

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Eileen Kutchak, 240-864-2510, to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.
























Prayer Vigil to Witness to the Sanctity of Human Life and End Abortion

Now that *Roe v. Wade* has been overturned, your *prayers* are *needed* more than ever. Montgomery County officials are actively promoting and supporting abortions. Women (and former abortionists) report that *prayers* and *the presence of peaceful, pro-life witnesses* at abortion clinics *dissuaded* them *from* having an *abortion*.

The Fall 2023, 40 Days Bethesda, 40 days for Life campaign began on Wednesday, September 27, 2023 and run through Sunday, November 5, 2023. St. Raphael's is supporting the campaign by praying a rosary on the public sidewalk in front of the CARE Abortion Clinic at the Wildwood Medical Center, 10401 Old Georgetown Road, in Bethesda, each Saturday from 10AM-4PM. The first Saturday of each month year-round is also the Witness for Life prayer vigil for all 40 Days for Life participants at the same location and time. For security reasons, please do not go alone, but always bring a friend with you. Please meet in the vestibule after the 9AM Mass on Saturdays, if you have questions or need help with directions. What could be more important than protecting the lives of innocent babies and their mothers from the devasting effects of abortion? If you won't protect them, who will?

October is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month. "The number of women who are beaten and abused in their homes, even by their husbands, is very, very high," Pope Francis said in answer to a question by a woman named Giovanna, a victim of domestic violence. (Reported by Reuters Dec 19, 2021.) "The problem is that, for me, it is almost satanic because it is taking advantage of a person who cannot defend herself, who an only (try to) block the blows," he said. "It is humiliating. Very humiliating." Giovanna said she had four children to care for after they escaped from a violent home. For women suffering abuse, help is available. Preparation for Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist

In our parish, preparation for a sacrament is a process that usually encompasses about two years. Typically, baptized children begin their preparation for First Penance and First Eucharist in the first grade and receive these sacraments at the end of second grade. In general, preparation for Confirmation begins in seventh grade, and Confirmation is celebrated in the eighth grade. Children ages seven and up who have not been baptized are invited to take part in RCIA adapted for children. Children who are older than 15 grade who wish to prepare for Eucharist, and children older than 7th grade who wish to prepare for Confirmation are incorporated into our Religious Education classes and sacrament preparation process. Children in Catholic schools need to register with their parish Religious Education office so that they receive information about requirements and important meetings. Please contact Mary Beaudoin in the Religious Education Office to discuss your child's preparation for sacraments.

Confirmation, Year 2, Candidate and Parent Meeting - October 4 or October 10

A meeting for all Confirmation Year 2 students and their parents will be held on Wednesday, October 4. The meeting will be online and a link will be emailed to parents of registered Confirmation candidates. The same meeting will be offered on Tuesday, October 10, for those who could not attend the previous week.

Confirmation, Year 1, Candidate and Parent Meeting -October 3 or October 11

A meeting for parents and their children who are beginning Confirmation preparation will be held on Tuesday, October 3. Key Passage: A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, "Son, go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not"; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, "I go, sir"; but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father? They said, "The first." (Matthew 21:28–31)

. . . and then have a family sharing time on the questions below:

- ► Adults: When have your actions not measured up to your promises? What was the outcome?
- Kids: Why is it important to follow through on your promises to others?


Living Laudato Si' - Eco-Tips

Christus Vivit

To Young People and to the Entire People of God

Christus vivit (Christ is alive) is a post-synodal apostolic exhortation of Pope Francis, written in response to the Fifteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, on young people, faith, and vocational discernment. That synod was held in October 2018. This week we begin Chapter Seven: Youth Ministry.

202. Youth ministry, as traditionally carried out, has been significantly affected by social and cultural changes. Young people frequently fail to find in our usual programs a response to their concerns, their needs, their problems and issues. The proliferation growth and of groups and movements predominantly associated with the young can be considered the work of the Holy Spirit who constantly shows us new paths. Even so, there is a need to look at the ways such groups participate in the Church's overall pastoral care, as well as a need for greater communion among them and a better coordination of their activities. Although it is never easy to approach young people, two things have become increasingly evident: the realization that the entire community has to be involved in evangelizing them, and the urgent requirement that young people take on a greater role in pastoral outreach.

A pastoral care that is synodal

203. I want to state clearly that young people themselves are agents of youth ministry. Certainly they need to he helped and guided, but at the same time left free to develop new approaches, with creativity and a certain audacity. So I will not attempt here to propose a kind of manual of youth ministry or a practical pastoral guide. I am more concerned with helping young people to use their insight, ingenuity and knowledge to address the issues and concerns of other young people in their own language.

204. The young make us see the need for new styles and new strategies. For example, while adults often worry about having everything properly planned, with regular meetings and fixed times, most young people today have little interest in this kind of pastoral approach. Youth ministry needs to become more flexible: inviting young people to events or occasions that provide an opportunity not only for learning, but also for conversing, celebrating, singing, listening to real stories and experiencing a shared encounter with the living God.
