

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Teri Dwyer to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

#### Preliminary Itinerary - Father Michael Salah - October 06-17/2023

Oct 6, Fri - Meet at 7:00 pm at Dulles International Airport for <u>UA flight #72 at 10:45 pm (</u>22:45). Check in to TLV-Israel.

Oct 7, Sat - Arrival in Tel Aviv at 16:40 Meet our guide Peter & transfer to Pilgerhaus Guest House at the Sea of Galilee for overnight.
(D) Mass at Hotel.

Oct 8, Sun – Around the Sea of Galilee Boat ride (08:30) on the Sea of Galilee. Then visit the sites around the Sea of Galilee associated with Jesus' ministry of teaching and healing. The Church of Peter's Primacy, Capernaum-hometown of his Galilean ministry, then break for Lunch of St. Peter's Fish. After lunch, we will visit the Church of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes and the Mount of Beatitudes. Overnight Galilee/Pilgerhaus (B/L/D) Mass at Beatitudes at 16:00 am.

Oct 9, Mon- Mt. Tabor, Cana – Nazareth - Drive to Mount Tabor and meditate on the Transfiguration. Continue to Cana, the site of Jesus' first sign according to St John, for a visit & renewal of Wedding vows. Lunch in Nazareth. Visit the Basilica of the Annunciation, the Museum, and the Church of St. Joseph. Visit the Church Synagogue of Nazareth where Jesus read the prophecy of Isaiah & the Church of St. Gabriel (Mary's Well). Return to Tiberias for dinner and Overnight Galilee/Pilgerhaus. (B/L/D) Mass at the Annunciation Basilica at 15:00. Renewal of wedding vows at Cana at 11:00 am.

Oct 10, Tue- Haifa, Caesarea – Jerusalem. Check out. Visit Magdala. Drive to Haifa on Mount Carmel to for a panoramic view of the Bahai Temple and the city of Haifa. Visit the Church of Stella Maris and celebrate Mass (11:00). After lunch at Stella Maris, continue to Caesarea Maritima, a Roman city built by King Herod, where Peter & Paul visited. Continue to Jerusalem. Check in & Overnight Gloria Hotel. (B/L/D) Mass at Stella Maris at 11:00 pm.

Oct 11, Wed- Bethlehem – Drive to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity and the Church of St Catherine. Stop for souvenir shopping in one of the Christian Cooperatives. Lunch. Visit the Shepherds' Fields. Then, we will see the work of a remarkable St Vincent Creche Orphanage (15:00) the only facility of its kind in the West Bank, offering Christian love to over forty abandoned babies and little children. Overnight Gloria. (B/L/D) Mass at Shepherds' Fields at 14:00 am.

Oct 12, Thu- Jerusalem - Ein Karem — Israel Museum- Mount Zion Visit Ein Karem Church of the Visitation and then visit the Israel Museum Shrine of the book where the Dead Sea Scrolls & a scale model of Jerusalem in the times of Jesus. Lunch. After, visit the Cenacle (Upper Room), Dormition Abbey of Mary, and St. Peter in Gallicantu where Peter denied Jesus. Mass at St. Peter at 16:00.

Oct 13, Fri- Jerusalem Old City - Mount of Olives. Pater Noster Church, where Jesus taught 'Our Father'. Panoramic view of Jerusalem. Then walk down the slopes of the Mount of Olives, the traditional Palm Sunday route, visit Dominus Flevit, (the Lord Wept) and the Garden of Gethsemane. Lunch. Pm Bethany Church. Overnight Gloria. (B/L/D) Mass at Gethsemane Basilica at 11:00.

Oct 14, Sat- Jerusalem Old City Before breakfast, an early and prayerful walk of the "Via Dolorosa" to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, built over the place of Jesus' crucifixion, burial, and resurrection. Then visit the church of St Anne and the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the crippled man. Continue to the Wailing Wall. After Lunch free afternoon. (B/L/D) High Mass at Holy Tomb at 06:30 am.

Oct 15, Sun- Jericho- Dead Sea area – Jerusalem – Drive to visit Qumran the site associated with the Dead Sea Scrolls. Continue to the Dead Sea to float in the unique mineral-laden waters. Continue to the Jordan River to renew the baptismal vows. After lunch in Jericho, we will view Zaccheus' Sycamore Tree, Elisha's Spring, and view the Mount of Temptation. Opportunity to ride on a Camel. (B/L/D) Mass at Good Shepherd in Jericho at 15:00 pm. Return to Jerusalem to prepare for our festive farewell dinner at the Tent Restaurant in Bethlehem.

