

Sacrament of Baptism: Parish Registration and a Baptism class is required. Please contact Eileen Kutchak, 240-864-2510, to register and

plan to attend the class while awaiting the birth or adoption of your child.

Sacrament of Matrimony: In accord with the regulations of the Archdiocese of Washington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for the minimum of three months is required before preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic? Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as St. Raphael, one means of verifying participation is through the regular use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.



Religious Education - Registration for 2025-2026

St. Raphael Religious Education (SRRE) offers ongoing faith formation for all children and teens, as well as preparation for sacraments. SRRE works in partnership with parents, who are the primary catechists of their children. We encourage all families to bring their children for religious education classes each year, so that, as each child grows and changes, his or her relationship with Jesus and the Church will also grow and deepen.

Our Finding God textbook series emphasizes prayerful reflection while focusing on knowledge of the faith, initiating into the celebration of the mystery (mass and sacraments); forming for life in Christ (morality); teaching to pray; and introducing to community life and mission. Our volunteer catechists are faith-filled adults who work to share the Catholic faith in an age-appropriate way.

The SRRE Office coordinates sacrament preparation for all children ages 7-18. This includes Baptism, Confirmation, Reconciliation, and Eucharist.

Eastertime

Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast



of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities," just as the Eucharist is the "Sacrament of sacraments" (the Great Sacrament). St. Athanasius calls Easter "the Great Sunday" . The mystery of the Resurrection, in which

Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to him. (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1169) The paschal mystery (the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus) is the center of our faith. It is the model that governs and shapes the life of each Christian.

The celebration of Easter is not limited to one day or even one week; it lasts fifty days. God's sending of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) is the moment when we come to know the full impact of salvation on the world and enjoy the outpouring of God's life upon us.

What Ever Happened to Ascension Thursday?

In Acts 1:3 we hear that Jesus "presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of Based on that Scripture passage, Christians celebrated the feast of the Ascension on the 40th day of the Easter season, which became known as Ascension Thursday. For pastoral reasons, in particular to make it possible for all Catholics to celebrate this Holy Day of Obligation, several Bishops Conferences requested permission to transfer the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord to the following Sunday, since every Sunday is a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics. In the Archdiocese of Washington, we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension today, one week before Pentecost.



- ► Kids: Who is the wisest person you know? What has he or she taught you?





Anchored in hope -continued

22. Another reality having to do with eternal life is *God's judgement*, both at the end of our individual lives and at the end of history. . . We should indeed prepare ourselves consciously and soberly for the moment when our lives will be judged, but we must always do this from the standpoint of hope, the theological virtue that sustains our lives and shields them from groundless fear. The judgement of God, who is love, will surely be based on love, and in particular on all that we have done or failed to do with regard to those in need, in whose midst Christ, the Judge himself, is present (*Matthew* 25:31-46). Clearly, then, we are speaking of a judgement unlike any handed down by human, earthly tribunals; it should be understood as a rapport of truth with the God who is love and with oneself, within the unfathomable mystery of divine mercy.

Judgement, then, concerns the salvation in which we hope and which Jesus has won for us by his death and resurrection. It is meant to bring us to a definitive encounter with the Lord. The evil we have done cannot remain hidden; it needs to be *purified* in order to enable this definitive encounter with God's love. Here we begin to see the need of our prayers for all those who have ended their earthly pilgrimage, our solidarity in an intercession that is effective by virtue of the communion of the saints, and the shared bond that makes us one in Christ, the firstborn of all creation.


