Deacon's Corner

Loving Correction

On a busy corner in New York City a burly, efficient Irish cop is directing traffic. Trucks, cars and people swirl around him. Suddenly he spots a pedestrian starting across on a red light. With a whir-r-r of his whistle and upraised arms he stops everything and strides over to the offender to discover that he is a fellow Irishman, fresh from the old sod. Calmly but firmly the cop explains: "Wait a minute; wait a minute. Red is not your color. Green is your color. Wait for the green light and then start across." With a sheepish grin the offender stepped back on the curb, watched the red change to amber or orange, and then started out as the green light appeared. Instead of walking straight across, however, the Irish pedestrian swung out close to the Irish policeman and muttered as he passed: "You sure don't give those darn Orangemen much time to get across."



This story may help us apply what Jesus tells us in Matt 18:5. "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone." Sin here means, not so much a personal offense against you, but an unchristian behavior that might bring scandal or hurt.

To correct others is a duty of some people, like the policeman in our story, like parents, a pastor, a teacher, a coach. One problem is how to do it. The story gives us some hints. Be positive. The Irish cop did not emphasize so much the wrong of crossing on the red light, but the need to cross on the green. He did not shout it for everyone to hear; he told the offender quietly but firmly. He told him what to do as well as what not to do.

Timing, tact, tone of voice, facial expression - all these help in correcting our brother and sister. Best of all is to keep in mind the Golden Rule - Do to others just as you would want them to do to you!

2nd Annual 13 Souls of Kabul Run/Walk

The 2nd Annual 13 Souls of Kabul charity Run/walk/bike was held on Saturday August 26th, 2023, the anniversary of the tragic event, starting from the Simi Metrolink station and ran along the Arroyo Simi bike path to Madera Rd and back. 13 miles for 13 lost soldiers. Posters were placed at each mile honoring each soldier. This was a morning of celebration and reflection to honor those we lost and who were critically wounded on August 26th, 2021.

During the evacuation of the Karzai Airport in Kabul, Afghanistan, a suicide bomber killed 170 people of Afghanistan and 13 U.S. Service Members, and critically wounding 18 U.S. service members. As a tribute to those service men and women that lost their lives from this tragic event, the 13 Souls Memorial Run/Walk/Bike event and fundraiser was born. Organized by Jeff Von Molt a Simi Valley father of a Marine that was there during the evacuation but survived. He turned a personal run into a larger, memorial run for our lost 13.

At 6:15 am a pre-race ceremony started with a brief talk by Jeff Von Molt followed by guest speakers Simi Valley Mayor Fred Thomas, Councilman Mike Judge and Ventura County Sheriff Jim Fryhoff. Fr Joe Shea said a prayer and the President Ronald Reagan Detachment #597 Marine Corps league Color Guard presented the colors with the pledge of allegiance. A very young Isabell Seminski sang the National Anthem and the colors were retired. The stage was set with 13 American flags with a poster and picture of each soldier. Retired Marine Bill Hutton in full uniform stood at attention in front of each flag as the name of the soldier was read and rendered a military salute as a bell was rung. His two granddaughters placed red roses at the foot of each flag. This was a very somber part of the ceremony and you could hear a pin drop. Bill then presented a folded US burial flag and a bouquet of roses to Shana Chappell. Shana is the mother of Lance Corporal Kareem Nikoui one of the 13. Kareem's grieving older brother was so despondent after the loss that he took his own life. We were very much honored to have Shana attend the ceremony. To end the ceremony Taps were played by a Marine Corps League Bugler followed by Scottish Bagpipes and Drum. Doves were released into the air giving a grand end to the ceremony. A short time later (doves were long gone) there was a fly-over by a sheriff's department helicopter with siren blaring away indicating the race was to begin.

Now at 7:00 am with smoke bombs going off the first wave of over 400 runners, the bikes and other modes of locomotion were released to start the race. Then the half marathon runners followed by 10k, 5k and finally the 1k walkers. This was a great event for all to honor those we lost. I saw scooters, regular bikes, electric bikes (cheaters!) weird bikes with no pedals, strollers with kids, strollers with dogs, serious runners, runners with large military packs, cross country teams, military teams, casual joggers, fast walkers, slow walkers, Children of all ages and adults of all ages and more. At their return to the finish line each participant was given a welcome cheer, a goody bag and welcomed to have breakfast served up right there by the Simi Valley

Ys men. Funds raised will go to a college fund, scholarship and memorial funds established by and to help the families of our 13 souls.

It was a fun, community event honoring our lost 13 celebrating life and the freedoms we have here in the United States. This was certainly an event that supports Patriotism, the main principal of the 4th degree Knights of Columbus. I would like to personally thank Council 5803 and the Fr McDonaugh Assembly for the generous donations and the following brother knights who helped at the event: Paul Friedeborn, John Downey, Larry Peltier, Larry Denning and Fred Valdez. I also want to thank Norm Ouellette, Jerry Padgett, Ken Buttke and Frank Saraceno for helping load chairs and tables.
