Capuchin Vocations







Alleluia! The Crucified and Risen Jesus reigns – Earth quakes, Tyrants tremble.

The Easter celebration of Jesus' resurrection proclaims the truth that amid all of the powers on earth that surround us and threaten to engulf us – cultural, financial, political, military, biological or any other – it is the G-D who raised Jesus from the dead who truly reigns in our lives and at the heart of the world. The reign of G-D – the kingdom of G-D – is our freedom from any and every death-dealing force.

In the eucharistic celebration we rehearse kingdom relationships around the Table of the Lord – *neither Jew nor Greek, nor slave nor free, nor woman nor man.* Simply disciples steeped in the grace poured out in Christ Jesus among whom there are no superiors, no inferiors. Impelled by the Eucharist, we are sent into the world in the name of Jesus challenging any and every power that diminishes human community or desecrates human beings. The Crucified and Risen Jesus reigns – earth quakes, tyrants tremble:

Herod: He raises the dead?

First Nazarene: Yea, sire, He raiseth the dead.

Herod: I do not wish Him to do that. I forbid Him to do that. I allow no man to raise the dead. This Man must be found and told that I forbid him to raise the dead. Where is this Man at present?
