APRIL ART CLASS

To start off April in art class, we looked a little more into Color Theory. We learned about the color wheel, and the relationship between the colors on it. Students can name the primary colors (red, blue, yellow), secondary colors (green, orange, purple), complementary colors (colors across from each other on the color wheel), analogous colors (colors next to each other on the color wheel), and the difference between warm (red, orange, yellow) and cool (green, blue, purple) colors. Students then chose five colors they believed worked well together as a color scheme to draw a picture.

Next, we looked at Wax Resist. Students learned about how when wax is painted over with watercolor, the wax pushes the water away to reveal a "secret" picture. With Easter around the corner, students drew crosses with a candle to remember Jesus' Resurrection. The students created some beautiful and colorful watercolor pieces!

To finish up art class in April, we looked at oil pastels and how they are similar, but also different from crayons. We learned how to blend colors together, and different techniques for adding detail. For their project, students picked a food to draw and practiced the new techniques they learned. Students who had time also blended a background color for their food.
