February 12, 2023 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sirach 15:15-20; 1 Corinthians 2:6-10; Matthew 5:17-37

One of the first Catechism lessons we learned was the one about the ten commandments. And in many ways, we remain "ten commandments people." We are old covenant people in our thinking, and thus in our doing. We are minimalists, as some would say. We look at a commandment and say, "well, I don't do that—steal, rob, lie, cheat, commit adultery, etc. so I'm doing pretty good!"

To that, Jesus, were he to speak in a colloquial fashion, would probably say, "Ha! Doing pretty good? You're not even in the ball park, much less playing the game!"

The reading from the Sermon on the Mount for today really stretches our ideas about what 'doing pretty good" means. Jesus picks out a few of those very familiar commandments and invites us to look deep below the surface of the words. For example, "good enough" just to not commit murder. If we are to follow the ways of God taught by Christ Jesus, then we wouldn't even think ill of another person!

This and the others mentioned in today's lesson are very lofty ideals Jesus sets forth. But we can only move along into becoming new covenant people as we endeavor to live out our Lord's invitation.




