Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

Dear Parishioners,

I once again present this "Tithing" piece to you. It has a holy perspective to help each of us live our life more closely to God.

I always thank God for your generosity. Please continue to give systematically, give cheerfully, give faithfully, and give thoughtfully by wrapping your gift in a parish envelope or selecting to donate through faith direct.

We are the church, together we can help the poor, maintain our buildings, pay our utilities, pay our staff and continue our Catholic education. We give because we are blessed by God, "we do not give to a need, but rather we need to give" in recognition and appreciation that everything we have comes from the Lord. So we give to God in gratitude. and with a cheerful attitude.

Tithing is not a new idea, it is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Christ. Tithing is, making a voluntary, and systematic contribution of financial support to God's church.

Voluntary: means we are giving out of Love for God and thanking God for the many blessings he has given us. The Old Testament tells us that we are to give 10% of our property to God's Church. And God in turn will enrich our lives.

The bible mentions the word tithe 46 times in Genesis. Fourteen times Abraham gives the priest Melchizedek a tenth of everything he had. Jacob the grandson of Abraham, utters this vow in Genesis 28:20-22. "If God remains with me to protect me on this journey I am making, and to give me enough bread to eat and clothing to wear, and I come back safe to my father's house, the Lord shall be my God .... Of everything you give me I will faithfully return a tenth back to you"

Sirach 35:7-10 "In generous spirit pay homage to the Lord be not sparing of freewill gifts. With each contribution show a cheerful countenance, and pay your tithes in a spirit of joy. Give to the Most High as he has given to you, generously, according to your means. For the Lord is the one who always repays, and he will give back to you sevenfold."

**Exodus 23:19** The choicest first fruits of your soil you shall bring to the house of the Lord, your God.

**Leviticus 27:26-33** The first born of an animal already belongs to the Lord, one tenth of all the produce of the land belongs to the Lord. When the animals are counted every tenth one belongs to the Lord.

Proverbs 3:9-10 Honor the Lord with all your wealth with the first fruits of all your produce, then will your barns be filled with grain with new wine your vats will overflow.

Tithing will change our lives and the life of the church.

I can tell you first hand, I was born selfish and stingy. Somehow God opened my eyes and I began to question, why is it that I can simply open the refrigerator and eat when I am hungry, while other kids are going to bed hungry, digging through the trash for food. Why is it that I have a warm bed to sleep in while the homeless have to sleep under the bridges. Finally I understood the Words of Christ, You will always have the poor with you. They taught me to be generous. I finally learned to appreciate God's blessings, and the need to give my first 10% back to God. When I was hungry you gave me something to eat.





When President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863, it changed the legal status of millions of enslaved African Americans from slave to freeperson in the Confederate states of the South. Over the past 46 years, however, many Americans in authority, judges and lawmakers, are still treating women like property before slavery was abolished. These intelligent yet sadly misguided people consider babies in the womb as chattel, possessions to be discarded or destroyed, with their mothers cast as owners. In doing so, they deny the unborn child's humanity. How, you may ask, can you make a difference? Spread the message that treating all human beings with respect and dignity by sharing the message of love. Here is an excerpt

from "Working in Our Churches" section:

We instruct our priests, deacons, religious brothers and sisters, lay leaders, our parish staffs, and all the faithful to endeavor to be missionary disciples carrying forth the message of fraternal charity and human dignity. We ask them to fight the evil of racism by educating themselves, reflecting on their personal thoughts and actions, listening to the experience of those who have been affected by racism, and by developing and supporting programs that help repair the damages caused by racial discrimination. We need to continue to educate ourselves and our people about the great cultural diversity within our Church. One way to do this is to support actively the cause for canonization of the first African American saint. We can also promote knowledge of the martyrs, blessed, and saints of the different cultural groups and nationalities present in our midst, and propose them as models of faith for the entire Church. So many of our parishes are richly diverse, composed of people from various cultures and ethnic groups, such that they can be a model for the whole Church and for the country. We will redouble our efforts to promote vocations to marriage, priesthood, and religious life—especially within communities of color—so as to better reflect all of the People of God. We commit to preach with regularity homilies directed to the issue of racism and its impact on our homes, families, and neighborhoods, particularly on certain feast days and national holidays. We direct our priests and deacons to do the same. We call on theologians to help us address these issues as well. In this task, it is essential to understand, and to help others see, how racism diminishes everyonesociety as a whole—and not just those who are directly affected by it.
