

## Pastor's Notes

My dear family in Christ:

First and foremost, to all the mothers, grandmothers, and godmothers in our parish, I pray you have a blessed and joy-filled Mother's Day this weekend. May you be surrounded by the ones you most love and enjoy good conversations, good food, and good laughs.

My original intention last week was to offer a brief reflection on Our Blessed Mother, but the news of Father Baker's assignment to Christ the King-St. Anthony Parish took precedence, so this weekend, as we honor our mothers, I'd like to offer a few thoughts about Our Lady.

At times, there is a criticism leveled against the Catholic Church for its promotion of a strong devotion to Our Lady. I understand that some people get worried that Marian devotions sometimes seem to set aside the role of Jesus as the one true mediator and source of salvation. While acknowledging that some people may get carried away with the role of Mary, authentic Church teaching on Marian devotion makes it quite clear that Jesus is our Savior, not Our Lady, and that true devotion to Mary should lead us into a closer relationship with Christ. That is always the measure we need to use when considering Marian devotions: am I growing closer to her Son, our Savior Jesus Christ? If not, then we should set the devotion aside. Saints who have championed Marian Devotions like St. Louis de Montfort and St. Maximilian Kolbe made it clear in their teaching that Mary never replaces Christ.

Noting this, all Marian teachers and devotions must be tied directly to Jesus. Whether it is the Immaculate Conception, the Assumption, the perpetual virginity of Mary; whether the Rosary, the Memorare, or a simple Hail Mary; we turn to Mary to help us grow in our relationship with Christ. That's the bottom line. For those who worry that we might sometimes love or honor Mary too much, just keep in mind that there is no way our love and honor for Mary could exceed the love and honor Jesus has for His mother.

So, in this month dedicated to Our Lady, let us seek her prayers, as we seek the prayers of our own mothers and grandmothers, that we might learn to trust in God's will as she did. Mary, Mother of the Church and Help of Christians, pray for us.

## Dear Mom,

How many of you reflect on or regret missed time with a loved one? I regret the times I could have called my mom just to chat. My mother hid her dementia from me and my siblings for years. Spending most of her time in the warmer southern states, she would visit each of us for a few weeks each year. Near the end of her life, she was placed in a nursing home, and she did not recognize any of her family — she was not the mother we grew up with. She was not able to hug us, tell us she loved us or sing us silly songs. I miss that woman, the mother of my youth.

I ask that this Mother's Day we each take time to honor those women who have influenced us in our lives. Just as we honor our Blessed Mother Mary, who influences us daily in various ways, we must honor the "mothers" in our communities — those maternal influences of motherhood.

Take time today to thank those women who have maternally influenced you. If she is still with you, start with your own mother. Then your neighbor, a cousin, sister, aunt, family friend or teacher. Pray for her and for women contemplating motherhood. Pray for women unable to conceive, that they may experience the gift of motherhood in relationship with others.
