## The State of Ohio's Graduation Requirements

$>$ Subject Area/Credit Requirements
$\checkmark$ Earn a state minimum of 20 credits (minus Theology) in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Fine Arts, Health, Physical Education, and electives.
$\checkmark$ Achieved by meeting all of Holy Name's graduation credit requirements as indicated above.
> Graduation Testing Requirements
$\checkmark$ Students must prove to be 'college and career ready' by reaching remediation free scores on either the ACT or the high school level IOWA Assessments.
$\checkmark$ Students may take the ACT and/or IOWA multiple times in an attempt to reach the required scores.

- Earning "REMEDIATION FREE" scores on the ACT means a student has met the minimum "benchmark" scores, as established by the Ohio Department of Education on the following ACT subtests:

English - 18 or higher
Mathematics - 22 or higher
Reading - 22 or higher

- Students may take the ACT multiple times in an attempt to reach the required scores.
- Students may "super score" on the ACT to reach the required scores.

OR,

- Earn "REMEDIATION FREE" scores on the IOWA Assessments. The Ohio Department of Education has established minimum passing scores and a point system for the following seven IOWA subsets:

ELA: English I and English II
Math: Algebra I and Geometry
Science: Biology
Social Studies: American History and American Government

- A minimum of 18 points is required for graduation.
- Students may take the IOWA Assessments multiple times to attain the required scores.

Holy Name High School has been administering the ACT to students on Holy Name's campus during the spring of students' Junior year since 2017. The date of the administration is determined by the Ohio Department of Education. The ODE pays for that test administration.

Holy Name High School has been administering the IOWA Assessments to students on Holy Name's campus during the spring of students' Sophomore year since 2017. Holy Name will administer the IOWA Assessments to all Sophomores the same day the ACT is given to Juniors.
