Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

Dear Parishioners,

I once again present this "Tithing" piece to you. It has a holy perspective to help each of us live our life more closely to God.

I always thank God for your generosity. Please continue to give systematically, give cheerfully, give faithfully, and give thoughtfully by wrapping your gift in a parish envelope or selecting to donate through faith direct.

We are the church, together we can help the poor, maintain our buildings, pay our utilities, pay our staff and continue our Catholic education. We give because we are blessed by God, "we do not give to a need, but rather we need to give" in recognition and appreciation that everything we have comes from the Lord. So we give to God in gratitude. and with a cheerful attitude.

Tithing is not a new idea, it is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Christ. Tithing is, making a voluntary, and systematic contribution of financial support to God's church.

Voluntary: means we are giving out of Love for God and thanking God for the many blessings he has given us. The Old Testament tells us that we are to give 10% of our property to God's Church. And God in turn will enrich our lives.

The bible mentions the word tithe 46 times in Genesis. Fourteen times Abraham gives the priest Melchizedek a tenth of everything he had. Jacob the grandson of Abraham, utters this vow in Genesis 28:20-22. "If God remains with me to protect me on this journey I am making, and to give me enough bread to eat and clothing to wear, and I come back safe to my father's house, the Lord shall be my God.... Of everything you give me I will faithfully return a tenth back to you"

Sirach 35:7-10 "In generous spirit pay homage to the Lord be not sparing of freewill gifts. With each contribution show a cheerful countenance, and pay your tithes in a spirit of joy. Give to the Most High as he has given to you, generously, according to your means. For the Lord is the one who always repays, and he will give back to you sevenfold."

Exodus 23:19 The choicest first fruits of your soil you shall bring to the house of the Lord, your God.

Leviticus 27:26-33 The first born of an animal already belongs to the Lord, one tenth of all the produce of the land belongs to the Lord. When the animals are counted every tenth one belongs to the Lord.

Proverbs 3:9-10 Honor the Lord with all your wealth with the first fruits of all your produce, then will your barns be filled with grain with new wine your vats will overflow.

Tithing will change our lives and the life of the church.

I can tell you first hand, I was born selfish and stingy. Somehow God opened my eyes and I began to question, why is it that I can simply open the refrigerator and eat when I am hungry, while other kids are going to bed hungry, digging through the trash for food. Why is it that I have a warm bed to sleep in while the homeless have to sleep under the bridges. Finally I understood the Words of Christ, You will always have the poor with you. They taught me to be generous. I finally learned to appreciate God's blessings, and the need to give my first 10% back to God. When I was hungry you gave me something to eat.





Each pregnancy center provides some or all of the following: counseling about abortion alternatives, information about what government help is available, pre-natal care, sonograms so that expectant mothers can see their babies, room and board during and after pregnancy, clothing, baby items, medical services, assistance for other children, assistance

with adoption, post-natal instruction, help for moms to continue their education, post-abortion counsel and many other services. All of these services are provided free of charge to women with unplanned pregnancies. These centers prevent thousands of abortions each year, assist and care for mothers who are feeling desperate and promote a culture of LIFE, instead of the culture of death. The centers and the people which work in them are truly a great blessing!

The culture wants us to conform: St Paul tells us, "Do not conform yourself to this age but ...discern...what is good and pleasing to God." ~Rom 12:2. Since Roe v. Wade, an estimated 60 million innocent children have lost their God-given right to live. An entire class of persons, children in the womb, have been relegated to the status of "chattel", personal property, who can be disposed of by those more powerful than they. These unborn persons have no power to resist. They are subject to abuse and destruction by those with more power, namely the power of the State. They have no voice that can be heard except our own. Without doubt, the killing of innocent children in the womb is the pre-eminent moral evil of our age. It is for this reason that we must "not conform" to this grave injustice. We must recognize what both medical science and natural justice tell us: children in the womb are human persons with an inalienable right to life. We must instead stand on the side of truth and justice and "what is good and pleasing to God".

First Reconciliation and First Eucharist

This week families with children preparing for First Eucharist in May 2020 are completing chapter six of *God's Gift Reconciliation* (for grades 2, 3, and 4) or chapter seven of *Reconciliation: Pardon and Peace* (for grades 5, 6, 7, and 8). High schoolers are reading *The Light of Forgiveness*. All are memorizing the Act of Contrition, one line per week.

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things.

I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen. Families who missed the First Eucharist Listening Rite are asked to download the rite from our webpage, pray the rite at home, and then stop by the SRRE office to pick up the Illustrated Children's Bible. Those who missed the Enrollment Rite are asked to pray that rite at home and then bring their child to sign the Enrollment Book in the SRRE office.

Confirmation Student Reminders

Confirmation I students (those in grade 7 or high school preparing for Confirmation in 2021) are working on their Confirmation Service Projects. The focus of these projects is the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Anyone who missed the Confirmation Enrollment Rite (Nov. 24) should pray the rite at home with their family (find rite on the SRRE webpage sidebar), then come in to our office to pick up a copy of *57 Saints*.

All Confirmation II students (those preparing for Confirmation in 2020) have several items due: **Confirmation sponsor forms** (sent from the pastor of the sponsor's current home parish) and **saint projects**. Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love



In November 2018, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops published a pastoral letter against racism. You can find the full text of the document at http://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/human-life-and-dignity/racism/upload/open-wide-our-hearts.pdf. Here is an excerpt from "Changing Structures" section:

The roots of racism have extended deeply into the soil of our society. Racism can only end if we contend with the policies and institutional barriers that perpetuate and preserve the inequality—economic and social—that we still see all around us. With renewed vigor, we call on the members of the Body of Christ to join others in advocating and promoting policies at all levels that will combat racism and its effects in our civic and social institutions. "Even in the developed world," Pope Francis told members of the U.S. Congress, "the effects of unjust structures and actions are all too apparent. Our efforts must aim at restoring hope, righting wrongs, maintaining commitments, and thus promoting the well-being of individuals and of peoples."40 Certainly, we cannot accomplish this task alone. We call on everyone, especially all Christians and those of other faith traditions, to help repair the breach caused by racism, which damages the human family. Ecumenical and interreligious cooperation has been pivotal at key moments in our history, for instance, in the abolition of slavery and during the civil rights era. The leadership of the civil rights movement, especially that of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., invited ecumenical and interreligious cooperation, as was seen when Catholics, Protestants, and Jews marched together. That spirit is integral to the fight today, and in some communities, the success of this effort will very much depend on this kind of collaboration. As religious leaders, we must continue this tradition.
