I offer a two-fold health message this month:

1. How to easily research information on any health issue for yourself.
2. A practical way to age more slowly, avoiding the 5 most lethal diseases of aging

I asked two AI programs (Google AI search in the Chrome browser and Perplexity.ai) this question/inquiry: **Discuss the impact of senescent cell accumulation in the 5 most lethal diseases of aging.** Below is the answer I got from Perplexity, which agreed entirely with the Google search, but was more succinctly written. I've condensed the results for clarity.

First, senescent cells are old cells that have stopped dividing but have not died and then produce a basket of harmful chemical signals that break down surrounding tissues, rapidly aging our bodies until something fails and we die. Treatments being developed to stop this process are Senolytics (kill them) and Senomorphics (stop the chemical signals).

Senescent cell accumulation contributes significantly to the pathogenesis and progression of the five most lethal diseases of aging: heart disease, cancer, chronic lung disease, neurodegenerative diseases, and diabetes-related complications, including chronic kidney disease. In each, senescent cells promote tissue dysfunction through chronic inflammation, impaired regeneration, and disease-specific mechanisms.

Heart Disease

- Accumulation of senescent cells in cardiac and vascular tissue leads to increased fibrosis, inflammation, and oxidative stress, all of which contribute to heart attack, heart failure, stroke and organ failures from poor blood supply.

Cancer

- Senescent cells both suppress and promote cancer: their secretory phenotype (SASP) can create a pro-inflammatory, pro-tumorigenic environment, supporting tumor growth, invasion, and metastasis.

Chronic Lung Disease

Neurodegenerative Diseases

- Removing senescent cells in animal models helps preserve neural function, myelin and reduces neuroinflammation and brain shrinkage.

Diabetes and Chronic Kidney Disease

- In type 2 diabetes, senescent cells accumulate in fat tissue, pancreas, vasculature, skin, and kidneys, promoting insulin resistance and high blood sugar, which rapidly ages all the body's organs.
- In chronic kidney disease, senescent cell accumulation and SASP are now recognized as central drivers of kidney tissue degeneration, leading to kidney failure.

Experimental models show that senolytic therapies can improve organ structure and function in age-related and diabetic kidney disease

AI puts information like this, which would take hours to compile from tens of studies, at our fingertips in seconds. My pitch: use AI to stay healthy enough to do Gods work!

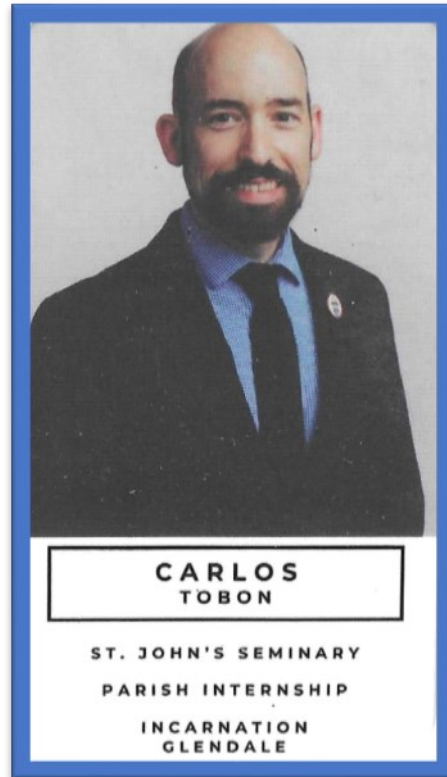
My strategy for eliminating senescent cells, which in most studies seem to be replaced quickly by local stem cells, improving tissue function with lower inflammation (and Pain):

Outside of the classroom, I was involved in playing lots of music (both at church and for community events), leading a young adult group, and helping with local community events. During this time, I started thinking more about “trying out” the seminary. I continued praying and asking for guidance. Eventually, during the pandemic, I decided to give it a shot. In 2021, I moved back to California to attend St. John's Seminary. Since then, it has been an incredible experience of prayer, studying, and serving. During the 2024-2025 school year, I was assigned as a seminarian intern to St. Rita's Parish in Sierra Madre, where I was able to learn and develop other pastoral skills that will be important in the priesthood. Currently, I am back at the seminary, where I am enjoying my classes and preparing myself for hopefully many years of faithful ministry as a priest.

Please continue to keep me in your prayers as I still have almost a couple of years to go in seminary, as my anticipated year of ordination is 2027. I truly appreciate all the support that the Knights have given me throughout these years. I am praying for you! May God bless you!

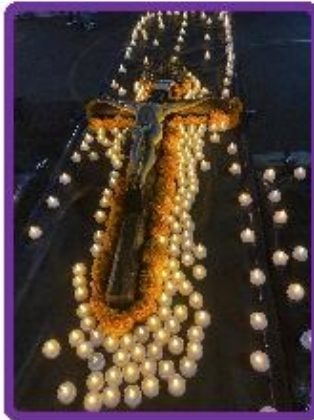
