

## Pastor's Notes

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

If you check out our parish Facebook page, you'll see a picture of the beautiful tree from the front yard of the Christ the King rectory. I've loved this tree over my five years of living in the rectory, not only in the spring when it is fully in flower, but throughout the summer and fall, and even in the winter when the birds would come to eat the berries that were left on the branches. It has been a constant reminder of the wonder of God's creation and the change of the seasons.

Well, our liturgical year has similar changes and transitions. We observed the 40 days of Lent with prayer, works of mercy, and sacrifice, and now for more than 40 days we have been rejoicing the message of new life proclaimed at Easter. We are now transitioning into the end of the Easter season, with our preparation for Pentecost, and then moving back into Ordinary Time, when we enter the public ministry of Christ. It's a constant cycle in our journey of faith, and each time we enter into the cycle there are always new lessons to be learned; our Catholic faith is never exhausted.

As we prepare for the celebration of Pentecost next weekend, it is an opportunity for us to ask for the Holy Spirit to renew our faith and our parish. As we enter into this part of the liturgical cycle, leaving Easter and moving into Ordinary Time, it's not the time to think we have grown in faith as far as we can. There is always more to learn about our God, our Church, our faith. Especially as we get closer to being fully open in our community and our church, we need to find ways of continuing to mature as followers of Jesus Christ. Just like the beautiful tree in the rectory yard, let's continue to grow and share the beauty of Christ.

Come Holy Spirit, enflame the hearts of your faithful. Send forth Your Spirit, and You will renew the face of the earth.

## Immigration issues force major clergy, parish realignments

Significant clergy and parish realignments within the Roman Catholic Diocese of Burlington were announced this past weekend in a number of communities as a result of changes to U.S. immigration policies and processes. Four international priests, 3 from the Philippines and 1 from Nigeria, who were legally in the U.S. on religious worker visas, will be returning to their countries as their visas will expire before any application for green card status can be completed. Along with normal retirements and transfers, this means the Diocese will be losing six active priests come this July.

“The immigration complication was completely unexpected. The first stage of the green card process which used to take three to four months to complete now takes 17-18 months or longer,” said Bishop Christopher J. Coyne. “My staff began the process for the green cards in what we understood to be a timely fashion only to discover that we were at least a year too late for the priests to be able to stay. Even though these priests want to stay with their parishes here in Vermont, they must go home now so that they can return to Vermont in 12 months.”

As a result, some parishes will be without a resident priest — including parishes in the Champlain Islands, West Rutland, Proctor, Troy and Putney — for at least the next year. In order to provide coverage for the other parishes in the Diocese, a significant number of priests have been transferred to new assignments and duties. “I’ve tried to do everything I can to make sure that as many parishes and churches will continue to have pastors to care for them and I think we will be OK,” he said. “I know it will be difficult for a while for those ‘priest-less’ parishes, but we will try and provide as much coverage as possible for Sunday Mass and the sacraments.”
