

August 29, 2021 Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8; James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27; Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

On the first day of school the young boy or girl learns very quickly what are the rules and regulations of that school. They may or may not be the same from year to year; nonetheless, each year they must be learned anew.

What isn't learned that first day is the matter of which rules are more or less important, and which ones the teacher(s) will enforce more or less strictly. This learning takes a while, but each student learns it in time.

What is also learned in this whole process is some rules are important, but not enforced as such; and some rules are minor but may cause big trouble if they are broken. A spirit of fairness and unfairness is learned; a sense of respect for or disdain for the rules is learned. Much depends on those who make and enforce them whether youngsters develop a good or poor attitude toward "the rules."

One can easily see how this analogy connects to today's gospel passage. Of course there were rules, regulations and traditions in the Jewish religion. This was to be expected. What wasn't to be expected is that petty regulations and superficial rules would take on so much importance in day to day life. The petty leaders used petty regulations to control the lives of others and to make themselves look good. Jesus condemned them soundly. He had every reason for doing so.
