

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

Vicar's Verbiage

Dear Friends,

Since we are in a season of fasting and penance, I thought I would write about food this week! Well, actually not, I wanted to mention another wonderful film *Babette's Feast* which was released in 1988 and is set in Denmark in the 19th century. It's also in Danish (and some French) so if you don't like subtitles or foreign films beware, but I think it actually makes the movie more interesting.

Anyway, the story is set in a bleak part of the coast in a small village, two older sisters have a French cook and in the midst of their very Puritan lifestyle, it seems a little incongruous. We learn in the course of the movie about a little of her history and that she is actually one of the greatest chefs in France and humbly works for these sisters for almost two decades.

One day she receives news that she has won the national lottery in France and the sum she receives is immense. The sisters think Babette will leave them and are resigned to it. Their servant asks for one (last) thing, to make a real French dinner for them: *Un vrai dîner français*. The sisters agree and eventually are shocked and horrified when they see all the foreign foods and wine(!) arriving from France.

The sisters have terrible dreams and believe perhaps their servant is some type of witch or demon. They speak with their little group of fellow Puritans and agree that they will reluctantly partake of the dinner but that they will disregard the food.

The day of the feast arrives and the guests arrive in a state of apprehension and stress. Then they come into the dining room and see the table. For these simple people who are used to bland food and simple meals, it seems almost unbelievable. The scene when they first behold the table and see the room is wonderful.

Through the course of the meal their attitude becomes more and more jovial and happy and the sad and petty divisions that had plagued their little group seem to melt away. Most of the guests have no idea what they are eating or drinking but one of the visitors is a general who definitely knows this is something special.

At the end he tells the story of a famous chef who used to make dinners like this in Paris and the sisters realize that their humble cook is actually this culinary genius who has sacrificed her life for them. Once the meal is over the sisters come in to thank Babette and she reveals that she has spent all the money she won in the lottery on the dinner. The sisters are again shocked but Babette says she wanted to do it, to have one last chance to give her very best. The film ends with the little group of guests going into the night singing hymns of praise and full of joy.

For me, this movie is filled to the brim with allusions to the Eucharist, the Mass and the sacrifice of Jesus. The people have no idea who Babette is, they think she's just a cook when she is really perhaps the greatest chef in the world. They are terrified of what she is preparing but it ends up being probably the best meal they will ever have in their lives. They are used to simple meals but here they are overwhelmed with how the table is set. And they think it is the last gesture of their cook before she departs to spend her new fortune but they find out she has sacrificed it all for them.

I think we can sometimes be the same way with the Mass and how we see the Cross. The Eucharist is such an amazing gift from God but we don't often realize how utterly astounding it is. I'd encourage you to watch the film if you can. It definitely made me see our own Feast a little differently!



We Need Your Help Lenten Parishioner Calling Initiative

(Seeking volunteers from across our entire parish)

We need caller volunteers. You will be making a Lenten Sacrifice for the benefit of our parishioners and our parish. During the Lenten period we will attempt to call every family registered in our parish. Our parish has over 2300 parishioner families registered. With100 caller volunteers, that would work out to 23 parishioner families per caller.

These calls will serve a number of purposes. They will provide the parishioners with a better understanding of what the parish offers, will serve to understand parishioner needs (e.g. prayer needs), will help provide a better connection with our parish and will serve to help those who have not yet returned following the COVID interruption.

We'll also use these calls to introduce a larger parish objective, the formation of Small Faith Sharing Groups in our homes, organized by community neighborhood. This activity is planned to begin in late summer as the Fall school year begins. The purpose of these groups will be to reenergize faith practices in our homes, wherein group members will revisit The Word of God regularly in the company of others. This will provide feeding and nourishment to bring our faith to life in our families, our homes, and our neighborhood.

This calling initiative will continue through the entire Lenten period, approximately 15 weeks. All calls will be made from your homes on your own time schedule. All caller volunteers will receive a caller instruction packet and calling lists. You will not be making calls as a parish expert. You will be calling at the request of our Pastor, Fr. Salah. You will decide how many calls you would like to make.



An Encyclical for All Brothers and Sisters



In his most recent encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis invites us to consider how we are called "in the face of present-day attempts to eliminate or ignore others" to respond "with a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain at the level of words." This week we continue with Chapter 5: A Better Kind of Politics, in the Forms of Populism and Liberalism section and subsection "Social and Political Charity."

SOCIAL AND POLITICAL CHARITY

176. For many people today, politics is a distasteful word, often due to the mistakes, corruption and inefficiency of some politicians. There are also attempts to discredit politics, to replace it with economics or to twist it to one ideology or another. Yet can our world function without politics? Can there be an effective process of growth towards universal fraternity and social peace without a sound political life?

The politics we need

177. Here I would once more observe that "politics must not be subject to the economy, nor should the economy be subject to the dictates of an efficiency-driven paradigm of technocracy." Although misuse of power, corruption, disregard for law and inefficiency must clearly be rejected, "economics without politics cannot be justified, since this would make it impossible to favor other ways of handling the various aspects of the present crisis." Instead, "what is needed is a politics which is far-sighted and capable of a new, integral and interdisciplinary approach to handling the different aspects of the crisis." In other words, a "healthy politics... capable of reforming and coordinating institutions, promoting best practices and overcoming undue pressure and bureaucratic inertia." We cannot expect economics to do this, nor can we allow economics to take over the real power of the state.

178. In the face of many petty forms of politics focused on immediate interests, I would repeat that "true statecraft is manifest when, in difficult times, we uphold high principles and think of the long-term common good. Political powers do not find it easy to assume this duty in the work of nation-building," much less in forging a common project for the human family, now and in the future. Thinking of those who will come after us does not serve electoral purposes, yet it is what authentic justice demands. As the Bishops of Portugal have taught, the earth "is lent to each generation, to be handed on to the generation that follows."

179. Global society is suffering from grave structural deficiencies that cannot be resolved by piecemeal solutions or quick fixes. Much needs to change, through fundamental reform and major renewal. Only a healthy politics, involving the most diverse sectors and skills, is capable of overseeing this process. An economy that is an integral part of a political, social, cultural and popular program directed to the common good could pave the way for "different possibilities which do not involve stifling human creativity and its ideals of progress, but rather directing that energy along new channels."




