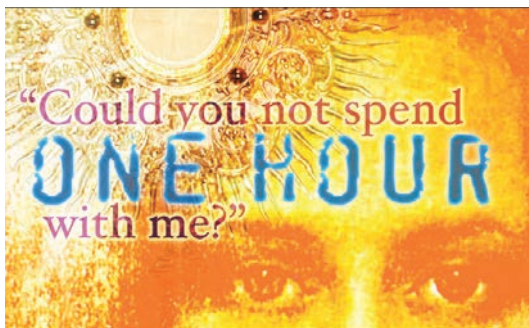
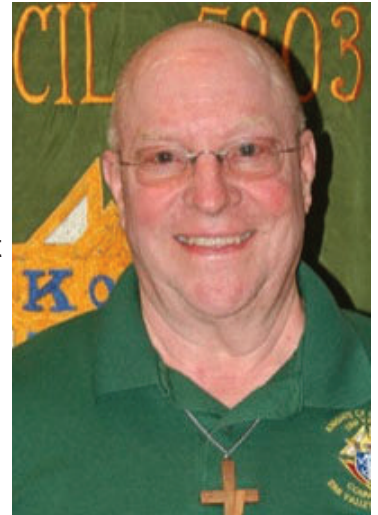
Meditation Prayer

In my first month at Fitness19 I been relegated to training Senior sorts that walk in the door, and all-in-all it has been very rewarding. I've made several new friends, and been part of some rewarding transition stories of people regaining strength and motivation; people starting to feel stronger and seeing themselves improve in a fairly short time. I would love to see more of my fellow Knights come in and take advantage of my experience; only Jim Krebs joined up and he needs no trainer v- it was great to see him back in shape and health after all he has been through – Praise God!

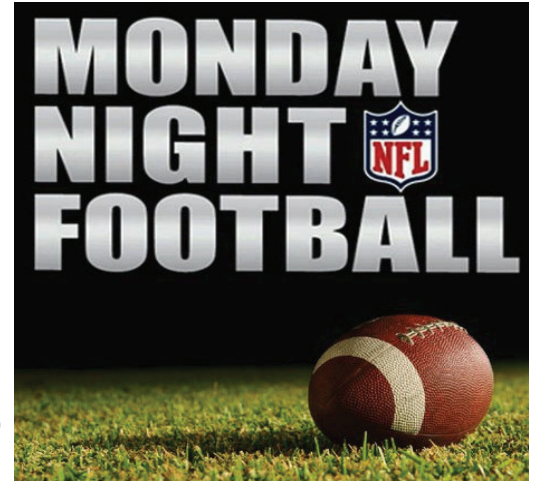


I teach a simple three day training approach: a ½ hour session working the pushing muscles; a second day working all the pulling muscles, also in ½ hour; and a third ½ hour workout on legs. At my age of 79 I only work out two days a week, so it takes a week and a half to build the whole body, but that is enough to keep me agile, strong (for my age) and my immune system tuned up enough to avoid most of the debilitating stuff that his folks in later life.

Next month I plan to talk about a fact of aging that is being heavily researched now – Senescent cells. These are cell worn out enough to stop dividing, but haven't died. They are like Zombie cells that put out nasty chemical signals that damage everything around them, causing surrounding tissues to age faster! Research is focused on strategies to kill them off, bringing back youthful characteristics throughout the body and slowing our aging rate, giving us better health longer. I like that idea!
