

Pastor's Notes

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our gospel passage this weekend reminds us to be slow to judge others and quick to examine our own response to Christ. The story of the two sons and their responses to their father's request to go to the vineyard was originally shared to challenge the members of the Sanhedrin. The son who says "Yes sir," but does not go to the vineyard is an image of the religious leaders who were quick to quote the Law, but slow to follow its spirit. As a sharp contrast to the Sanhedrin, the son who originally said no to his father's request to work in the vineyard but changes his mind is likened to the "tax collectors and prostitutes" who heeded John the Baptist's call to repent and change their lives. The grave sinners are the ones being praised by Jesus—another example of Jesus turning the status quo upside down.

Applying this to our own time and lives of faith, we might think about it this way: The Lord invites us to work in the vineyard every day; how do we respond? I pray that we find ourselves in the position of combining both brothers. We say "yes" to the invitation to work in the vineyard, and we actually follow through with it. However, in reality, we are probably a different combination of both brothers. At times we say yes and don't follow through, like the first son. At other times, we are like the second son who says no but changes his mind and goes to the vineyard. In other words, our response to the Lord's invitation to faith is never as perfect as it might be.

This reality is where another element of the parable should bring us great hope. It is a reminder that, in the event of our failures in faith, there is always a chance to return. Like the second son, or the tax collectors and prostitutes, the chance to change and return to the Father's love is always there. God is infinitely patient with us, and whether we say yes or no at first, He is always ready to allow us to come back to him.

So, as we ask ourselves which brother we might be at this time in our journey of faith, we need to remember the Father is always the same: loving, patient, forgiving, and ready to welcome us.

### PUBLIC MASS PROTOCOLS—UPDATED

There are some essential requirements as we ease back into gathering as a community of faith:

- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still suspended until further notice. No one is obligated to attend Mass for now.
- If someone is not feeling well, out of love of neighbor, they should remain at home and watch Mass on TV.
- Those in higher risk categories, over 65, pre-existing health issues, are encouraged to stay home.
- *Churches can accommodate up to 50% of their capacities while maintaining social distancing.*
- Social distancing must be maintained in Churches. A maximum of 4-5 people per pew. Family members may sit together, others must maintain 6 foot spacing, including in the communion line.
- Every other pew will be taped off.
- Hand sanitizer will be used. Please bring your own to church.
- Masks are to be worn in churches as an act of charity toward others.
- Holy Communion will usually be distributed in the hand. *Those wishing to receive on the tongue are asked to approach for reception at the end of the communion procession or right after Mass.*
- Collection baskets will not be passed, but will be placed near the backs of the churches to receive offerings.
- We ask that people bring their own wipes to wipe down pews after each Mass.

## Domestic Violence Awareness Month

**W**hy is domestic violence shrouded in silence? Family members, friends and neighbors hesitate to interfere when they suspect abuse in the home either out of loyalty to the person being abused or to protect the image of the family. Some argue that by speaking up, they will only make matters worse or if they speak up and report the violence, nothing will happen.

Domestic violence is recognized nationally in October, yet we must all recognize that this abuse is year-round. The consequences of ignoring those we love who are being hurt or are hurting, or those we casually see on our daily walk, lead to damaging social, economic and mental behaviors for both men and women.

Did you know that younger, unmarried women between the ages of 16 to 24 are at the greatest risk for domestic violence? Women are not the only victims; men and children are abused or witness abuse in the home as well.

Children who witness or experience trauma in the home are forever scared by this abuse; some turn to hurting or victimizing others, develop unsafe attachments to become victims or escape the memories with substances such as alcohol or drugs. I am a witness to this trauma — in my own family growing up — with experiences that haunt my siblings after more than 45 years.

Domestic violence is all around us. We must be more watchful to help others and to offer friendship, kindness and prayer. We must support one another, get help for offenders and remember that we are all God's loved children. As we meet others on our walk, be kind, look people in the eye and show God's love in your smile to support and encourage.

Ignoring domestic violence is not of God; we are called to love one another: "As I have loved you, so you should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn 13:34-35).
