Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

Vicar's Verbiage

Dear Friends.

The month of May is a great time of joy. And in the Church, it is commonly dedicated to Mary as her special month. Of course, we also celebrate Mother's Day always on the second Sunday of May so today I wanted to write especially about Mary our Mother.

In the Gospel of John, at the Cross, the dying Jesus entrusts his mother Mary to the beloved disciple Saint John. Among the disciples he is the only one who does not run and hide. With Mary and some of the other followers of Jesus they stand at the foot of the cross and see the salvation of the world being accomplished.

But before Jesus dies, he gives Mary into the care of John and John into the care of Mary. Since we too are disciples of Jesus and we too stand at the foot of the cross when we come to Mass, Mary too is given to us as our Mother.

Now, sometimes accusations are levelled at the Church that we give too much emphasis to Mary or that we make her into some type of god and worship her. There are so many different devotions to her, the rosary, novenas, and the countless different statues and images of her. There's even a website that has a catalogue of Marian feasts for each and every day of the year!

Why so many images and statues? What's the point of so many prayers and devotions? Well, quite simply, how much do you love your mother? One writer said that the reason there are so many apparitions, images and statues of Mary is that each of us has our unique personality, experience, personality and temperament and so in a way, Mary our Mother becomes our own mother in a very personal and unique way.

I have a great devotion to Our Lady of Walsingham—the patroness of England and a very old title going back to an apparition of Mary around the year 1000 in England. But you may be more captivated by Our Lady of Lourdes, or by Our Lady of Perpetual Help, or of Carmel, or of Fatima, or of Aparecida in Brazil, or of Zell in Austria, or of the Beautiful Window in France, or of Cobre in Cuba, or Guadalupe in Mexico, or Guadalupe in Spain.

The point is that Mary shows herself as mother to everyone and that she wants to be known to us all. There's a great moment in one of the episodes of The Chosen which is a great Christian series on the life of Jesus. He's heading to Cana and the disciples ask him why he's walking there and Jesus answers "I'm going to see the most important person in my life, my mother."

Jesus loved his mom, and we should too. So, in this month of May, the joyful month of Easter and of the hope that the resurrection brings, perhaps you could give some time to Mary and know that the love we show her reflects our total love for God. How beautiful that God gives us Mary to watch over us and love us as a mother. May we love her greatly in return!

The paschal mystery (the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus) is the center of our faith. But it is not just something that happened 2000 years ago; the paschal mystery is the model that governs and shapes the life of every Christian. Our faith rests on the knowledge that God loved humankind enough to become one of us and to die for us; that Jesus rose from the dead and invites us to follow him; and that in the Eucharist the saving work of his death and resurrection is present and active, right here and right now.

The Church asks us to "bring Easter home" by reflecting on the paschal mystery with our family members and by celebrating the Eucharist each Sunday with our parish.

An Encyclical for All Brothers and Sisters



In his most recent encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis invites us to consider how we are called "in the face of present-day attempts to eliminate or ignore others" to respond "with a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain at the level of words." This week we begin Chapter 6: Dialogue and Friendship in Society.

198. Approaching, speaking, listening, looking at, coming to know and understand one another, and to find common ground: all these things are summed up in the one word "dialogue." If we want to encounter and help one another, we have to dialogue. There is no need for me to stress the benefits of dialogue. I have only to think of what our world would be like without the patient dialogue of the many generous persons who keep families and communities together. Unlike disagreement and conflict, persistent and courageous dialogue does not make headlines, but quietly helps the world to live much better than we imagine.

Social Dialogue for a New Culture

199. Some people attempt to flee from reality, taking refuge in their own little world; others react to it with destructive violence. Yet "between selfish indifference and violent protest there is always another possible option: that of dialogue. Dialogue between generations; dialogue among our people, for we are that people; readiness to give and receive, while remaining open to the truth. A country flourishes when constructive dialogue occurs between its many rich cultural components: popular culture, university culture, youth culture, artistic culture, technological culture, economic culture, family culture and media culture."

200. Dialogue is often confused with something quite different: the feverish exchange of opinions on social networks, frequently based on media information that is not always reliable. These exchanges are merely parallel monologues. They may attract some attention by their sharp and aggressive tone. But monologues engage no one, and their content is frequently self-serving and contradictory.

201. Indeed, the media's noisy potpourri of facts and opinions is often an obstacle to dialogue, since it lets everyone cling stubbornly to his or her own ideas, interests and choices, with the excuse that everyone else is wrong. It becomes easier to discredit and insult opponents from the outset than to open a respectful dialogue aimed at achieving agreement on a deeper level. Worse, this kind of language, usually drawn from media coverage of political campaigns, has become so widespread as to be part of daily conversation. Discussion is often manipulated by powerful special

interests that seek to tilt public opinion unfairly in their favor. This kind of manipulation can be exercised not only by governments, but also in economics, politics, communications, religion and in other spheres. Attempts can be made to justify or excuse it when it tends to serve one's own economic or ideological interests, but sooner or later it turns against those very interests.

202. Lack of dialogue means that in these individual sectors people are concerned not for the common good, but for the benefits of power or, at best, for ways to impose their own ideas. Round tables thus become mere negotiating sessions, in which individuals attempt to seize every possible advantage, rather than cooperating in the pursuit of the common good. The heroes of the future will be those who can break with this unhealthy mindset and determine respectfully to promote truthfulness, aside from personal interest. God willing, such heroes are quietly emerging, even now, in the midst of our society.

EASY: Some of us are just starting to awaken to the need to care for creation, or have been busy with jobs, raising a family, or other social justice commitments. We may not have much discretionary time. OR, it may simply be a relief to note that, "Hey, I'm already doing this one!" Good. CHALLENGE: Others have been engaged in the environmental movement for awhile and are ready to take a bigger step and multiply your efforts by going beyond your own individual lifestyle to make a bigger impact. Then, try the challenge of influencing systemic change in your neighborhood, city, country, the world. Either way, pick whichever fits your ability this week and do something.

NATURE

EASY: Plant something. Anything will count, but a seed or seedling that will grow into a food is ideal.

CHALLENGING: Organize a campaign to clean up and take care of a public green space in your neighborhood or town


