

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

**Sacrament of Matrimony:** In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

### Welcome Back to St. Raphael Catholic Church

### What you need to know.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is for you or someone you know. (See link here for a short video – www.straphaels.org; click on Faith Formation RCIA).

We plan on resuming our normal, in-person meetings for those desiring to learn more about or enter into the Catholic faith on Sunday, October 3 (an Introductory meeting for all who are interested) at 9:45 AM in the Youth Center. Our meetings this year will be on Sunday mornings, 9:45 to 11:15 (allowing people to attend the 8:30 or 11:30 Mass). in the Youth Center and will continue until a few weeks after Easter.

Those participating in RCIA receive a book about the teachings of the Church and listen to talks and take part in questions and discussions. Those to be baptized and/or received into the Catholic Church come to the Mass on the Easter Vigil for their Sacraments. Those who are Catholic and want to prepare for Confirmation may also be in RCIA especially if they have been "away" from the Church. There is also a preparation group for those needing only Confirmation that meets during Lent.



### Hispanic/Latino Presence in the USA EARLY HISTORY

People with roots in Latin American countries have lived in the United States from its very beginnings. However, their presence on the national scene was practically invisible. The 1970 Census was the first time Hispanics were counted and recognized as a distinct population. The very term Hispanic was chosen by the U.S. Government to name a growing population that was not a racial or an ethnic group, but a people with roots in more than twenty-three Latin American countries and Spain, sharing a common cultural heritage and language. The term Latino emerged in the 80s as a self-given name, particularly in urban settings. This broadening of identity as Hispanics/Latinos was encouraged by robust immigration from

Latin America during the '80s and '90s. Yet today, most Hispanics/Latinos still identify with their nation of origin, for example, and prefer to call themselves Mexican Americans, Cuban Americans, Puerto Ricans, etc.

The roots of the Hispanic/Latino presence in the U.S. go back to colonial times when most of the country's southern flank was under Spanish rule. The first Mass celebrated in what is now the U.S. took place in 1569 in St. Augustine, Florida, under Spanish auspices. The Hispanic/Latino presence took on a whole new dimension in the 1840s with the annexation of half of Mexico's territory to the United States as a result of the Mexican-American War. The new border crossed entire populations from big and small towns, as the


# An Encyclical for All Brothers and Sisters

In his most recent encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis invites us to consider how we are called "in the face of present-day attempts to eliminate or ignore others" to respond "with a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain at the level of words." This week we continue Chapter 2: A Stranger on the Road. The Pope reflects on the parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10:25 -37.

### **Neighbors without borders**

82. The parable, though, is troubling, for Jesus says that the wounded man was a Judean, while the one who stopped and helped him was a Samaritan. This detail is quite significant for our reflection on a love that includes everyone. The Samaritans lived in a region where pagan rites were practiced. For the Jews, this made them impure, detestable, dangerous. In fact, one ancient Jewish text referring to nations that were hated, speaks of Samaria as "not even a people" (Sir 50:25); it also refers to "the foolish people that live in Shechem" (50:26).

83. This explains why a Samaritan woman, when asked by Jesus for a drink, answered curtly: "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" (Jn 4:9). The most offensive charge that those who sought to discredit Jesus could bring was that he was "possessed" and "a Samaritan" (Jn 8:48). So this encounter of mercy between a Samaritan and a Jew is highly provocative; it leaves no room for ideological manipulation and challenges us to expand our frontiers. It gives a universal dimension to our call to love, one that transcends all prejudices, all historical and cultural barriers, all petty interests.



# Caring for God's Creation – A Plan That Calls for Solidarity

In the five years since Pope Francis released his encyclical <u>Laudato Si'</u> (Care for Our Common Home), many dioceses, parishes, parish schools, religious communities and families have embraced the call of integral ecology so that the earth is protected for future generations. Integral ecology is a key concept in <u>Laudato Si'</u>. It says that "everything is closely related" and that "today's problems call for a vision capable of taking into account every aspect of the global crisis" (LS, chapter 4).

In August, Cardinal Gregory announced the launch of Laudato Si: Embarking on a Seven-Year Journey Promoting an Integral Ecology in the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington. In his video about the new plan, Cardinal Gregory says, "Pope Francis call us to a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. It requires a new and universal solidarity. All of us can cooperate, as instruments of God for care of creation, each according to his/her own culture, experience, involvement, and talents. . . . We must all do all we can for our common home for future generations in our archdiocese so that all can enjoy the natural beauty of the Chesapeake Bay, cherry blossoms, and the Anacostia River."

This is a wonderful opportunity for every individual, every family, and every group in our parish to make a difference in this all-important work. Young people looking for Confirmation and community service opportunities will find many projects in this action plan.

The plan includes seven markers, the first being Response to the Cry of the Earth. It outlines steps to conserving energy and using more and more clean energy.


