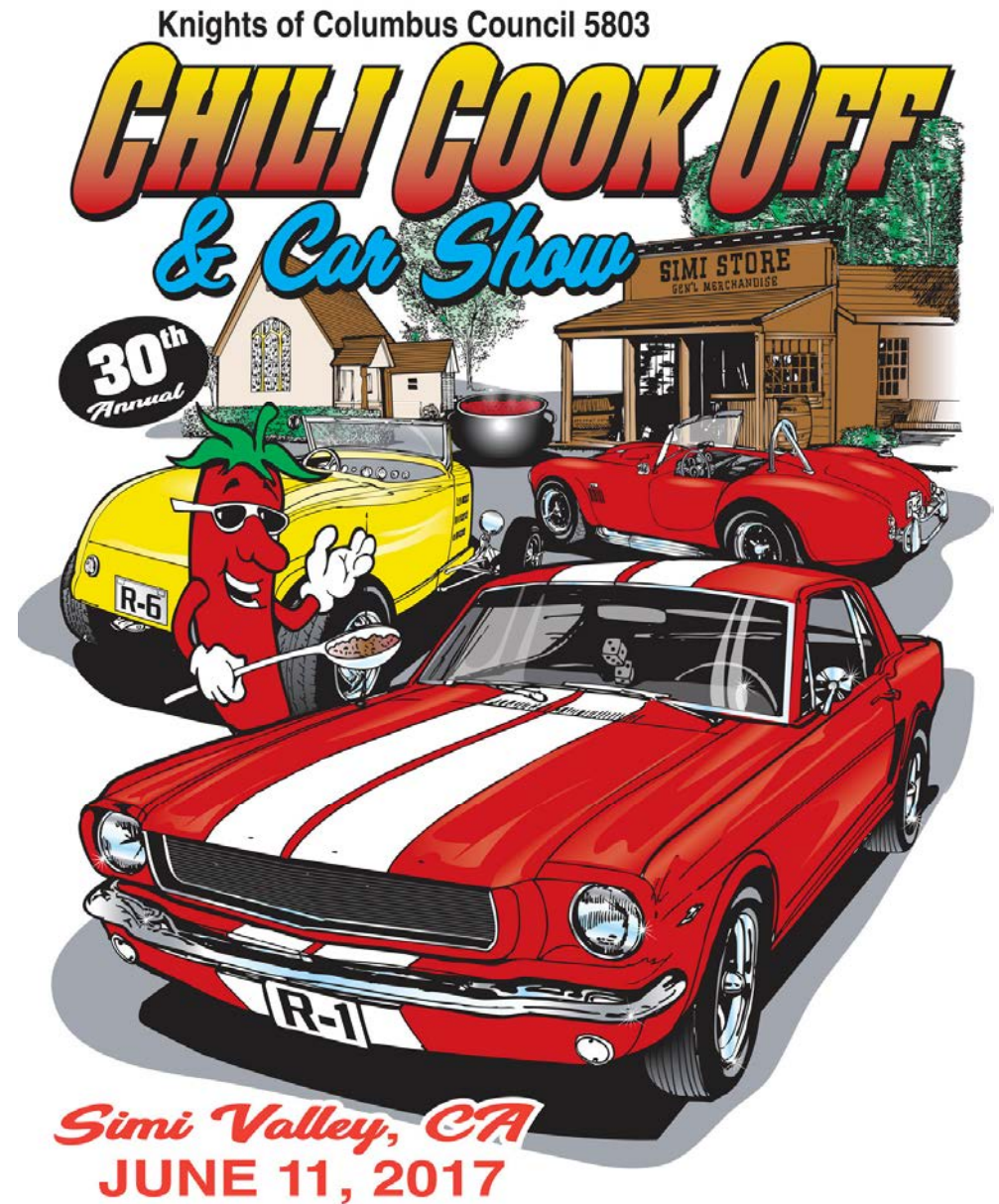

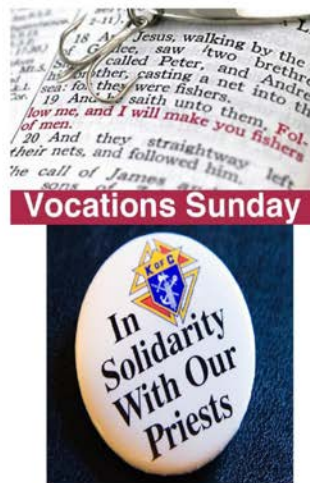
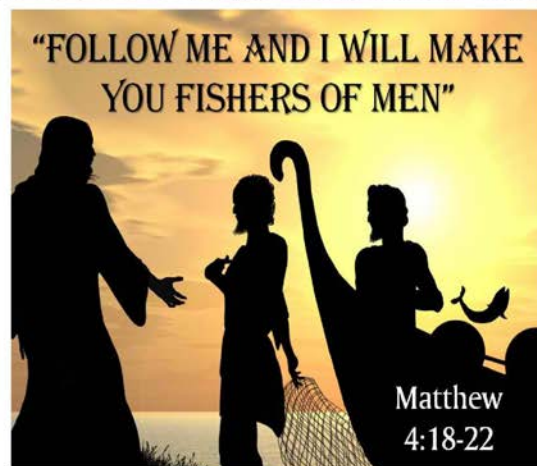
## **Knights of Columbus International Dinner** **In support of our seminarians & religious**

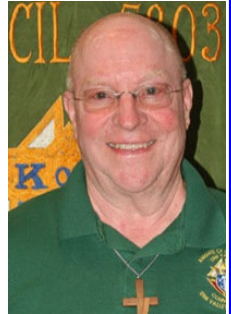
