

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Eileen Kutchak, 240-864-2510, to register and plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

### Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

### The Bethesda 40 Days for Life campaign this Lent outside the Wildwood late-term abortion facility is back on.

Our parish will support the Spring Bethesda 40 Days for Life campaign again this year, by <u>praying the rosary</u> on the public sidewalk in front of the abortion facility at the Wildwood Medical Center, 10401 Old Georgetown Road, in Bethesda, each Saturday during Lent from Saturday, February 17, through Saturday March 30, from 10 AM-4 PM.

Please do not go alone, but bring a friend with you. Please meet in the vestibule after the 9 AM Mass on Saturdays if you have questions or need directions. What could be more important than protecting the lives of innocent babies and their mothers from the devasting effects of abortion?

### **Arimathean Volunteers Needed!**

Are you available during the day to assist as an Arimathean at a Mass of Christian Burial? Most funerals are on a weekday, about a two-hour commitment.

Arimatheans assist the priest as sacristans, Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion, and altar servers.

The name of the ministry comes from Joseph of Arimathea, who appears in all four of the Gospels.

When it was already evening, since it was the day of preparation, the day before the Sabbath, Joseph of Arimathea, a distinguished member of the council, who was himself awaiting the Kingdom of God, came and courageously went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate was amazed that he was already dead. He summoned the centurion and asked him if Jesus had already died. And when he learned of it from the centurion, he gave the body to Joseph. Having brought a linen cloth, he took him down, wrapped him in the linen cloth and laid him in a tomb that had been hewn out of rock. Then he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary, the mother of Jesus, watched where he laid. Mark 15, 42-47.

With each funeral Mass, Arimatheans strive to comfort a grieving family in the example of their namesake, who must have comforted Mary with his care of the body of Jesus.



Our First Eucharist Get-Ready Morning will be on Saturday,

March 16, at 9:30-11:30 in the Trumpet Room.

This week, families with children preparing for First Eucharist in April and May are completing chapter 4 in God's Gift Eucharist workbook (younger children) or chapter 11 of God's Gift Reconciliation and Eucharist and worksheets (older children). Completed workbooks and worksheets are due at First Communion rehearsal.

First Eucharist will be celebrated on Saturdays, April 27 and May 4

#### **Confirmation Year I and Year II Notes**

1 students are starting Confirmation Year Confirmation Service Projects. Focusing on the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and/or the 7 Themes of Catholic Social Teaching, young people complete ten or more hours of service in their parish, neighborhood, and/or broader community. They then write a reflection paper describing how this service is rooted in their baptismal call to follow Jesus. The Confirmation Service Project is completed September 1, 2024.

Confirmation Interviews have begun and will continue through March 11.

### Synod on Synodality

In October 2023, Catholic clergy and laypeople gathered in Rome for an assembly, which was part of the multiyear Synod on Synodality. Below is an excerpt from the synthesis report, A Synodal Church on Mission, Part 5, The Church, out of every tribe, tongue, people, and nation.

Churches live in increasingly multicultural and multireligious contexts. This necessitates finding ways to create dialogue between religions and cultures, with which Christians should engage alongside the many groups that compose a society. Living the Church's mission in these contexts requires a style of presence, service and proclamation that seeks to build bridges, cultivate mutual understanding and engage in evangelisation accompanies, listens and learns. In the Assembly the image of "taking off one's shoes" to cross the threshold towards encounter with the other resonated as a sign of humility and respect for a sacred space, on an equal footing.

d) Migration reshapes local churches as cross-cultural communities. Migrants and refugees, many of whom bear the wounds of uprooting, war and violence, often become a source of renewal and enrichment for the communities that welcome them and an opportunity to establish direct links with geographically distant churches. In the face of increasingly hostile attitudes toward migrants, we are called to practice an open welcome, to accompany them in the construction of a new life and to build a true intercultural communion among peoples. Respect for the liturgical traditions and religious practices of migrants is an integral part of an authentic welcome.

#### Laudate Deum


On October 4, the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis released a new apostolic exhortation on the climate crisis. Laudate Deum is addressed to "all people of good will." Below is an excerpt from section 6: Spiritual Motivations.

Journeying in communion and commitment

69. I ask everyone to accompany this pilgrimage of reconciliation with the world that is our home and to help make it more beautiful, because that commitment has to do with our personal dignity and highest values. At the same time, I cannot deny that it is necessary to be honest and recognize that the most effective solutions will not come from individual efforts alone, but above all from major political decisions on the national and international level.

70. Nonetheless, every little bit helps, and avoiding an increase of a tenth of a degree in the global temperature would already suffice to alleviate some suffering for many people. Yet what is important is something less quantitative: the need to realize that there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, without a maturing of lifestyles and convictions within societies, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes.

In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother," and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen

### The Ten Commandments and God's Love for Us

In his small book The Ten Commandments, Msgr. Charles Pope invites us see God's Law as part of a relationship of

God commands us and sets limits for us not because He is out to make life difficult or to take away our fun. God commands because he loves us and does not want us to be trapped in the painful realities of sin and evil. Through the grace He gives us Jesus enables us to trust the Father and to love Him. Love does not treat the law as an imposition but as a gift.

Over the next few weeks, we will look at the Ten Commandments and reflect on how each commandment is a call to a deeper relationship with God and greater love of God and neighbor.

The First Commandment: I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.

In the first commandment, God seeks to preserve His people from such bewilderment and sorrow. He alone is the Creator Lord who made all things. We can and must trust him in all things because he is able. He gives us the one and only truth by which we may be saved. Since He alone is all-powerful, we need not worry of the anger or power of other gods . . . God therefore speaks to us in love and commands us to worship Him alone, to trust him in all things, and to serve him with obedience.<sup>2</sup>
