Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

To Teach As Jesus Did

In the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to Mark, we find Jesus teaching in the synagogue in his home town. The people there, including his relatives, are not open to hearing him; in fact, they take offense at him. Undeterred, Jesus continues his ministry; and even sends his disciples out two by two to teach and to heal. When he finds out that his cousin, John, has been beheaded for "preaching" to Herod, Jesus goes away with his disciples to pray. But they are met by people who have not heard the Good News. So in verse 34 we hear, "As Jesus went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things." (Mark 6:34)

As our Religious Education office prepares for the 2018-2019 school year, we - like Jesus and his disciples in this Gospel account - are met by a great crowd! We serve 320 families and nearly 500 children and teens in our 45 class sections. Though many of our catechists and aides will be returning in September, we know that God is calling new people to join us in ministering to the children and families in our program. Because of the compassion and faith of the disciples of Jesus throughout 2000 years of Christian history, the Church is still teaching the Good News. 

Families take part in an interactive program with song, dance, instruments, and parachute play, while engaging in prayer and music of our Catholic culture. Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW)

S.R.O. Spotlight-Serving the Vulnerable Subcommittee: This week, we focus on the multiple efforts of our Respect for Life Committee that tirelessly works to uphold the Sanctity of Life. Our mission statement in part reads: "St. Raphael's Respect for Life Committee (RFL) seeks to promote a greater reverence in both our parish and community, for the dignity of human life from conception to natural death. We approach this task with a readiness to nurture and sustain this precious gift of human life through pro-life education, advocacy, works of charity and prayer." Over the last several decades, our society has been bombarded with systematic, cultural changes that were introduced almost subliminally; in our present day, the fruits of these changes have been growing to alarming levels. The upcoming year of committee work will focus on education on three specific concerns: late-term abortion, Physician Assisted Suicide (PAS) and how our society supports the "throw-away" mentality. Join other likeminded parishioners who will work to promote the truth. Watch the bulletin's parish calendar for the first RFL meeting of the academic year on September 18.



"Laws which legitimize the direct killing of innocent human beings through abortion or euthanasia are in complete opposition to the inviolable right to life proper to every individual; they thus deny the equality of everyone before the law."

~ Pope John Paul II, Evangelium Vitae (1995), no. 72.

Catholic Church teaching on abortion: Church teaching specifies "Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains forever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being." ("Donum Vitae," 5). This doctrine will never change. So what can Catholics do or say to change the minds of the pro-choice stance? First of all, we must pray for the conversion of hearts of all persons who support abortion. Without prayer, we can do nothing. Secondly, we must not be afraid to point out the brutality of abortion, particularly, Late-Term Abortion (L.T.A.). This fact must be stressed in our faith community, neighborhoods, and residents of our state. Third, we must offer help to women in crisis pregnancies. This means promoting efforts that provide hope and support rather than allowing fear or pressure to abort to influence decisions of women in crisis pregnancies. We must raise our voices in favor of women and their unborn babies without the negative tactics our opponents use. Watch future notices under this column on the issue of abortion. Each month will focus on a different issue.




