# Deacon's Corner

## OUR SPIRITUAL FATHER

In June we are often reminded about "Father's Day" and the many contributions fathers have made to their families. Have you ever thought of St. Joseph in a fatherly way? Has it ever occurred to you that Jesus wants you to have St. Joseph as your loving spiritual father?

The church has always understood Mary's spiritual maternity of the church, but St. Joseph's spiritual fatherhood in relation to the church has not been understood so well, says Fr. Donald Calloway, author of the book "Consecration To St. Joseph". Fr. Calloway points out that in the first few centuries of Christianity, there were people in the church, including the "Fathers of the Church", who were uncertain if St. Joseph could truly be called the father of Jesus, even though Luke 2:33,48 says so. It wasn't until St. Augustine's preaching in the fourth century that St. Joseph's fatherhood of Jesus was clearly explained by the church. In one of his sermons, St. Augustine states that St. Joseph, though not the biological father of Jesus, is nonetheless a real father to Jesus, because he exercised a fatherhood toward Jesus that was authoritative, affectionate and faithful. After St. Augustine cleared up the matter of St. Joseph's fatherhood of Jesus, it was never questioned again.

From Scripture, we know that St. Joseph watches over and protects Christ's Mystical Body, the church as the spiritual father of the church. But what does this mean for you personally? Well, you are a member of the church. Doesn't Jesus want St. Joseph to watch over you with the same paternal love, authority, affection and fidelity that he exercised with Jesus? The answer is It is fitting that we should direct our intercessory prayer to St. Joseph for all our needs and protection. He is the greatest father that walked the face of the earth.

# Frank's Fitness

## Muscle vs Fat – Toward Optimum Body Composition

Muscle is dynamic; it allows us to move. Pretty much everything we want to do in life requires muscle that is functioning well. Excess Fat, on the other hand, prevents us from moving well. Fat is needed to supply energy whenever food is in short supply. Ideally, about 12% (men), 20% (women) of our weight should be subcutaneous fat (fat under our skin, fairly evenly distributed). These excess fat masses promote Inflammation (literally commanding our Immune System to attack our own tissues) as well as the buildup of senescent cells that accelerates our rate of aging, leading to the common diseases of aging.



What is the best way to reduce this store of fat? **BUILD MUSCLE!** If we increase the demand for nutrients in our muscles, less will be stored as fat. If we adopt progressive weight training as our form of exercise, then muscles grow. As they grow, they demand more from what we eat, and if we make them work harder, they grow more. A half-hour workout, done correctly, twice a week will in fact make this happen.

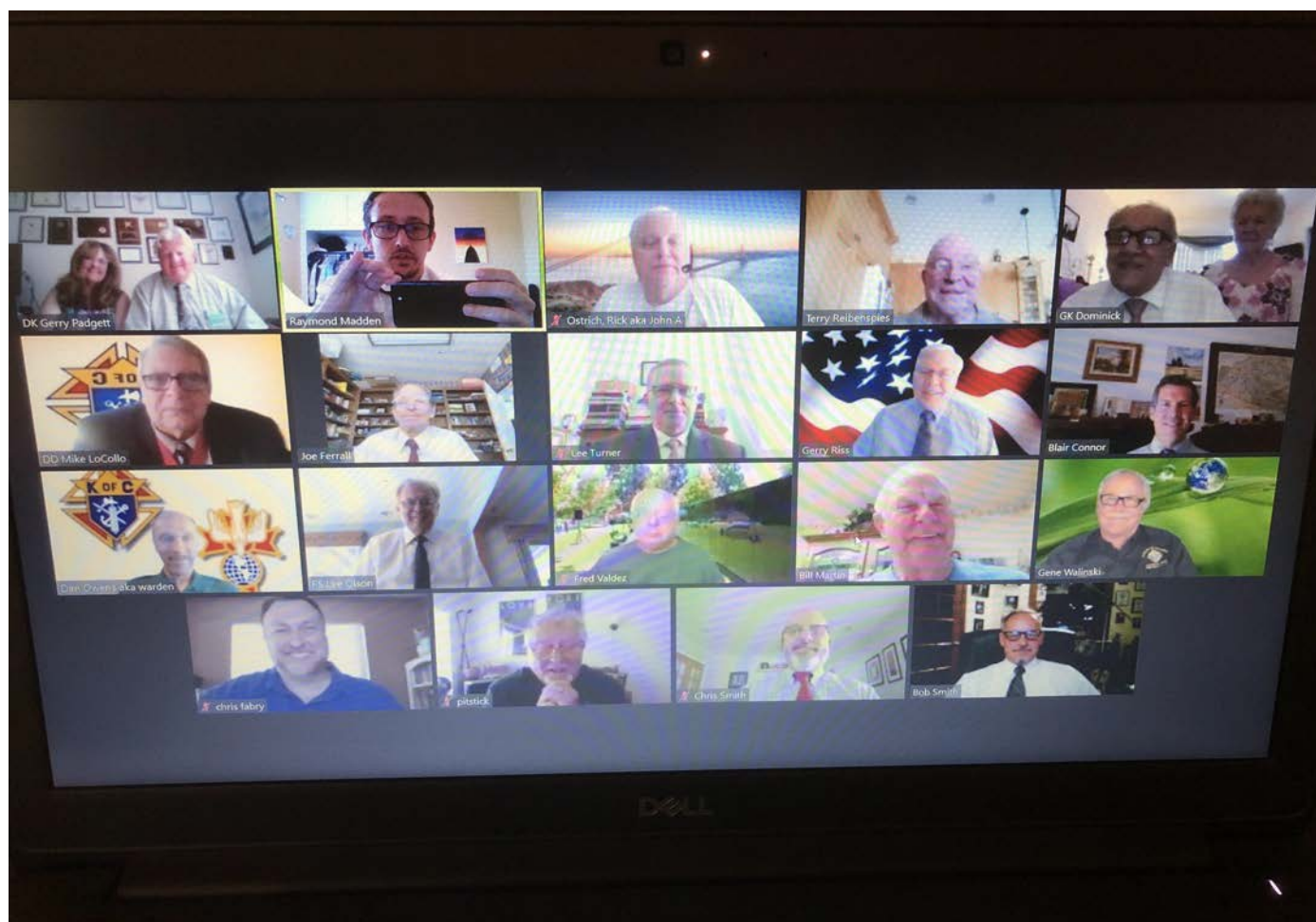
