Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kings 5:14-17; 2 Timothy 2:8-13; Luke 17:11-19

*“In all circumstances, give thanks,
for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus.”*

In today’s readings, we witness profound moments of healing and gratitude. Naaman, a foreigner afflicted with leprosy, humbles himself to follow the prophet Elisha’s simple instruction to wash in the Jordan River. When he is cleansed, his gratitude overflows into faith, and he proclaims, “Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel.” Likewise, in the Gospel, ten lepers are healed by Jesus—but only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks and praise to God. Both Naaman and the Samaritan leper remind us that gratitude is not just good manners—it is the natural response of a heart that has truly encountered God’s mercy.

St. Paul, in his letter to Timothy, reminds us that even when we are unfaithful, Christ remains faithful, for “He cannot deny Himself.” The Lord’s steadfast love calls us to respond not with entitlement, but with thanksgiving and trust. When we take time to recognize the blessings that surround us—the healing we’ve received, the forgiveness offered, the love that sustains us—our faith deepens and our witness grows stronger. Like Naaman and the grateful leper, may we be people who not only receive God’s grace, but return to Him with hearts full of praise and thanksgiving.

Gratitude transforms the ordinary moments of life into encounters with God. It shifts our focus from what we lack to the abundance of grace already given. When we give thanks, we acknowledge God’s presence in every circumstance—both joyful and challenging—and our hearts become more open to His will. As we go forth this week, may we strive to cultivate a spirit of gratitude in our prayer, our relationships, and our service to others, recognizing that every gift we have points us back to the Giver.






