

CHRIST OUR HOPE

Christ the King—St. Anthony parish is preparing to participate in the first ever diocesan-wide Christ Our Hope: Building a Vibrant Church campaign. This campaign is rooted in the works of Christ (Matthew 4:23) and the outcomes of the synod to build vibrant parishes (Preaching), strengthen our evangelization (Teaching), and communicate the compassion of Christ in our service to the most vulnerable (Healing). This campaign offers a wonderful opportunity for us. Not only financially—60% of the funds we raise comes back to us for our use to address specific parish needs—but as a larger Catholic community; together we will renew, strengthen, and secure a future for the Catholic Church in Vermont. Next week Bishop Coyne will celebrate the official public kickoff. My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

There were a couple of old phrases that passed through my mind this past week: “It never rains, but it pours,” and “Be careful what you wish for; you might just get it.” The reason for this was the rain we received as a result of Tropical Storm Isaias. While Vermont has been struggling with a hotter-than-average summer and a deficit of rain, many have been praying for rain and cooler weather. Well, the prayers worked maybe too well. In a very short period of time, several inches of rain fell over a good portion of our state, causing some flooding and damage. While the rain was needed, it would have been a lot better if it had arrived over the period of several days, not several hours. Well, we are cleaning up after the storm and preparing for the last few weeks of summer.

The Gospel this weekend could also be seen as an example of being careful what you ask for. Peter challenges the Lord to call him from the boat in the midst of the storm. The Lord obliges and calls Peter out of the boat and onto the stormy sea. Things are OK for a bit, but Peter falters because he takes his eyes off the Lord and focuses on the storm. As he sinks into the water, he cries out and is saved. Peter got what he asked for, but it didn't quite work out the way he expected.

How often in our lives of faith do we ask for something from the Lord and it comes to us in a way we didn't quite expect? We pray for patience and immediately we find ourselves in a never-ending line of traffic. We pray for a charitable heart, and we find ourselves facing a person begging for money. We pray for wisdom and find ourselves with a problem impossible to solve. Like Peter, we find ourselves flailing and feeling like we are sinking in the troubles of life. Our prayers seem to not work out.

This is where we need to remember the most important lesson of the Gospel: like Peter, when our prayers seem to go unanswered, when life seems to be going downhill fast, when it seems as if the storm is about to overwhelm us, we need to cry out to the Lord to be saved. The Gospel is not about walking on water in the midst of a storm on our own. It is about relying on Jesus to sustain us in the storm. On our own, we sink. With Christ, we conquer the storm.

This week, let's focus more on Christ and less on the storms in our lives, and if we are struggling, call out for Him to save us.

PUBLIC MASS PROTOCOLS

There are some essential requirements as we ease back into gathering as a community of faith:

- *The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still suspended until further notice.* No one is obligated to attend Mass for now.
- If someone is not feeling well, out of love of neighbor, they should remain at home and watch Mass on TV.
- Those in higher risk categories, over 65, pre-existing health issues, are encouraged to stay home.
- Churches can only accommodate 25% of their capacities. Meaning for both of our churches, no more than 75 people in attendance for any one Mass.
- Social distancing must be maintained in Churches. A maximum of 4-5 people per pew. Family members may sit together, others must maintain 6 foot spacing, including in the communion line.
- Every other pew will be taped off.
- Hand sanitizer will be used. Please bring your own to church.
- Masks are to be worn in churches as an act of charity toward others.
- Holy Communion will be distributed only in the hand.
- Collection baskets will not be passed, but will be placed near the backs of the churches to receive offerings.
- We ask that people bring their own wipes to wipe down pews after each Mass.

Additional instructions will be given at Masses.

FEED THE HUNGRY



Dear Friends,

During these unprecedented times in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, we have faced personal and collective challenges, including the closing of our churches and the suspension of the public celebration of the Mass, the other sacraments, devotions and funerals. But we have also realized once again something we have known throughout the history of the Church: There is nothing that can stop us from proclaiming the Good News of salvation, caring for the neediest and spiritually feeding God's flock.

Our ministries have continued in new and creative ways. The Diocese and local parishes now live-stream daily and Sunday Mass as well as devotional prayer and other faith engagement activities. During the shutdown we continued to operate Catholic schools and provide emergency aid and residential care through Vermont Catholic Charities. Now, by the grace of God, we have been able to open our doors to celebrate the sacramental worship of the Church together again.

But we still face many challenges. Prior to the pandemic, I was about to launch the first statewide capital campaign for the Catholic Church in Vermont based on the Diocesan Synod priorities that we spent two years developing. That obviously had to be postponed. Still a great deal of time and money has gone into the planning of this campaign, and the contract with the company I engaged to help run the campaign is running down. All things being equal, I would not be starting a capital campaign at this time. But I think we have to and not just for contractual reasons.

Now more than ever, we need to move forward with our synod priorities and launch the *Christ Our Hope: Building a Vibrant Church* capital campaign. We cannot give up on the future of the parishes and ministries serving the faith

community. Many of them have seen significant downturns in terms of funding, and they need our help.

This campaign is rooted in the works of Christ (Matthew 4:23) and the outcomes of the synod to build vibrant parishes (Preaching), strengthen our evangelization (Teaching) and communicate the compassion of Christ in our service to the most vulnerable (Healing).

"And he went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every infirmity among the people" (Mt 4:23).

This campaign offers a wonderful opportunity for each parish to use 60 percent of the funds they raise to address specific parish needs with the other 40 percent going to the larger Catholic community to strengthen our faith formation programs and expand emergency aid to the most vulnerable among us.

Next week I will celebrate the official public kickoff at the beginning of the Sunday 10 a.m. Mass that will be live-streamed at www.vermontcatholic.org/tvmass. I invite you to join me or watch at a later time. Please also take the opportunity to watch the Christ Our Hope video which explains why we need to move forward with the campaign and how it will strengthen our church for the future: www.christourhopevt.org.

I have already made a personal pledge of over \$10,000 towards the campaign. I ask you to please join me in being generous as well. With Christ as our hope, whatever we raise will be for His glory and the Kingdom of God.
