Thanks to the generous support of the Parishioners of St. John's we broke ground on our new Church in October 2010. Construction is well underway and we now turn our attention to furnishing our beautiful Church.

Joyfully we present this Memorial and Honorarium Program. A memorial or an honorarium is a monetary gift given to purchase a needed item for our new Church. The gift can be given by an individual, a family or a ministry to memorialize or honor a loved one, your family, a departed friend, or give thanks for blessings received.

The Liturgy Sub-Committee has been working for many months to select items which will lift our hearts to God. They have looked at purchasing new items and at re-purposing items from historical churches. The result will be a beautiful blend of old and new. The selection of a few existing items allows us to take advantage of craftsmanship and materials not available in our age. In other cases we will commission items be made for our new Church to fit a unique need or meet today's standards.

Visual Unity

The focal point of our Church will point to the centrality of the Eucharist to our faith. This will be accomplished through the visual unity of the Crucifix, Altar and Tabernacle.

St. John's has been blessed to be able to repurpose a beautiful altar and reredos from the previous Sacred Heart Parish in Vailsburg, NJ. The altar is made out of Algerian Onyx. The reredos is a colonnade of six marble columns which curve behind the altar with the tabernacle centered in the reredos in a marble niche. These sacred furnishings were made in Italy by Italian craftsman for Daprato of Chicago, New York, and Pietrasanta, Italy. Daprato was a leader in sacred furnishings in the first half of the 20th century.

At the top of the reredos is a marble niche which will provide a home for the crucifix. On either side are two intricate marble reliefs of the nativity of Jesus and Jesus being placed in the tomb. Between these reliefs is another depicting two angels who will appear to support the crucifix.

History

One of the guiding principles of the design of our new Church was the articulation of our place in historic Leesburg. Our new Church is positioned on our property so that the doors open toward the town. The overall traditional cruciform design and brick exterior mirror the architecture within Leesburg.

Our Little Church, dedicated in 1878, is a gem in Leesburg and the Arlington Diocese. The design committee has worked to incorporate elements of the Little Church into our new Church. For instance, the stained glass in the smaller windows on the main level of the Church will be designed to reflect the patterns in the Little Church's windows. Also, the tile floor in the nave will incorporate crosses in the pattern similar to the ones on the ends of the pews in the Little Church.

Other Design Elements

On either side of the altar will be Blessed Mother and St. Joseph Shrines. Both shrines are originally from the Sacred Heart Parish mentioned above. These shrines were made from pure white marble from Carrara, Italy.

Our patron saint, St. John the Apostle, will stand prominently at the exterior entrance to the Church. Plans also include a place of honor for a statue of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta and Blessed Pope John Paul II at the ends of the ambulatories. A Sacred Heart shrine will be placed opposite the baptismal font in the transept complete with votive candles. The Sacred Heart statue originally stood in the top niche of the reredos as seen below.

Our existing baptismal font will likely be refurbished and placed in our new Church. This baptismal font is the original font used in the Little Church. The transepts will also have a total of four confessionals, two on each side.

Along the ambulatory Stations of the Cross will line the walls between the stained glass windows. Above the ambulatory arches there will be a frieze depicting selections from scripture, most likely St. John's Gospel.

MEMORIALS AND HONORARIUMS PROGRAM

How will our Memorial and Honorarium Program work?

The pages that follow outline the known items that will be required to dedicate our Church in early 2012. You may select any item(s) to apply your donation towards. In the event that the item you have selected has been sold or oversubscribed you will be contacted. If you do not wish to specify an item, your gift will be applied toward those items most needed.

The value assigned to each opportunity is relative to the items value, rather than reflecting any actual cost to purchase or refurbish. Once donated the memorial or honorarium article becomes the property of the parish.

Special consideration to those who have given in the capital campaigns:

There will be two special considerations for those who made a formal pledge in the Upon this Rock and/or the Rooted in Faith/Forward in Hope Capital Campaigns:

- When an item is oversubscribed **consideration will be given first** to those that have made a formal pledge.
- To recognize your prior sacrificial gift participants in the capital campaigns will be given a **25% discount** off the listed values of all items in the Memorial and Honorarium Program. To apply this discount your pledge payments should be up-to-date.

How will your gift be acknowledged?

Memorials and Honorariums will be recognized in three ways:

- The permanent acknowledgement will most likely be on etched glass depicting the name of those being honored or memorialized. Thus the donors and those they have honored will always be remembered in the prayers of our community.
- A thank you letter, signed by our pastor, will be issued to each donor acknowledging their gift. If the gift is in honor of someone outside the immediate family, a letter will also be issued to the person being honored or to their relatives.
- In the Dedication Program.

How can you participate in this program?

Members of the Memorials and Honorarium Committee will be available on a continuing basis to assist you. Gifts may be made directly to any member of this committee, to the parish office, or may be included in the Sunday collection. A Memorial and Honorarium Commitment Form is located in the back of this brochure for your use, along with contact information for committee members. Please use this form to assure proper accounting and that your donation will be applied as you desire. Make checks payable to “St. John the Apostle Memorial and Honorarium Fund”.

