*Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18; 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18; Luke 18:9-14

*“God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ,  
and entrusting to us the message of salvation.”*

This week’s readings remind us that God’s justice and mercy go hand in hand—and that both flow most freely toward those who are humble of heart. Sirach tells us that the Lord shows no partiality, yet He listens especially to the cry of the poor and the oppressed. God’s attention is not won by status, wealth, or eloquent prayers, but by sincerity and faith. In a world where self-promotion is often rewarded, these words call us back to the truth: what matters most to God is not how high we lift ourselves up, but how we open our hearts in honest dependence on Him.

St. Paul’s words to Timothy echo that same humility and trust. Facing the end of his life, Paul looks back not with regret, but with confidence in God’s faithfulness. He knows that his strength has come from the Lord, who “stood by me and gave me strength.” Paul’s hope rests not in his own accomplishments but in the “crown of righteousness” that God gives to all who long for Christ’s appearing. His perseverance and humility give witness to a faith that trusts even in suffering.

In the Gospel, Jesus offers the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector—a stark image of two very different prayers. The Pharisee, convinced of his own goodness, stands tall and praises himself before God. The tax collector, aware of his sin, can barely lift his eyes, whispering only, “God, be merciful to me, a sinner.” Jesus tells us plainly which prayer is heard: “Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.” As we come to prayer this week, may we do so not seeking to justify ourselves, but to be justified by God’s mercy. In humility, we find not shame—but grace.

# JOURNEY IN FAITH @ NOTRE DAME

## PARISH SESSION 2 HIGHLIGHTS

### Opening

The Parish Team began with the Journey in Faith Prayer, followed by a review of what inspired the Archdiocese to begin the Journey in Faith process, along with its Mission, Values, and Vision.

### Small Group Work

Those in attendance then worked in small groups to review the three proposed models for our region (RPA 3). All small-group feedback forms were submitted in full to the Archdiocese, and this handout includes only a summary of that feedback.

### Closing

Seventy-four people attended the meeting. Father encouraged everyone to use the word “transform” rather than “change” when speaking about this process. He also invited all to continue sharing their thoughts with the Archdiocese through the Feedback Form on the Journey in Faith website, assuring that all feedback is read and thoughtfully considered.




## MODEL A

### Strengths

This model benefits from a strong number of parishioners within the pastorate, which could lead to increased volunteer involvement. It also includes several Catholic schools and the highest number of priests among all the models. The presence of more young families is likely, and a combined Catholic school with robust enrollment could eventually support the development of a Catholic middle or high school in the future.

### Weaknesses

The distance between parishes was noted as a weakness in each small group. Parishes in this model are not as closely connected as in others, and the overall number of parishioners could also be seen as a limitation. Additionally, some parishes in this model are too far away for their members to regularly attend Mass at Notre Dame.






## MODEL B

### Strengths

In this model, Notre Dame is the larger parish. We already collaborate with and support the other parishes' fundraisers within the proposed pastorate. Masses are evenly distributed among the Mass sites, and travel time between parishes is relatively short. It seems to be more manageable for the priests and represents a better cultural fit for our parish.

### Weaknesses

In this model, there are three Mass sites served by only two priests. It also covers a large area with several older churches that require ongoing maintenance. Spillville appears somewhat isolated, so intentional efforts would be needed to include them in decisions and ministries. Additionally, questions arose about how fundraisers would be coordinated, particularly with Protivin hosting Czech Days.




## MODEL C

### Strengths

The strengths of this model are similar to those of Model B, as it is essentially the same as Model B but without Lawler and Little Turkey. Notre Dame is likely to see higher Mass attendance since Protivin has only one Mass. The smaller geographic area could also be considered a strength. Historically, St. Lucas has produced more vocations to the priesthood, which adds to the model's advantages.

### Weaknesses

This model has one fewer Mass than Model B. It also provides less visibility into what is happening with neighboring parishes, leaving many unknowns. There may be a higher likelihood of some churches moving to oratory status. It has the fewest Masses and the smallest number of parishioners, which could result in fewer volunteers and reduced income. Additionally, this model would separate the Christ Our Hope Cluster.



Each group had the opportunity to indicate their level of agreement with the model, though some groups opted not to do so for certain or all models.


