

Changing the Tide

DESIRE TO IMPROVE AND GROW CITY FUELS RICH CICERCHI'S PASSION TO HELP REVITALIZE CLEVELAND

RICH CICERCHI '65

As a child, Rich Cicerchi '65 often accompanied his father, Anthony, on trips from their west side home to downtown Cleveland. In one memory, as a five year old walking along downtown streets, he held onto his father's big hand with his own. As he looked up, the size and strength of his father matched the tall buildings in the background. He looked up with wonder and awe. He knew then, even at a young age, that he was in a special place.

More than 60 years later, Cicerchi continues to view Cleveland as an extraordinary city still fulfilling its promise. With fond memories of his father, he and his company are helping to make downtown Cleveland thrive again. Cicerchi is devoted to revitalizing the city, and looks back fondly on the Holy Name High School experiences that have helped shape him into the man he is today.

Learning and Reinforcing "Character Intangibles"

Cicerchi grew up in Sts. Philip and James Parish, a now-closed Catholic community located between Thrush Avenue and Bellaire Road in Cleveland. After attending Sts. Philip and James School, Cicerchi decided to continue his education at Holy Name.

"I had heard about Holy Name from friends," said Cicerchi. "I've always been drawn to things with depth and roots, and the tradition at Holy Name was rich. Although

I had to take three buses and it took an hour to get to school, I knew it was the right environment for me."

His Holy Name experience began before classes even started, as Cicerchi decided to continue his career on the gridiron and went out for the freshmen football team. This decision would be one that shaped Cicerchi and reinforced the character intangibles that his father, "a resourceful man who was as tough as nails," initially instilled in him.

"My time as a football player gave me valuable life skills that I put to use in my business, family, and personal life," said Cicerchi. "My coaches, especially Carl Falivene, Ed Michener and John DiCillo, helped me to develop mental focus and toughness, understand the importance of self-sacrifice and teamwork, and learn how to overcome obstacles and disappointments while also having courage in the face of adversity.

"I may not have been asked to make a block or tackle since my playing days, but I certainly have been asked to make important decisions that were aided by these character intangibles."

These positive, impactful memories have led Cicerchi to support Holy Name's Team Up for Turf project, an initiative to build a multi-purpose turf field and track on-campus in Parma Heights. With his lead gift to acquire the naming rights to the field, Cicerchi Field is on its way to becoming a reality for current and future students. The goal is to have the

synthetic turf playing field installed and ready for use in fall 2016.


"Holy Name needs a safe, durable multi-purpose field and track that will accommodate various teams and will appeal to prospective students and their parents. That's what we must have in today's modern era," he said. "Team Up for Turf has to bring the home field advantage home for the first time in school history. This facility will help students in extra-curricular activities develop the discipline and determination I was able to learn as a student at Holy Name, things that I continue to carry with me to this day."

Transforming Sadness into Revitalization

Along with his passion for helping to improve and strengthen the Holy Name campus, Cicerchi is devoted to the revitalization of downtown Cleveland. Now the president and CEO of Cicerchi Development Company, he first became involved in redeveloping properties on a part-time basis in 1978, when he acquired a nine-suite apartment building in Cleveland. "Development allows the opportunity for financial freedom, which appealed to me, so I went for it," he said.

After leaving a successful business career, which culminated as Cicerchi being the chief operating officer for two software companies, he decided in 1998 that it was time to work full time on his own. His business background,

as well as his bachelor's and master's degrees from John Carroll University, prepared him well for his next venture.

"The deterioration I saw happening to the Cleveland I loved, in contrast to childhood memories of visits with my dad, saddened me," said Cicerchi. "But this sadness also drew me back, and has made me determined to make this an area people enjoy both as residents and visitors."

Cicerchi explained that while he focuses on acquisitions and project financing, his son, Pat, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran and current vice president of development for Cicerchi Development, supervises their employees and contractors to ensure progress is being made and properties are being maintained.


His first major downtown renovation project was the Krause Building, located on East Fourth Street. The building, which once housed props and costumes for the Cleveland Opera House, was vacant when Cicerchi purchased it in 2006. He, along with Pat, determined that five condos and Wonder Bar would be featured in the building.

