23 catechumens and 36 candidates.

For these catechumens and candidates, Lent is a period of intensified spiritual preparation. At the beginning of Lent, the Diocese celebrates a special ritual: the “Rite of Election” for the catechumens and the “Call to Continuing Conversion” for the candidates. Based on the testimony given by the sponsors and catechists, Bishop Christopher Coyne will declare the catechumens to be “Elect,” chosen by God for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the upcoming Easter Vigil. The bishop also will recognize the desire of the already-baptized candidates for the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist within the Catholic community.

The faithful throughout the Diocese are encouraged to pray for and with the catechumens and candidates this Lent, especially for the new faces they may see in their own parishes.

All are encouraged to attend (either virtually or in person) the diocesan Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion on Feb. 28 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Burlington at 3 p.m.
