The Epiphany of the Lord

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

*“We saw his star at its rising
and have come to do him homage.”*

Today’s solemnity shows what can happen when journeying with open hearts and minds. As the first reading from Isaiah advises, “Upon you the Lord shines...Raise your eyes and look about.” The Magi do indeed raise their eyes, see a star, and then make great sacrifices to journey to its source, the Light of the Word, Jesus our Savior. To Him they offer sacrificial gifts. We, too, are called to be stewards of God’s grace. As we walk together through change, each of us must raise our eyes and prayerfully listen to the Holy Spirit and one another.

The Gospel also mentions what can happen when one reacts from fear: Herod reacts to the light of the star in a very different way from the Magi. Instead of being overjoyed, Herod reacts from feeling threatened, causing great harm even when the Savior is so near.

Times of change can create feelings of uncertainty, fear, and anger. We have the opportunity to offer these to the Lord Jesus, that he might shed His light and guide us to walk by his radiance.

Novena January 3-11th

In the most recent "Go Forth" newsletter from the Archbishop, parishioners were invited to join in praying a Novena from the Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus (Jan 3) to the Baptism of the Lord (Jan 11). But what is a Novena?

- Nine days of prayer with a specific intention. It is a structured way to be persistent in prayer and build trust in God's timing.
- Usually involves repeated prayers, scripture, and often praise of Saints or Mary.
- The first novena was the apostles praying for nine days between Jesus' Ascension and Pentecost, waiting for the Holy Spirit. (Acts 1:14)
- It is not necessary to pray the novena at the same time every day (although you can).
- Novenas should not be seen as magical incantations that guarantee desired results. God controls the universe and we certainly do not control God. He is a loving Father in Heaven. Even though our intentions may be good, God knows what is best for us, whether we understand his divine intention or not.

Day 1: January 3 (Optional Memorial of the Most Holy Name of Jesus)

Intention: All the Faithful of the Archdiocese of Dubuque

Brothers and sisters:

*If there is any encouragement in Christ,
any solace in love,
any participation in the Spirit,
any compassion and mercy,
complete my joy by being of the same mind,
with the same love, united in heart,
thinking one thing...
Have among yourselves the same attitude
that is also yours in Christ Jesus,
Who, though he was in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. (Philippians 2: 1-2,5-6)*

Reflection: All of our prayer is made through the name of *Jesus*, which means *Savior*. Today we pray that all the faithful of the Archdiocese of Dubuque will call upon the name of Jesus in faith and trust so that they become more like Him in thought, word, and deed. May we all recognize Jesus through breaking open word and bread, going forth as joy-filled missionary disciples.

Day 2: January 4 (The Epiphany of the Lord)

Intention: Those who have not encountered Jesus or feel disconnected from their faith

*The glory of the Lord shines upon you.
Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come,
See, darkness covers the earth,
and thick clouds cover the peoples;
but upon you the LORD shines,
and over you appears his glory.
Nations shall walk by your light,
and kings by your shining radiance.
Raise your eyes and look about;
they all gather and come to you... (Isaiah 60: 1-4)*

Reflection: The Magi's journey to find the Christ Child was long and uncertain, led only by the light of a star. Their encounter with the Lord leaves them changed, demonstrated by their departure by another way. Let us pray for those who have not encountered Jesus and those who feel disconnected from their faith. May they know the Light of the Lord drawing them to Him. May we, the people of the Archdiocese of Dubuque, welcome all people into a deeper encounter with Jesus.

Day 3: January 5 (Memorial of St. John Neumann, Bishop)

Intention: Archbishop Zinkula

And his commandment is this:

*we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ,
and love one another just as he commanded us.*

*Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them,
and the way we know that he remains in us
is from the Spirit whom he gave us. (1 John 3:23-24)*

Reflection: Saint John Neumann, born in the current Czech Republic, came to the United States at age 25. After his priestly ordination, he was eventually named bishop of Philadelphia. He lived the Lord's command to love one another and relied on the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Saint John Neumann was known for his holiness, learning, preaching, and outstanding gifts of organization. We pray for our own Archbishop Thomas Zinkula, that filled with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, he may know and continue to share the love of Christ and have the wisdom to guide our archdiocese's path as we Journey in Faith together.

Day 4: January 6 (Optional Memorial of St. Andre Besette, Religious)

Intention: Journey in Faith Core Team and Advisory Groups

Beloved, let us love one another,

because love is of God;

everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God.

Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love. (1 John 4:7-8)

Reflection: "'Put yourself in God's hands; he abandons no one," said St. Andre Bessette, who was assigned as porter at the Congregation of the Holy Cross in Montreal. He was known for his gift of healing and had a special devotion to St. Joseph. He reflected the words of love depicted in the reading today. Our prayer today is for the Journey in Faith Core Team and Advisory Groups, that they receive the gifts of discernment, wisdom, and love necessary to further the vision of our archdiocesan community.

Day 5: January 7 (Optional Memorial of St. Raymond of Penyafort, Priest)

Intention: Priests of the Archdiocese of Dubuque

Whoever acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God,

God remains in him and he in God.

We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us.

God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him.

In this is love brought to perfection among us,

that we have confidence on the day of judgment

because as he is, so are we in this world.

There is no fear in love,

but perfect love drives out fear

because fear has to do with punishment,

and so one who fears is not yet perfect in love. (1 John 4:16-18)

Reflection: We celebrate today the optional memorial of St. Raymond of Penyafort, priest, as we pray for the priests of our own archdiocese. St. Raymond was a respected academic and a zealous priest who used his unique gifts to the benefit of the Church. We offer an intention today in gratitude for the priests of the Archdiocese of Dubuque, and pray that as we Journey in Faith they may know and reflect the perfect love of God which drives out fear.

Day 6: January 8 (Thursday after Epiphany)

Intention: Deacons and Consecrated Religious of the Archdiocese of Dubuque

Whoever loves God must also love his brother.

*Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God,
and everyone who loves the Father
loves also the one begotten by him.*

*In this way we know that we love the children of God
when we love God and obey his commandments.*

*For the love of God is this,
that we keep his commandments.*

*And his commandments are not burdensome,
for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world.*

And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. (1 John 4:21-5:4)

Reflection: The commandment to love one's brother and sister is not optional and requires a caring, self-sacrificing commitment. Our deacons are ordained to be servants of love, as modeled by Jesus himself, who came "not to be served, but to serve." Those in consecrated religious life, fueled by their unique charisms and structures, have sacrificially shared the love of God within our parishes, organizations, and religious houses. Today we pray for our deacons and those in consecrated religious life, that they continue to live in the compassionate service of their brothers and sisters for the glory of God.

Day 7: January 9 (Friday after Epiphany)

Intention: Archdiocesan Pastoral Center Staff

By this the love of God was revealed to us:

God sent his Only Begotten Son into the world,

So that we might have life through him. (1 John 4:9, Communion Antiphon)

Reflection: The Christian community should reflect God's love, manifested in Christ. The work of the archdiocesan pastoral center staff is shaped by God's unconditional, sacrificial love. We pray today that the pastoral center staff stays closely connected to life in Christ, that they may be spiritually filled to meaningfully support pastorates and parishes in the Journey in Faith.

Day 8: January 10 (Saturday after Epiphany)

Intention: Parish and Catholic School Staff Members and Leaders

*The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light,
on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death
light has arisen. (Matthew 4:16, Gospel Acclamation)*

Reflection: The staff and other leaders of our parishes and Catholic schools work publicly and behind the scenes to help the People of God to grow in relationship with God. They seek to help parishioners see and respond to the needs of others in imitation of Christ. In short, they share the light of Christ. Today, we pray for our parish and Catholic school staff and leaders, that they truly be empowered by the Spirit and receive the graces from God that they need as we travel together on mission.

Day 9: January 11 (The Baptism of the Lord)

Intention: All the faithful of the Archdiocese of Dubuque

R. The Lord will bless his people with peace.

Give to the LORD, you sons of God,

give to the LORD glory and praise,

Give to the LORD the glory due his name;

adore the LORD in holy attire.

R. The Lord will bless his people with peace. (Psalm 29:1-2, 11b)

Reflection: We, God's beloved sons and daughters, give God glory and seek the blessing of His peace, just as our psalm today proclaims. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. This feast is an apt opportunity to recognize the calling that comes from our own baptism. The heart of the Church's mission is to spread the saving name of Jesus who is the Good News; it is the responsibility and privilege of all the faithful to take up this task anew amidst the increasing challenges of the world today. And so we end this novena as we began, in prayer for all the faithful of our archdiocese. May we live out our baptism as an engaged archdiocesan community of joyful missionary disciples, centered in our Eucharistic relationship with Jesus Christ and united through our legacy of faith.
