Deacon's Corner

History of Lent

The first 3 centuries A.D., the Easter celebration originally included a 1-2 day period of fasting before the all night vigil and the Eucharist. By the 5th century, candidates for Easter baptism (usually adults) entered the final stages of preparation for the sacrament during the Lenten season. The weeks of Lent developed from this period of preparation.

Ash Wednesday became the first day of Lent. On that day, sinners publicly enrolled as penitents and were sprinkled with ashes as a sign of their repentance. By the 7th century, the days of Lent and Holy Week were more firmly established. Fewer candidates prepared for Easter baptism, but Lent became a period of spiritual renewal for all the faithful.

From the Middle Ages on, the ceremonies of Holy Week and the Lenten practices of prayer and fasting were fully developed. The 40 days of fasting recalled Christ's fast (Matt 4:12) and the fasts of Moses (Ex 34:28) and Elijah (1Kings 19:18). In modern times, strict church rules regarding fasting and abstinence were gradually relaxed in favor of personally choosing penitential and self-denial practices. The emphasis for the Lenten period continued to be on Christ's suffering.

Vatican Council II reaffirmed ancient themes: the faithful should recall or prepare for baptism and do penance to make themselves ready for the Easter celebration. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. In order to foster a greater spirit of penance, of reparation for sin, to encourage self-denial, and so guide us more closely in the footsteps of Christ, Holy Mother the church, reminds us of the following obligations of fast and abstinence during Lent, and also admonishes us all to a deeper prayer and worship.

Obligations

Abstinence - All 14 yrs and over to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.

Fast - All 18 to 59 yrs are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals may be taken but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Real Food is Life-Giving; Drugs are Not Our Best Friend

Consider how massive numbers of species live on this earth, thriving from birth to death, eating and drinking only what nature provides. Now consider drugs, all of which are based on molecules, some found in nature, but modified to a state never seen in nature so that they can be patented, and presented to us to treat a specific disease. Consider that in nature no 'dis-ease' is caused by a drug molecule deficiency, and ponder why we seek out patented pharmaceuticals to fix them.

Consider that today most drugs are marketed to be taken for life; that the disease condition is never really corrected or repaired – the condition is now *treated*, and under control; we are OK now and can go on living as we wish. We ignore the possibility that living as we wish may have caused the condition. Besides, change is hard and what to change is not easily understood.

Consider that virtually all Doctors being educated or trained today are following a path to a specialization; to treat a limited group of diseases with a basket of drugs not found in nature, while remaining unconcerned of the underlying cause for the development of those conditions. Meanwhile the conditions are the subject of thousands of hours of commercials broadcasted or streamed to our entertainment screens, payed for by the pharmaceutical companies to convince us we cannot fix or avoid the conditions, but they can be controlled for life if we but take this or that drug.

Consider that the Institutions training these doctors are funded by the very drug companies that lobby the government to help fund the institutions and their research, and to regulate the insurance companies that mechanize the payment system for the drugs. In the USA **Medicare and Medicaid programs account for \$1,339 billion or 5.4% of GDP¹**, the largest single expense category for taxpayers to support, and this is growing at a rate exceeding our national economic growth as our population grows older. We are going broke being ever sicker.

This rant was triggered by an interview of one [Calley Means, a crusader for sensible health practices](#), posted on Youtube. It is about an hour and 15 minutes and well worth listening to. The interviewer is Dr. Mark Hyman and Means presents a sad picture of current trends in health care. It focuses mostly on the issue of metabolic disruption from our modern diet and how this lays the foundation for failing health as we age. A major theme is that we are going broke as a nation paying for a healthcare

system that is not making us healthy, but letting us live longer at great expense for our children. [Means' website](#) is rich in ways to better health. My pitch is that anything you can do today to build better health is better than doing nothing. Eating/nutrition is the number one practice to improve **now**; read [my Nutrition topic](#). Then, start moving; the most productive exercise for seniors is Resistance Training and I am a good resource for that information: 805-587-6855.

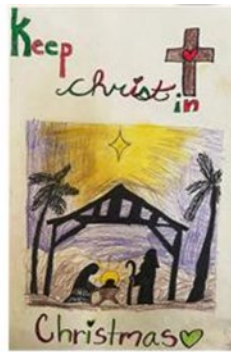

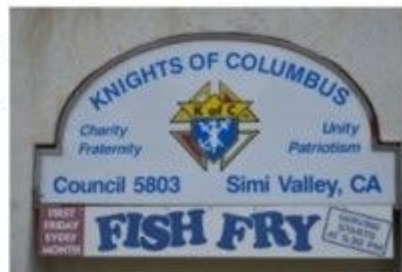
