In order to graduate from Holy Name High School, a student must successfully complete 25 credits; participate in the Career Shadowing Program; and earn a minimum amount of service hours each year. Additionally, the state of Ohio graduation requirements, which include proving to be 'college and career ready' by reaching certain scores on state-approved graduation tests, must be met. The needed distribution of the 25 credits is as follows:

Math: 4

(Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry)

Science: 3

(Biology, Chemistry)

Social Studies: 3

(World History, U.S. History, Government)

Electives: 2.5

World Languages: 2

(Two years of the same language)

Fine/Performing Arts: 1

Financial Literacy: .5

(Financial Literacy is a required class beginning with the Class of 2026)

Health: .5

Physical Education: .5

PE Waiver: 0*