Now known as the Lofts On 4th, the Krause Building condos are all occupied and Wonder Bar has become a hot spot before and after Cleveland sporting events. The success of revitalizing one downtown property has led to the acquisition of another for Cicerchi, this time the Southworth Building on Ontario Street. It features 18 suites and two restaurants.

"Cleveland suffered when the core, downtown, deteriorated. In order to change the tide, we need to start rebuilding with that core. Furthermore, in order to stabilize that core so there is no regression, we must invite people to reside there with quality suites and needed amenities," said Cicerchi. "Young people want and need good living conditions and a city with walkability, which is what we are creating downtown. Living space is a leverage point. Everything else – including economic growth – follows density of population."

"Right now, close to 15,000 people live downtown. I expect in the next five years, that number will increase to 30,000 as the downtown area continues to expand."

Although tenants Subway and Mirch Masala remain located in the Southworth's main floor, the remaining three floors have been

transformed into 18 apartment residences, nine two-bedroom and nine one-bedroom units. A recently-built atrium, with a skylight to allow natural sunlight to enter the building on each floor, is just one new distinguishable trait of the 165-year-old building.

Moving Toward a Bright Future

Along with the Krause and Southworth Buildings, Cicerchi continues to research new acquisitions in the downtown area, as well as throughout Northeast Ohio and St. Petersburg, Florida. He and son, Pat, work together to manage the Cicerchi Development staff of 16 people, along with the various subcontractors and Wonder Bar workers that they oversee.

Additionally, Cicerchi spends time with his wife of 43 years, Barbara, and their six children and five grandchildren. He also is an avid Holy Name event attendee, and speaks

on behalf of the Team Up for Turf project to generate support and additional pledges for the \$1.5 million initiative.

Most importantly, Cicerchi remains committed to making his hometown a better place, and recognizes the value in providing facilities, both at Holy Name and downtown, which allow people to be the best versions of themselves. "My desire to help comes from within, and I'm glad I have the opportunity to do so and I invite others to join the campaign," he said.

Whether it's a turf field and track that will help students develop the same character intangibles that have helped make him successful, or a redeveloped apartment building that brings residents and revenue downtown, Cicerchi is ensuring the next generation is able to view Cleveland the same way he did, and still does: a special place filled with promise and opportunity for all. ~



With \$666,000 Raised, Team Up for Turf Project Generates Support from Alumni, Parents, and Friends

As of February 2016, Holy Name High School has \$666,000 donated or pledged toward the school's Team Up for Turf initiative! This project will include replacing the existing grass field and track, located behind the main school building, with a synthetic turf field and all-weather track.

The beginning stages of the Team Up for Turf Project have already been completed, with the school working with The Osborn Engineering Company to create final site plans, and to make sure all of the right steps are taken with the builders and the city of Parma Heights to properly replace the field.

Moving forward, the project, which has a fundraising goal of \$1.5 million, will be completed in phases. If the \$900,000 needed to fund Phase 1 is raised, then Phase 1 is targeted to begin in early summer 2016. It will include removing trees, excavating the property, putting in the proper fencing, creating the groundwork for the future track, and laying down the turf. The goal is to have the field ready for fall practices at the end of August 2016.

Future phases will include installing the track, as well as adding items such as home and visitors' stands, a concession booth, and other amenities.

The benefits of this multi-purpose field and track are numerous, and include:

- Giving fall and spring athletic teams a place to practice daily and to host home games and matches
- Allowing more students to attend home games and meets
- Serving as a place where physical education



classes can be held in the fall and the spring

- Creating permanent markings on the field to ensure the marching band, drill team, and cheerleaders can practice and perform with greater precision
- Being an ideal venue for a variety of non-athletic school events, such as assemblies and Masses
- Bringing future Namers to the campus and introducing them to the school community by hosting CYO football, Pop Warner, club soccer, and club lacrosse games, practices, and tournaments
- Eliminating practices canceled due to muddy fields, dangerous holes, and re-seeding
- Eliminating annual expenses such as fuel for mowing, seeding, fertilization, irrigation, field preparation, and striping, with labor costs for field maintenance also being significantly reduced

Hands-On, Interactive Experiments Increase as Medical Mutual Patton Physics Lab Opens

After much anticipation, Holy Name High School dedicated the brand-new Medical Mutual Patton Physics Lab on Thursday, December 3. The lab is named in honor of the late James V. Patton, a 1947 graduate of Holy Name and a long-time executive at Medical Mutual.

