

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

Vicar's Verbiage

Dear Friends.

Even though we have concluded the great Octave of Easter, we're still in Eastertide, or the Easter Season. It lasts for several more weeks because its just not right that we should spend weeks and weeks preparing for the feast without the celebration lasting a long time! And the resurrection of Jesus is so important it doesn't get just a day, or a week, but almost seven weeks of celebration. At the end of it, we'll be thoroughly tired of the word alleluia but for now its good to keep the party going!

One thing that has always struck me about the life and ministry of the Lord was that he loved to eat and to be at parties. He's always at banquets or feasts and he was always meeting people where they were and living among them. In the Gospel for this weekend Jesus reveals himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias.

The city of Tiberias is situated on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee. The first time I was in the Holy Land we had our hotel there for the first few days while we went around to the different parts of Galilee. I still remember going down to the shore of the sea one morning to watch the sunrise and I saw the remains of a charcoal fire on the shore.

Today's Gospel is one of those I never tire of reading and remembering the feeling of the breeze and the smell and taste of the water by the shore. I can vividly see St. John leaning over to Peter in the boat and whispering, "It is the Lord" and Peter's eyebrows raise up and the expression on his face changes to wonderment.

Of course, Jesus provides a meal for his hungry and tired children but doesn't waster the opportunity to teach them and be reconciled with Peter. Jesus was always to be found around food and feasts so is it any wonder that he would make the most important act of his followers a sacred meal? Is it a surprise that he commands his disciples not to fashion a statue or commission a painting of him but to come together in fellowship and share a holy meal?

When we come to Mass, the Lord again provides a meal for us. Perhaps we're like Peter and have denied Jesus in some way or another or done things that he does not approve of. Perhaps we've expected so much but can't get our minds around how things are turning out. Maybe we've been trying all through the proverbial night but have caught nothing.

Jesus beckons to us still, "come, have breakfast." He calls out to us to follow where he leads and to trust in his love and care. Hopefully we can be like St. John and recognize the Lord and then leave the safety of our boat like Peter and go quickly to him.



Bringing Easter Home

The paschal mystery (the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus) is the center of our faith. But it is not just something that happened 2000 years ago; the paschal mystery is the model that governs and shapes the life of every Christian. Our faith rests on the knowledge that God loved humankind enough to become one of us and to die for us; that Jesus rose from the dead and invites us to follow him; and that in the Eucharist the saving work of his death and resurrection is present and active, right here and right now.

The Church asks us to "bring Easter home" by reflecting on the paschal mystery with our family members and by celebrating the Eucharist each Sunday with our parish.

An Encyclical for All Brothers and Sisters



In his most recent encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis invites us to consider how we are called "in the face of present-day attempts to eliminate or ignore others" to respond "with a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain at the level of words." This week we continue with Chapter 5: A Better Kind of Politics and the subsection "Fruitfulness over Results."

FRUITFULNESS OVER RESULTS

193. Apart from their tireless activity, politicians are also men and women. They are called to practice love in their daily interpersonal relationships. As persons, they need to consider that "the modern world, with its technical advances, tends increasingly to functionalize the satisfaction of human desires, now classified and subdivided among different services. Less and less will people be called by name, less and less will this unique being be treated as a person with his or her own feelings, sufferings, problems, joys and family. Their illnesses will be known only in order to cure them, their financial needs only to provide for them, their lack of a home only to give them lodging, their desires for recreation and entertainment only to satisfy them." Yet it must never be forgotten that "loving the most insignificant of human beings as a brother, as if there were no one else in the world but him, cannot be considered a waste of time.'

194. Politics too must make room for a tender love of others. "What is tenderness? It is love that draws near and becomes real. A movement that starts from our heart and reaches the eyes, the ears and the hands... Tenderness is the path of choice for the strongest, most courageous men and women." Amid the daily concerns of political life, "the smallest, the weakest, the poorest should touch our hearts: indeed, they have a 'right' to appeal to our heart and soul. They are our brothers and sisters, and as such we must love and care for them."

195. All this can help us realize that what is important is not constantly achieving great results, since these are not always possible. In political activity, we should remember that, "appearances notwithstanding, every person is immensely holy and deserves our love.

Consequently, if I can help at least one person to have a better life, that already justifies the offering of my life. It is a wonderful thing to be God's faithful people. We love with hope and with confidence in the reserves of goodness present in human hearts. Indeed, "authentic political life, built upon respect for law and frank dialogue between individuals, is constantly renewachieve fulfilment when we break down walls and our hearts are filled with faces and names!" The great goals of our dreams and plans may only be achieved in part. Yet beyond this, those who love, and who no longer view politics merely as a quest for power, "may be sure that none of our acts of love will be lost, nor any of our acts of sincere concern for others. No single act of love for God will be lost, no generous effort is meaningless, no painful endurance is wasted. All of these encircle our world like a vital force."

196. For this reason, it is truly noble to place our hope in the hidden power of the seeds of goodness we sow, and thus to initiate processes whose fruits will be reaped by others. Good politics combines whenever there is a realization that every woman and man, and every new generation, brings the promise of new relational, intellectual, cultural and spiritual energies."

197. Viewed in this way, politics is something more noble than posturing, marketing and media spin. These sow nothing but division, conflict and a bleak cynicism incapable of mobilizing people to pursue a common goal. At times, in thinking of the future, we do well to ask ourselves, "Why I am doing this?," "What is my real aim?" For as time goes on, reflecting on the past, the questions will not be: "How many people endorsed me?," "How many voted for me?," "How many had a positive image of me?" The real, and potentially painful, questions will be, "How much love did I put into my work?" "What did I do for the progress of our people?" "What mark did I leave on the life of society?" "What real bonds did I create?" "What positive forces did I unleash?" "How much social peace did I sow?" "What good did I achieve in the position that was entrusted to me?"







