


Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

Vicar's Verbiage

Dear Friends.

Since there's been a few questions lately about what exactly I will be doing at my new parish in Issue, I thought I would take this opportunity to write a little about the different types of offices within the Church.

I wrote a while ago about the role of the bishop, they are the pastor for the diocese, which is for us a geographic territory that he has spiritual authority over. The outward structure of the Church with bishops governing dioceses was in place relatively early and followed the secular Roman Imperial system reformed by the Emperor Diocletian, except that the diocese in his time (what we would call a State or a Province) was governed by a vicar. The vicars were appointed by the emperor to control a specific area on behalf of the emperor. It's the origin of where we get calling the pope the "vicar of Christ." The pope heads the Church on earth by the authority of Jesus.

Later on, the Roman system was reformed and the provinces ceased to be called dioceses and then even later the whole system collapsed with the invasion of the barbarians. However, the Church kept the same names and system and its what we still use today.

Over time, as the Church grew in size and complexity it became apparent that a smaller unit would be needed than a diocese and so that's when the parish as we know it emerged. When it became too difficult for the bishop to govern each of them individually, he started appointing priests to oversee the local communities.

The name in Latin for the head of the local community is *parochus* which comes from ancient Greek and means "neighbor." The more common term is *pastor* which is Latin for "shepherd" and comes from the word "to feed" in Latin.

The pastor is the one designated by the bishop to guide and feed the People of God entrusted to his care in a particular parish or smaller geographic territory. And interestingly enough, the *Code of Canon Law* (the book of laws that governs the operation of the Church throughout the world) says that this includes all the people who are Christian within the territory, not just the Catholics.

When the pastor of a parish is reassigned or is somehow incapacitated the bishop can appoint a parochial administrator to fill in for him. They are basically like a pastor in their responsibilities and duties but they do not have the right of stability (pastors in our part of the Church have terms of office which is usually 6 years with an option to renew for another 6, but it can be extended if the bishop desires), and also an administrator cannot do anything which would harm the fabric of the parish, which means basically the administrator can't come in and immediately sell all the property and fire all the staff.

An administrator is an inherently temporary office but it does allow for some leeway in case the assignment doesn't work out or if the pastor is sick for a while. In the Archdiocese our custom is to appoint parochial vicars as administrators first since it is quite a change and a whole new set of responsibilities and also ensures that there will be some stability in the parish until things settle down with the move.

Sometimes parishes will also have parochial vicars in them. These are priests who are given the task of assisting the pastor in his role of feeding the flock in the parish. In some places they are called "associate pastors" but around here we use the more specific term that's found in the *Code*. Usually, parochial vicars are assigned to parishes that are larger or have a diverse population or specialized ministries to allow the priests to share the work and be more present to the people. They can be moved around more easily and mainly function to help the pastor in his office.

Religious Education - Registration Opens June 15!

Registration for 2022-2023 St. Raphael Religious Education (SRRE) opens on June 15.

Early registration will end on August 15.

SRRE offers ongoing faith formation for all children and teens, as well as preparation for sacraments. Each year of faith formation is designed to deepen relationships with Jesus and his Church through focus on what we believe, why we celebrate the sacraments, how we pray, and how we live. We look forward to having all our SRRE children and teens back in September, and we are eager to welcome new families to our faith formation program. If your family was not part of SRRE last year, please contact Mary Beaudoin to be included in email communications.

SRRE sessions will begin on September 18 and 19 (with orientation sessions on September 11 and 12). We plan to offer the following schedule.

Sundays, 7:05-8:20 PM – grades 3-8 Mondays, 4:30-5:45 PM – grades kindergarten-grade 8 Mondays, 7:00-8:15 PM – grades 1-12 Family Catechesis – sessions on six Sundays at 4:30-5:45 PM

Family Catechesis includes group meetings for parents and classes for children once every five weeks. Parents teach their children at home for the four weeks in between meetings. Parents need to commit to spending an hour each week on faith formation with their child at home - in order to fulfill the minimum of 30 hours of instruction required by the Archdiocese of Washington.

<u>Tuition</u> during Early Registration: One child - \$125 Two children - \$200 Three or more children - \$250

Sacramental Fees: First Eucharist in Spring 2023 - \$75 Confirmation in Spring 2023 - \$75



An Encyclical for All Brothers and Sisters



In his most recent encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis invites us to consider how we are called "in the face of present-day attempts to eliminate or ignore others" to respond "with a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain at the level of words." This week we continue with Chapter 6: Dialogue and Friendship in Society and the section entitled "A New Culture."

The joy of acknowledging others

218. All this calls for the ability to recognize other people's right to be themselves and to be different. This recognition, as it becomes a culture, makes possible the creation of a social covenant. Without it, subtle ways can be found to make others insignificant, irrelevant, of no value to society. While rejecting certain visible forms of violence, another more insidious kind of violence can take root: the violence of those who despise people who are different, especially when their demands in any way compromise their own particular interests.

219. When one part of society exploits all that the world has to offer, acting as if the poor did not exist, there will eventually be consequences. Sooner or later, ignoring the existence and rights of others will erupt in some form of violence, often when least expected. Liberty, equality and fraternity can remain lofty ideals unless they apply to everyone. Encounter cannot take place only between the holders of economic, political or academic power. Genuine social encounter calls for a dialogue that engages the culture shared by the majority of the population. It often happens that good ideas are not accepted by the poorer sectors of society because they are presented in a cultural garb that is not their own and with which they cannot identify. A realistic and inclusive social covenant must also be a "cultural covenant," one that respects and acknowledges the different worldviews, cultures and lifestyles that coexist in society.

220. Indigenous peoples, for example, are not opposed to progress, yet theirs is a different notion of progress, often more humanistic than the modern culture of developed peoples. Theirs is not a culture meant to benefit the powerful, those driven to create for themselves a kind of earthly paradise. Intolerance and lack of respect for indigenous popular cultures is a form of violence grounded in a cold and judgmental way of viewing them. No authentic, profound and enduring change is possible unless it starts from the different cultures, particularly those of the poor. A cultural covenant eschews a monolithic understanding of the identity of a particular place; it entails respect for diversity by offering opportunities for advancement and social integration to all

221. Such a covenant also demands the realization that some things may have to be renounced for the common good. No one can possess the whole truth or satisfy his or her every desire, since that pretension would lead to nullifying others by denying their rights. A false notion of tolerance has to give way to a dialogic realism on the part of men and women who remain faithful to their own principles while recognizing that others also have the right to do likewise. This is the genuine acknowledgment of the other that is made possible by love alone. We have to stand in the place of others, if we are to discover what is genuine, or at least understandable, in their motivations and concerns.


