Frank's Fitness

Why Does Health Decline With Age – Is there a first Cause?

Science is pointing increasingly at Cellular Senescence (cells that grow old and stop dividing) as the first domino to fall, which leads to many of the specific causes of death. About a third of those are heart-blood vessel diseases, which lead to many related causes of failing health and death. It was thought initially that these cells just went dormant and that they were replaced by new stem cells and eventually collected up and taken out with the metabolic trash.

That proves not to be the case; these cells, which in youth are quietly destroyed by our immune system, become zombie-like and cause surrounding cells to become old like them, secreting inflammatory signaling chemicals, which damage surrounding tissues, literally melting the intercellular matrix that holds cells in place.

The inner surface of all blood vessels is made up of a single cell layer of endothelial cells – cells that produce the Nitric Oxide that regulates the constriction or dilation of blood vessels and therefore Blood Pressure. In reading several studies on BP, the consensus we are settling on is that our senescent cells are the cause of rising BP with age, and that killing them off earlier in adulthood might be the answer to halting the process entirely.

Then there is the cholesterol theory of heart and vascular disease; but now it seems likely that the disruption of the endothelial layer by senescence is the failure that lets oxidized LDL invade the artery lining in the first place, starting the plaque-building process. In every American war we have autopsied our fallen war fighters and found that Atherosclerosis is present in in our young men in their twenties. I had 4 blocked coronary arteries in my late 50s and I had been consistently doing strength training for thirty years and eating what passed for a healthy diet well before that. This leads me to believe that this process of senescence, particularly the endothelial lining of our arteries, is the first cause/mechanism of our failing circulatory system, and the cascade of failing health leading to death, and it starts much earlier than we believed.



Frank's Fitness Cont.

Much research is now aimed at discovering effective Senolytic compounds, both drugs and natural chemicals, which kill or promote suicide of senescent cells. Many of the known Senolytics were recognized from Cancer therapies, and in animal and human studies have proven to restore youthful function and extend both life- and health-span in test animals. Research is progressing to identify Senolytics for specific types of tissues and organs – it seems a-one-for-all cure is not likely.

I've written before about my self-experiments with Life Extension's Senolytic Activator; I'm very enthused about the potential for my own improved health, and for the well-intended, loving folks among us.

Military Service of SK Jerry Brusseau

In May 1965 I graduated from the University of Portland. In July 1965 I was sent to Naval Aviation Officer Candidate School in Pensacola, Florida. October 15 I graduated as an Ensign, USNR, Saufley Field, Florida. On January 28, 1966 I took my first solo flight at Foley Field, Florida. February 1966 I was sent to Whiting Field for training in aerobatics, formation flying, instruments flight rules, and dog fighting. On August 1966 I became carrier qualified and was assigned to the USS Lexington stationed at Corpus Christi, Tx. February 15, 1967 I was designated the 25,027 Naval Pilot in Naval History to receive Pilots Wings, which was pinned on by Dorothy, my fiancé. April 15 I married Dorothy, and I was also promoted to Lieutenant Junior Grade on that same day. May 1967 I was sent to Naval Air Station San Diego for survival training. July 1967 I was on my way to Cam Rohn Bay, Philippines on my 1st deployment to Vietnam where I was attached to the Screaming Eagles Squadron. October I returned to NAS, Whidbey Island, WA. and April of 1968 my son Phillip was born at the naval hospital. My 2nd. deployment came in June of 1968, again to Vietnam. At this point I was qualified to fly four types of planes including a twin engine bomber off of a carrier. I was made a full Lieutenant (captain in the army) on November 1st, 1968. I flew 87 combat missions in Vietnam up and down the coast bombing ships carrying weapons to the North Vietnamese. Some of them we sunk. Our plane was hit on several occasions but no casualties. February 1969 I was returned to Whidbey Island, WA. and then on to Moffet Field, CA. in May for more training on a different plane. December 1969 I left active duty and Honorably Discharged June 4, 1972 I am proud to have served my country.

Military Service of SK Joel Bruemmer

I was 19 when I joined the Air Force on September 5, 1968. I took my boot training at Lackland AFB, in San Antonio Texas. At the time there were many recruits due to the war in Vietnam picking up. In the infinite wisdom of the Air Force they decided to try out air conditioned barracks. Needless to say that took a toll on the guys in them since we had to run in and out of the barracks several times a day and stand at attention all sweaty in a cold environment. About three weeks in I started to cough and run a fever. I was told to report to sick bay at the base hospital. Unfortunately the only way to get there was to catch a bus. This was about 10PM and it had started to rain. The doctor diagnosed me with acute pleurisy which is an infection of the lining of the lungs. I was sent to casual status for about 4 days where I recuperated with medicines and rest. When I restarted I was sent to another flight (in a barracks not air conditioned) that was behind my previous flight by about 2 weeks. I didn't know it at the time but this threw off my tech school schedule by about 6 weeks. After my basic training I was again sent to casual status, waiting for the start of my school at Keesler AFB in Biloxi, Mississippi. I spent my time as a barracks chief and taking care of the laundry for the recruits caught in casual status like me.

I then started my Ground Radio Maintenance schooling in November 1972 at Keesler AFB. The schooling was presented in 2 blocks with a 2 week leave in between. The leave happened in April of 1969. Annelies and I were High School sweethearts and would correspond daily with each other. We had planned to be married on that 2 week leave. So when I got home we had a short time to say hi and then get married. Annelies then came back with me to Biloxi where we set up home in an old apartment building (We were in the second floor. The third floor was condemned.)

After schooling I received orders for Albrook AFB in Panama. I went down and scouted a place to live in Panama City and when I found a place I sent for Annelies. Living off the economy wasn't the easiest thing, especially when we found out that we were pregnant. Christina was born on May 19, 1970.

Ground Radio Maintenance means you fix everything that's on the ground; radios, PA systems, linear amplifiers, fax machines, short wave radios, and intercoms. Every time the brass wanted to move from one office to another we would pull wires for their intercoms. Seems that I was constantly drilling holes in walls and pulling wires. Every now and then we would need to maintain something interesting like short wave radios and height finders.

All in all I enjoyed what I did and am proud to have served. After 3 years in Panama and 4 years of active duty, I was discharged on August 29, 1972 at Charleston AFB, South Carolina.
