Deacon's Corner

Souls of the Faithful Departed

During the month of November, we remember and pray for those who have died. If they died in the state of imperfections, they need the purification of purgatory to enter into eternal happiness. The Catholic Catechism tells us: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The church gives the name purgatory to this final purification of the elect." (CCC1030-1031).



Purgatory has been described as God's hospital for souls. Here souls are made perfect for heaven. Jesus tells us that we must be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect. (Matt 5:48).

From the beginning, the church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them. To enter into communication with the all-holy God in everlasting life, we need to be holy. As St. Pope John Paul II explained, "Every trace of attachment to evil must be eliminated, every imperfection of the soul corrected. Purification must be complete, and indeed this is precisely what is meant by the church's teaching on purgatory. For the faithful who die in friendship with God but not yet entirely purified, the mercy of God provides a last cleansing of love which enables them to embrace the fullness of love. This is purgatory. Rather than a forbidding state, purgatory is a region of hope.

Purgatory may be likened to a family that was having Thanksgiving dinner. So they took out their finest china, their most prized possession, for the feast. After a long and delicious meal, their fine china was full of gunk. Rather than put the china directly into the china hutch, the most beautiful place imaginable where it would stay forever, they put in the sink and lovingly washed off the gunk.

This little parable may be a good way for us to understand purgatory. You see you are fine china God's most precious possession. The dinner table represents our lives on earth, where we accumulated a lot of gunk. And the beautiful china hutch represents heaven, where we will live forever.

The Catechism tells us that purgatory is not so much a place but a process, the "final purification of the elect." Rev. 21:27 says that nothing unclean will enter heaven. So think of purgatory as the sink, where God lovingly washes us clean, so that we can take our place with all those who have gone to heaven before us.

Aging and Senescence (Getting Old)

Aging happens at the cellular level. As our Cells get old, so do we. Cells have a life cycle; they can divide to form new cells in their youth, but for a number of reasons – too many to explain – they run out of energy and stop dividing. When they do, they change character; they get cranky, irritated and send out annoying messages calling for inflammation; for our immune system to send in the troops to fix what is wrong. The link above is my affiliate link, and I get a commission if you choose to buy it from Life Extension, but I provide it at a better price (call 805-526-6194 or email wilhelmi@pacbell.net). I use it differently than the label advises: monthly I take the bottle of 36 capsules in 3 days; 4 capsules on an empty stomach, morning, mid-day and before bed; more of a hit-and-run strategy that these cells can't adapt to. I can't prove that this is a better strategy, but I took it from a community of self-experimenters, and it works for me. I do feel something like the fatigue of a hard workout toward the end of the 3 days, which I take as proof of detoxing dead cells.

It is hard to convey the excitement I feel for this advancement in technology, and what it means for humanity. I think this could result in a 20 to 30 year increase in our productive lifespan, if started in our 40s, and we are just getting started.
