

Pastor's Notes

*O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, all praise and all thanksgiving, be every moment Thine.*

My dear family in Christ,

It was such a joy to celebrate Hoy Mass with you last weekend. While the numbers at each Mass were below our capacity level (we averaged about 35 people at the four weekend Masses), to have a community gathered around the altar, and have the word proclaimed, and receive holy communion as the people of God was a blessing. A good number of people have expressed to me how much they have missed receiving holy communion over the last three months and are so appreciative of being able to receive once again. These sentiments have caused me to think about how wonderful Our Lord is to us to have given us this sacrament which makes present to us His death upon the cross and His glorious resurrection. It is a gift which, maybe, we are learning never to take for granted.

I understand that many may still be apprehensive about attending Mass on the weekend because of the crowds and fear of the coronavirus. While I appreciate this and support anyone who is still nervous, the attendance we had last weekend, and I imagine this weekend, should put us a little bit more at ease. The churches are not standing room only; the social spacing is clear and easily accomplished; and we are doing everything we can reasonably do to keep our churches clean and safe. If you are nervous about the weekend, consider coming to one of our daily Masses. The number of attendees is smaller, the Mass is shorter, but the gift of the Eucharist is still made available. Daily Masses are offered at 8:30 AM, Monday through Friday, at Christ the King. There are also a number of other churches in our area that have daily Masses at different times that may fit your schedule. Please prayerfully consider this daily Mass option to help you get back into the Church habit.

To quote our Holy Father Pope Francis: *The Eucharist is essential for us: it is Christ who wishes to enter our lives and fill us with his grace. The Eucharist, although it is the fullness of sacramental life, is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak.*

We are made one with Christ and one with each other in this most holy gift. Let us approach the Lord humbly and seeking the graces He alone can provide.

## PUBLIC MASS PROTOCOLS

There are some essential requirements as we ease back into gathering as a community of faith:

- *The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still suspended until further notice.* No one is obligated to attend Mass for now.
- If someone is not feeling well, out of love of neighbor, they should remain at home and watch Mass on TV.
- Those in higher risk categories, over 65, pre-existing health issues, are encouraged to stay home.
- Churches can only accommodate 25% of their capacities. Meaning for both of our churches, no more than 75 people in attendance for any one Mass.
- Social distancing must be maintained in Churches. A maximum of 4-5 people per pew. Family members may sit together, others must maintain 6 foot spacing, including in the communion line.
- Every other pew will be taped off.
- Hand sanitizer will be used. Please bring your own to church.
- Masks are to be worn in churches as an act of charity toward others.
- Holy Communion will be distributed only in the hand.
- Collection baskets will not be passed, but will be placed near the backs of the churches to receive offerings.
- We ask that people bring their own wipes to wipe down pews after each Mass.

Additional instructions will be given at Masses.

### ANew's INDEPENDENCE PLACE

For the past year and a half, our parish has cultivated a special, supporting relationship with ANew Place, providing meals once a month to the homeless community there. Now, ANew Place has an amazing opportunity to provide affordable housing to formerly homeless individuals who participate in their transitional housing program. ANew Place and Cathedral Square will be co-managing the Independence Place property located at 130 Mansfield Ave. This property provides 7 apartments, an office, laundry facilities, and community rooms where they can provide after-care supports while moving guests towards independent living. Over the next month, ANew's goal is to raise \$36,000 to fund this project. This amount represents the operating costs for July-December and helps ANew Place qualify for a matching grant from the UVM Medical Center. ## Welcome Back to the Celebration of Mass

It is with an abundance of joy and gratitude that I announce the first phase of the reopening of our churches to celebrate daily and Sunday Mass beginning June 1.

The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains lifted until further notice, especially if you are part of a vulnerable population and/or have an underlying health condition.

Please approach the celebration of Mass with charity and love for our clergy and faith community by following the protocols:

- ✦ Stay home if you are sick or not feeling well.
- ✦ Wear a mask in Mass.
- ✦ Sanitize your hands upon entry. Due to shortages of sanitizer, please bring your own if possible.
- ✦ Sit in designated pews and respect social distance between others of 6 feet or more unless you are one family unit.
- ✦ Refrain from congregating in tight areas or entering cordoned off areas.

- ✦ Follow the protocols to receive Holy Communion as directed at Mass.
- ✦ Follow your church protocols regarding registration if necessary due to the 25% capacity limit.
