

# December 13, 2020 Third Sunday of Advent Isaiah 61:1-2a; 10-11; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24; John 1:6-8 19-28

John the Baptist figures prominently in the gospel of this third Sunday of Advent. Last Sunday he played the same prominent role. This is about the only time of the church year we hear about John. Then he disappears from the scene.

John is the one who tells us to prepare—to get ready for one greater than himself. John does not draw attention to himself, even though we are told great numbers of people came to hear him and to be baptized by him. But John always spoke of one who was to come after—one, "whose sandals I am not even worthy to unfasten."

In all this, John sets an example for us. Our good deeds done for the Lord; our telling others about the Lord; should lead others to the Lord and not to ourselves. If others see "Christ in us" that is all and good.

We should hope that by word and works we would help lead others to know Christ. But it is Christ who works in and through us. "To Christ be the honor and the glory," an old saying states.

If we lead others to Christ we imitate the great St. John the Baptist. To do thus should be one of our Advent goals.

Christmas gifts were discussed; Pat Gosch made a motion that we give the same amounts as last year to those on the updated list, seconded by Terry Duerre. Motion carried.

2021 Budget envelopes are ordered but have not yet arrived -- hopefully they will be here before the end of the year.

Elaine Kleve made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Joye Meyer. The meeting was adjourned with an Our Father.


