Calif. have come out with a series of question suggesting that attorney Brian Buescher (U.S. 7th Circuit Court nominee) may be unfit to serve due to his Catholic faith and membership in the Knights of Columbus. Kathleen Blomquist, spokesperson for the Knights of Columbus, told CNA that the senators' questions echoed the kind of anti-Catholicism seen in previous generations of American history. "Our country's sad history of anti-Catholic bigotry contributed to the founding of the Knights of Columbus, and we are proud of the many Catholics who overcame this hurdle to contribute so greatly to our country," Blomquist told CAN. "We were extremely disappointed to see that one's commitment to Catholic principles through membership in the Knights of Columbus—a charitable organization that adheres to and promotes Catholic teachings—would be viewed as a disqualifier from public service in this day and age".

I am so proud of how the Council has adapted to the ups and downs, and I'm confident your perseverance will see us through in the months ahead. I pray that our Lord Jesus Christ will provide you with the courage to meet each day renewed in faith.



Fitness Report

Exercise for Survival

I want to promote once again the idea of exercise for maintaining youthful capabilities. Like prayer and fasting, it covers many sins of omission – of lying around watching the TV and eating junk food, which I am fond of.



It is my saving grace, other than prayer and fasting, that keeps me somewhat slender, muscled and agile, even though I spend literally every night from 7-11PM watching TV and frequently eating junk food, which I do close to dinner – like desert – so I don't go to bed with food in my stomach and have heartburn half the night.

But strength training, which I do a couple times a week, in a way that takes me to the limits of my strength each workout, keeps me looking pretty good for an old guy. I use a 3-day workout sequence of Pushing, Pulling and Legs on three different days. It's easy to remember, I don't have to keep notes or carry a book around to remember what to do. Muscles I worked last time are still somewhat sore, telling me not to work those parts this time. I'm in and out of the gym in about ½ hour; I don't waste a bunch of time on aerobics, because it only makes muscle evaporate; I just push the muscles I'm working to the failure point in 3-4 sets and do some stretching and leave.

That's my secret to keeping fit, along with eating plenty of meats and eggs and vegetables and some berries (and not <u>too</u> much junk food or booze) to overwhelm the benefits of the exercise.

Now I do this at the new Fitness19 gym that opened last month in the old Larwin Square on LA Ave, by the 99c store. Amazingly, they hired me as a Trainer, so I get to share these strategies with old and new friends if they join the gym and invest in a few training session. kitchen and dining.






BINGO WORKERS
