# **Expressions of Prayer**


#### **Vocal Prayer**


imagination, emotions and desires. The Scriptural Rosary is much the same way as we recite a scripture verse between each Hail Mary.

# **Senior Fitness**

In my first month at Fitness19 I been relegated to training Senior sorts that walk in the door, and all-in-all it has been very rewarding. I've made several new



friends, and been part of some rewarding transition stories of people regaining strength and motivation; people starting to feel stronger and seeing themselves improve in a fairly short time. I would love to see more of my fellow Knights come in and take advantage of my experience; only Jim Krebs joined up and he needs no trainer v- it was great to see him back in shape and health after all he has been through – Praise God!

I teach a simple three day training approach: a ½ hour session working the pushing muscles; a second day working all the pulling muscles, also in ½ hour; and a third ½ hour workout on legs. At my age of 79 I only work out two days a week, so it takes a week and a half to build the whole body, but that is enough to keep me agile, strong (for my age) and my immune system tuned up enough to avoid most of the debilitating stuff that his folks in later life.





This year's theme is; Be not anxious, living in the peace of Christ.


