

My dear family in Christ:

I've noted on more than a few occasions that I was sent to the Catholic University of America to study Canon (church) Law. It was through this course of study that I prepared myself to assume responsibilities in the Chancery Office of the Diocese. So, for the last 17 years, I have been putting my canon law knowledge to good use by addressing everything from marriage annulments to the closure of parishes and the sale of church property. Usually, when people hear about church law, they immediately think of a list of stern do's and don'ts, and while Church Law does have laws regulating what to do and not do, there is so much more, including some beautiful canons (Laws) connected to the spiritual life.

This weekend we celebrate the Sacrament of the Eucharist with the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). Read the following reflection on this precious gift; it is canon 897 of the Code of Canon Law:

The most August sacrament is the Most Holy Eucharist in which Christ the Lord himself is contained, offered, and received and by which the Church continually lives and grows. The eucharistic sacrifice, the memorial of the death and resurrection of the Lord, in which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated through the ages, is the summit and source of all worship and Christian life, which signifies and effects the unity of the People of God and brings about the building up of the body of Christ. Indeed, the other sacraments and all the ecclesiastical works of the apostolate are closely connected with the Most Holy Eucharist and ordered to it.

My encouragement for all of us this week is to read this description a few times and take time to thank the Lord Jesus for this gift of His Body and Blood. Through it we grow more and more into His image and likeness and are strengthened to face the challenges and burdens of everyday life. We must never take the Eucharist for granted, because it is Jesus Himself who comes to us to be our food for the journey, through this life to the next.



5-DAY DIRECTED RETREAT

The Society of St. Edmund will be conducting a 5-Day Directed Retreat in the Ignatian tradition from Sunday, June 20, to Friday, June 25 at St. Anne's Shrine in Isle La Motte. Using principles from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, retreatants are invited to contemplate scripture passages in a silent environment, celebrate daily Eucharist, and meet with a Spiritual Director each day. 

Bishop to ordain a priest and a transitional deacon

Two men are scheduled to be ordained this year — one to the priesthood and one to the transitional diaconate.

Burlington Bishop Christopher Coyne will ordain Deacon Robert Murphy a priest and seminarian Gregory Caldwell a deacon preparing for priesthood at a special Mass on Saturday, June 19, at 10 a.m. at St. Joseph Cathedral in Burlington.

The bishop will place his hands on the head of the candidate for priestly ordination, and through this Laying of Hands and the Prayer of Ordination, the Gift of the Holy Spirit for the priestly office will be conferred on the candidate for priesthood who will receive the stole and chasuble, signs of the office of the ministerial priesthood.

Deacon Murphy graduated from Mount Anthony Union High School Bennington in 2013 then attended Providence College where he earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy in 2017.

He first felt the calling to the priesthood in elementary school. "I was open to the call and desired to do God's will for my life," he said. He chose to study for the Diocese of Burlington because it is his home Diocese, and he felt called to serve the people of Vermont.

"There have been many great priests in Vermont who have inspired me in my discernment of the priesthood," he said.

Caldwell, who graduated from Essex High School in 2008, earned a Master of Arts in Catholic philosophical studies from St. Meinrad Seminary in St. Meinrad, Indiana. He was received into full communion with the Church in 2013.

He has said he hopes to bring to the priesthood an ability to "teach in a way that can reach people," an ability to show people how to live their faith and the willingness to bring the sacraments to the people of the Diocese of Burlington.

Deacon Murphy advises men who are contemplating priesthood to focus on growing in holiness — especially through daily prayer — and striving to grow in virtue. "I believe that if they are open and seeking to do God's will, God will lead them to their vocation and give them what they need to live it well," he said.

The ordination will be a special time for clergy to meet in a spirit of fraternity and camaraderie.

Due to the seating capacity restrictions, attendance at the Mass will be by invitation only to allow for the priests of the diocese, Robert and Greg's family and friends, and members of their home parishes to attend.
