Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

# **Faith Formation for People with Special Needs**

In the fall of 2012 St. Raphael started a religious education program for students with autism and other special needs who could not be accommodated in our typical classes. The first class had three students. Since then the program has blossomed and grown. Two weeks ago, five students from our program received the Sacrament of Confirmation. It was a beautiful ceremony where they celebrated with over 40 of their peers who were also being confirmed. Marie Novak's son, Henry, was one of the original three students in our first class and he was also one of those confirmed. Here Marie shares her experience:

Henry was diagnosed with autism at age 2, and once we realized his needs could not be accommodated in a



traditional preschool setting we knew he would be taking a very different path than his older sister, who attended SRNS and later SRS. In addition to the host of challenges we faced, we worried about his religious education. Would he understand our faith as he grew older? How would he learn if he couldn't go to a typical religious education class?

Two other SRS families we knew were in the same predicament, each

having a child of the same age with autism. A call went out for volunteers to teach these three special children, and St. Raphael's parishioners answered. We were overwhelmed with the helping hands that came forward, both with and without special needs experience. It was NOT easy. The volunteers who stepped forward shared their talents and spent countless hours preparing materials and lessons. Henry received his first communion on time. express the joy I still feel every time Henry (now 13) receives communion. We are proud to be part of the community that made this happen. Our group has grown. Five students were confirmed on May 18<sup>th</sup>, including Henry. These children are truly a joy, and we are grateful for the support of Maria Harrington, who leads the program, all the aides, our wonderful priests and the entire parish.



Vincentian reflection: Today, as we celebrate Pentecost, the Holy Spirit wants to make us advocates of God's presence to bring new life to others, especially those who do not know the love of God in their lives. We are all called to evangelize so that

all those around us know how much God loves and cares for them. Who needs evangelization? Well, we all do but perhaps those who need it the most are the poor. When in times of economic need or crisis, they may not be able to sort out how to work for a resolution to their needs. It brings great comfort to have strangers help them to believe in the mystery of God's love for them. Take a moment to express your love for someone who is lost; "It can be as simple as a reassuring touch or helping hand, or as demanding as giving of our time and money." (Living Liturgy, p.140).

# Religious Education Registration 2019-2020

The St. Raphael Religious Education (SRRE) registration for 2019-2020 Is now open. Classes will begin September 15. SRRE offers continuing faith formation for all children and teens, as well as preparation for sacraments. Each year of faith formation is designed to deepen relationships with Jesus and his Church through focus on what we believe, the celebration of sacraments, how we pray, and how we live. We look forward to having all our SRRE children and teens back in September, and we are eager to welcome new families. SRRE registration is completed online through the parish website. Note that you will need your parish envelope number, as well as the location and date of your child's baptism. Contact our office if you have any questions.

# The Message of Jesus and the Gift of the Spirit

Jesus said to his disciples: "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." (John 20: 21). Pentecost marks the end of Eastertime with the joyful celebration of receiving the Holy Spirit. In today's First Reading, the disciples were gathered in prayer, frightened, the kind of Christians who keep to themselves, but they were awaiting the Holy Spirit according to God's promise. When the Holy Spirit came, they certainly had something to say!

# Rejoice and Be Glad: On the Call to Holiness in Today's World



In his apostolic letter *Gaudete et Exsultate* (in English, *Rejoice and Be Glad*), Pope Francis reminds us that we are all called to become saints. This week: Combat and Vigilance

The Christian life is a constant battle. We need strength and courage to withstand the temptations of the devil and to proclaim the Gospel. This battle is sweet, for it allows us to rejoice each time the Lord triumphs in our lives.

We are not dealing merely with a battle against the world and a worldly mentality that would deceive us and leave us dull and mediocre, lacking in enthusiasm and joy. Nor can this battle be reduced to the struggle against our human weaknesses and proclivities (be they laziness, lust, envy, jealousy or any others). It is also a constant struggle against the devil, the prince of evil.

We will not admit the existence of the devil if we insist on regarding life by empirical standards alone, without a supernatural understanding. It is precisely the conviction that this malign power is present in our midst that enables us to understand how evil can at times have so much destructive force. . . . In leaving us the Our Father, Jesus wanted us to conclude by asking the Father to "deliver us from evil." That final word does not refer to evil in the abstract; a more exact translation would be "the evil one." It indicates a personal being who assails us.

Hence, we should not think of the devil as a myth, a representation, a symbol, a figure of speech or an idea. This mistake would lead us to let down our guard, to grow careless and end up more vulnerable. The devil does not need to possess us. He poisons us with the venom of hatred, desolation, envy and vice. When we let down our guard, he takes advantage of it to destroy our lives, our families and our communities. [#158-161]