# First Reconciliation Get-Ready Morning – January 21



Families with children preparing for First Reconciliation in February are encouraged to attend the **Reconciliation Get-Ready Morning**. It will be held on Saturday, January 21, at 9:30-11:30 AM in the Trumpet Room and church.

This week children are memorizing the Act of Contrition and completing their *God's Gift Reconciliation* (younger children) workbooks; *Reconciliation: Pardon and Peace* workbooks (grades 4 and 5); or chapters 1-7 of *God's Gift Reconciliation and Eucharist* (older children) worksheets. Completed workbooks or worksheets are due at First Penance.

First Penance/Reconciliation is scheduled for Wednesday, February 1, at 7:00 PM, and Saturday, February 4, at 10:30 AM.

#### **Confirmation Year I and Year II Notes**

Confirmation Year 1 students are working on their Confirmation Service Projects. Focusing on the Corporal



and Spiritual Works of Mercy, young people complete ten or more hours of service in their parish, neighborhood, and/or broader community. They then write a reflection paper describing how this service is rooted in their baptismal call to follow Jesus. The completed Confirmation Service Project is due September 1, 2023.

Candidates for Confirmation in May 2023 (Confirmation Year 2) are completing on their Saint Project. Confirmation sponsors need to have their parish send a certificate of sponsorship to the SRRE Office. The Saint Project and Confirmation Sponsor Certificate are due in the SRRE Office by January 26.

#### **Christus Vivit**

#### To Young People and to the Entire People of God



Christus vivit (Christ is alive) is a postsynodal apostolic exhortation of Pope Francis, written in response to the Fifteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, on young people, faith, and vocational discernment. That synod was held in October 2018. This week we continue Chapter Two: Jesus, Ever Young.

A Church attentive to the signs of the times

39. "Even though to many young people, God, religion and the Church seem empty words, they are sensitive to the figure of Jesus when he is presented in an attractive and effective way." Consequently, the Church should not be excessively caught up in herself but instead, and above all, reflect Jesus Christ. This means humbly acknowledging that some things concretely need to change, and if that is to happen, she needs to appreciate the vision but also the criticisms of young people.

40. The Synod recognized that "a substantial number of young people, for all sorts of reasons, do not ask the Church for anything because they do not see her as significant for their lives. Some even ask expressly to be left alone, as they find the presence of the Church a nuisance, even an irritant. This request does not always stem from uncritical or impulsive contempt. It can also have serious and understandable reasons: sexual and financial scandals; a clergy ill-prepared to engage effectively with the sensitivities of the young; lack of care in homily preparation and the presentation of the word of God; the passive role assigned to the young within the Christian community; the Church's difficulty in explaining her doctrine and ethical positions to contemporary society."

41. Although many young people are happy to see a Church that is humble yet confident in her gifts and capable of offering fair and fraternal criticism, others want a Church that listens more, that does more than simply condemn the world. They do not want to see a Church that is silent and afraid to speak, but neither one that is always battling obsessively over two or three issues. To be credible to young people, there are times when she needs to regain her humility and simply listen, recognizing that what others have to say can provide some light to help her better understand the Gospel. A Church always on the defensive, which loses her humility and stops listening to others, which leaves no room for questions, loses her youth and turns into a museum. How, then, will she be able to respond to the dreams of young people? Even if she possesses the truth of the Gospel, this does not mean that she has completely understood it; rather, she is called to keep growing in her grasp of that inexhaustible treasure.

42. For example, a Church that is overly fearful and tied to its structures can be invariably critical of efforts to defend the rights of women, and constantly point out the risks and the potential errors of those demands. Instead, a living Church can react by being attentive to the legitimate claims of those women who seek greater justice and equality. A living Church can look back on history and acknowledge a fair share of male authoritarianism, domination, various forms of enslavement, abuse and sexist violence. With this outlook, she can support the call to respect women's rights, and offer convinced support for greater reciprocity between males and females, while not agreeing with everything some feminist groups propose. Along these lines, the Synod sought to renew the Church's commitment "against all discrimination and violence on sexual grounds." That is the response of a Church that stays young and lets herself be challenged and spurred on by the sensitivities of young people.




