Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.


Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

For four days, high school aged young men who desire to grow in holiness will have an opportunity for Mass, prayer, and Eucharistic adoration, as well time for fraternity, sports, and reflection. Faith Formation for People with Special Needs

In the fall of 2012 St. Raphael started a religious education program for students with autism and other special needs who could not be accommodated in our typical classes. The first class had three students. Since then the program has blossomed and grown. Two weeks ago, five students from our program received the Sacrament of Confirmation. It was a beautiful ceremony where they celebrated with over 40 of their peers who were also being confirmed. Marie Novak's son, Henry, was one of the original three students in our first class and he was also one of those confirmed. Here Marie shares her experience:

Henry was diagnosed with autism at age 2, and once we realized his needs could not be accommodated in a traditional preschool setting we knew he would be

taking a very different path than his older sister, who attended SRNS and later SRS. In addition to the host of challenges we faced, we worried about his religious Would education. understand our faith as he grew older? How would he learn if he couldn't go to a typical religious education class?



Two other SRS families we knew were in the same predicament, each

having a child of the same age with autism. A call went out for volunteers to teach these three special children, and St. Raphael's parishioners answered. We were overwhelmed with the helping hands that came forward, both with and without special needs experience. It was NOT easy. The volunteers who stepped forward shared their talents and spent countless hours preparing materials and lessons. Henry received his first communion on time. I can't express the joy I still feel every time Henry (now 13) receives communion. We are proud to be part of the community that made this happen. Our group has grown. Five students were confirmed on May 18th, including Henry. These children are truly a joy, and we are grateful for the support of Maria Harrington, who leads the program, all the aides, our wonderful priests and the entire parish.

Our annual Mother's Day Celebration begins with a special Mass and May Crowning, led by our second-graders wearing their First


Communion outfits. The morning continues with a

Finally, though it may seem obvious, we should remember that holiness consists in a habitual openness to the transcendent, expressed in prayer and adoration. The saints are distinguished by a spirit of prayer and a need for communion with God. They find an exclusive concern with this world to be narrow and stifling, and, amid their own concerns and commitments, they long for God, losing themselves in praise and contemplation of the Lord. I do not believe in holiness without prayer, even though that prayer need not be lengthy or involve intense emotions.

Trust-filled prayer is a response of a heart open to encountering God face to face, where all is peaceful and the quiet voice of the Lord can be heard in the midst of silence.

In that silence, we can discern, in the light of the Spirit, the paths of holiness to which the Lord is calling us. Otherwise, any decisions we make may only be window-dressing that, rather than exalting the Gospel in our lives, will mask or submerge it. For each disciple, it is essential to spend time with the Master, to listen to his words, and to learn from him always. Unless we listen, all our words will be nothing but useless chatter.

So let me ask you: Are there moments when you place yourself quietly in the Lord's presence, when you calmly spend time with him, when you bask in his gaze? Do you let his fire inflame your heart? Unless you let him warm you more and more with his love and tenderness, you will not catch fire. How will you then be able to set the hearts of others on fire by your words and witness?