Several people made the complete \$200,000 renovation of the physics lab possible, including Medical Mutual, the late Tony '49 and Josephine Ferrante, Ray '44 and Eleanor Smiley, and the estate of the late Geraldine Kempinski '49. Because of their generous support, the lab, which is now used by the physics and honors physics classes, is a reality.

Westlake Reed Leskosky (WRL), an architectural firm, worked with Holy Name to conceptualize and design the physics lab, with discussions originally beginning in spring 2014. A year later, in the spring of 2015, WRL and Holy Name began moving full speed ahead to completely renovate the existing physics lab space. By the end of October 2015, the lab was complete, and ready to be used for the start of the school's second academic quarter.

WRL Architect Patrick Hyland, who is married to Jennifer Bokar-Hyland '91, said the new lab is now a totally flexible lab. Whereas previously the furniture was bolted to the ground, the new tables and chairs are all on wheels. Hyland said, "The physics teacher is able to reconfigure the room to accommodate the experiment being conducted. This allows for a variety of labs to be taught, including larger scale experiments."

Physics Teacher Alan Duncan (profile on page 11) agrees that the lab gives his students and himself the ability to move around the lab more easily. "The kids are utilizing the space really well," he said. "The lab has a feel of a college classroom, a good set-up for the kids to experience now. It also allows us to conduct college-level experiments, which is great."

The new, made-to-order movable furniture was not the only major change made to the existing room. Precision Environmental handled the preliminary demolition, while A.M. Higley Co. took care of the lab's construction and renovation.

"We chose A.M. Higley Co. because of their extensive experience with school science labs and wings, and because they were able to give the entire timeline for the project up-front," said Holy Name Principal Shelby Blanc '95. "The quality of work performed by A.M. Higley, as well as Westlake Reed Leskosky, both met and exceeded our expectations."

After gutting the space, workers removed water and gas line outputs from the middle of the room, and moved them to the perimeters of the lab. They also installed new drywall, cabinetry, doors, and a floating ceiling, put in a tile floor, and painted.

"Work stations are now located around the perimeter of the room, with storage cabinets located above them," said Hyland.

Denise McCafferty, science department chair, added, "The individual stations in the physics lab will allow for many hands-on experiments, and will provide many new opportunities for juniors and seniors."

Additionally, Hyland pointed out that "the

teaching wall at the front of the lab remains, with a SMART board included. There is also extra cabinetry and an emergency eye wash and shower station. The room has Wi-Fi, and is air conditioned."


At the Medical Mutual Patton Physics Lab dedication, several members of Patton's family were in attendance, including his wife Ursula, who helped Principal Blanc and Medical Mutual Director of Community Outreach Debra Green with the ceremonial

ribbon cutting.

"Mr. Patton loved his time as a Holy Name student, and often shared his fond memories with his family members, friends, and colleagues," said Blanc. "Because of this, the Holy Name community feels privileged to now have a physics lab that will allow Mr. Patton's legacy to continue on for years to come."

With the Medical Mutual Physics Lab now completed, it was announced that the next lab slated for renovation will be the chemistry

lab. The lab, which will be named in honor of the late Tony '49 and Josephine Ferrante due to their support of the project, will become a more modern and collaborative space.

It is an exciting time to be a physics student at Holy Name, especially with physics teacher Alan Duncan leading the way. Duncan, who joined the faculty in January 2015, teaches all physics and honors physics classes in

Class of 2015 becomes 98th Graduating Class from Holy Name

At the commencement ceremony held last May 22 at St. Columbkille Church in Parma, 146 students graduated to become alumni of Holy Name High School. These students were a part of the 98th class to graduate from Holy Name.

Valedictorian Elizabeth DePauw delivered the student address.

“Over my seventeen years of life, I have learned much intellectually, spiritually, socially, and personally, and although I do not have the wisdom that comes with age, I have learned that Holy Name is not just any generic high school,” said DePauw. “Most importantly, I have learned how to analyze and draw wisdom from others. Tonight, I draw that wisdom from author Erma Bombeck. She once wrote, “When I stand before God at the end of my life, I would hope that I would not have a single bit of talent left, and could say, ‘I used everything you gave me.’”

