

They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing looking at the sky? It's as if the apostles were told. "Don't just stand there, do something."


Certainly there is a great deal to do to carry Jesus' message to the world to get on with the business of living, to look ahead and not be lost in memories of the past.



Alpha-Lipoic Acid; The Master Anti-Oxidant that We Need More of for Aging Well

I was reviewing supplements I used to take for nerve pain but no longer needed and came across newer versions of the most common recommendation for neuropathy, <u>α-lipoic acid</u>. There are now liposomal forms that insure near-complete uptake and assimilation from oral doses, and are <u>available in 1500 mg doses</u>, which have been tested for safety in recent studies.

I also ran across <u>a recent study</u> that explored the use of α -lipoic acid (ALA) for a plethora of conditions related to aging, touting the benefits of supplementing ALA, to replace production which declines with age, so preventing many such conditions, or delaying them until much later in life, such as follows.



Cardiovascular Disease: ALA reduces oxidation of LDL Cholesterol, lowering vascular inflammation, slowing progression of Atherosclerosis and lowering risk of heart attack and stroke. It improves function of the Endothelium, improving regulation of blood pressure (aided by better kidney function).

Neuroprotective Function: In the brain it regulates activation of immune cells (glial cells), lowering several inflammatory factors thought to contribute to Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, Huntington's and ALS. ALA is protective of nerve tissues and their metabolism, preventing many forms of nerve damage and neuropathy and is clinically used as treatment for those conditions.

Kidney-related Disease: Diabetes and high blood pressure are key factors in kidney damage; ALA lowers the impact of both on kidney function. It down-regulates expression of genes leading to subsequent fibrosis in damaged kidneys. It is protective of the microstructure of the glomera filtration apparatus by quenching free-radicals which increase within aging kidneys.

Inflammatory Disease: In general, ALA serves to recharge anti-oxidant function of several others such as Vitamin C and E, enhancing their function. It lowers the levels of numerous pro-inflammatory factors that increase with aging, likely because it improves overall function of the immune system. It is shown to be chemo-preventive, lowering incidence and severity of a number of cancer types, actually killing many types of cancer cells.

Effects on Gut Microbiome: ALA promoted gut healing in cases of intestinal inflammatory diseases and ulceration, lowered inflammation, and in some studies moved the gut biome population toward a more youthful expression. It increased expression of several factors important to tight junction maintenance of the epithelial cells lining the intestines, improving leaky gut-related issues.



Toxicity : ALA demonstrates significant ability to kill cancer cells of several types, while improving function of normal cells. Safety studies indicate chronic safe levels in adults of 1800mg/day and in pregnant women and infants up to 600 mg/day. Supplementary replacement of ALA lost to lower production due to aging looks to be a practical anti-aging strategy. I found no studies with concrete evidence to the contrary.