DePauw then spoke of how Holy Name was the place where she, as well as her classmates, developed these talents, and where they discovered the details that have helped shaped them, and prepared them for the future.

“The future is uncertain and the past is unchangeable, but the future holds hope and the past has taught us vital lessons and created irreplaceable relationships. So as life continues to throw all it has at us, keep your head high knowing that Holy Name has prepared you, make use of all the talents that God has given you, trust in those who want to see you happy and successful, and show love in all your actions,” she said.

George Selim '98, who is now the director of community partnerships at the White House, was the commencement speaker. He focused on three main principles that he said played a large role in overcoming obstacles and achieving success since graduating from Holy Name more than 17 years ago.

The first was to set goals. “As you think about the goals you each set in your lives, keep two things in mind: life is an equalizer, giving us each an opportunity to compete.

Now the director of the office for community partnerships at the White House, George Selim '98 gave students principles to remember throughout life: to set goals, to work hard, and to show compassion.

Don't ever set your goals a day or an inch too short. And, put down your phone. Talk to people, ask questions, ask what other people are doing, ask for advice and help,” said Selim.

He then focused on working hard, remembering the work ethic he learned at Holy Name, which was to work harder than others to stand out. He said, “You are the class of 2015; your attitude should be that nothing is unchangeable, no problem unsolvable. Approach each academic and professional endeavor as an opportunity to out-work your peers. It will be a distinguishing factor for the rest of your life.”

His last main principle was on showing compassion. Selim encouraged students to invest in the people around them by finding

ways to improve neighborhoods, schools, or even friends. “Your country needs you, your community needs you, and your alma mater needs you,” he said.

Selim closed by emphasizing that it is important that students tell their loved ones how much they mean to them.

“Take a lesson from me and honor those who have invested their time, talents, and love into your time at Holy Name. Thank them, respect them, and most importantly remember that 17 years from tonight, it will be one of you who has spent a decade in Washington, worked at the White House, and returned home to give the keynote address at commencement. I hope to be sitting in the back and watching.”

NamerFEST Festivities Offer Activities for Green Wave Supporters of All Ages to Enjoy



DONOR PROFILE:

Michele Roth-Kauffman '86



For Michele Roth-Kauffman '86, her path to becoming a professor and chairperson of the Gannon University Physician Assistant Program began at Holy Name.

As a high school student, Roth-Kauffman knew she wanted a career in the medical field, but was unsure of what route to take. Her kind-hearted guidance counselor, Mrs. Jisa, pulled her out of class one day to speak with an admissions representative from St. Francis University (PA). Mrs. Jisa thought St. Francis's physician assistant program would be the perfect fit for Roth-Kauffman, and she was right. "She took the time to think about me, and that had a huge impact on my life," said Roth-Kauffman, who worked as a certified physician assistant at a Pittsburgh hospital for seven years before joining the faculty at Gannon.

This impact made Roth-Kauffman's decision to give to Holy Name's Annual Fund an easy one. "I want to see Catholic education continue, as the moral and spiritual piece to learning is very important. For Catholic education to survive, people need to support it," she said.

This passion for education, as well as Holy Name, was first instilled in Roth-Kauffman by her father, the late John Roth '48. Seven of his children, including John '76, James '77, Gail '79, Thomas '83, Rita Roth Sosic '89, Ann '94, and Roth-Kauffman, were all Holy Name graduates.

"My father was very involved at Holy Name, and was a huge supporter of the school. Giving back helps to honor his memory," said Roth-Kauffman.

Along with her bachelor's degree from St. Francis, Roth-Kauffman holds a master of physician studies degree from the University of Nebraska, and has her juris doctor degree from the Duquesne University School of Law.

"Holy Name gave me skills that helped me to be very prepared for college and graduate school. I still use those skills in my work now," she said.

Roth-Kauffman and her husband, Mark, have three children, twin boys and a girl. She and her family now live near Erie, Pennsylvania, but she has never forgotten the difference Holy Name has made in her life. She said, "The guidance and attention I received, as well as the welcoming, family-like atmosphere I was a part of, helped me grow into the person I am today."