Will these gifts be tax deductible?

Yes, but consult your tax advisor for your specific situation. Gifts will be recorded with your yearly contribution on the parish records and will be reported to you in the yearly church mailing. Full payment is desired before January 31, 2012; however alternate payment terms can be arranged. Congress has extended the IRA charitable rollover so if you are age 70 ½ or older you can make distributions from your IRA directly to qualified charities, which includes our Church.

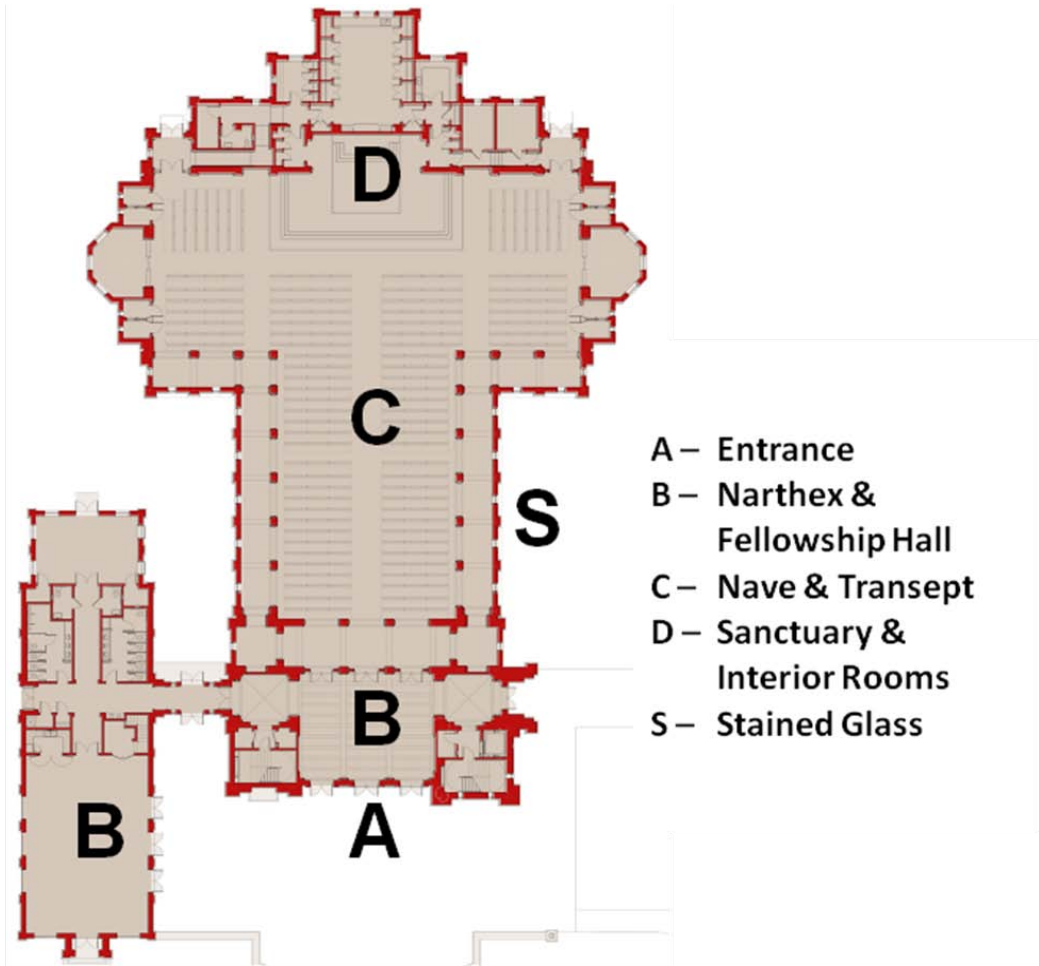

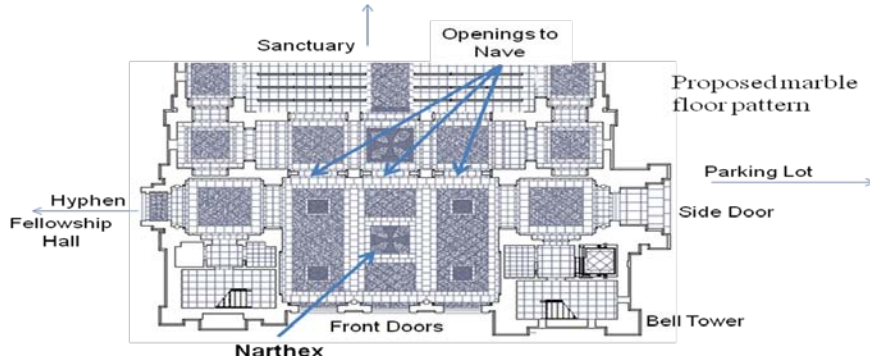

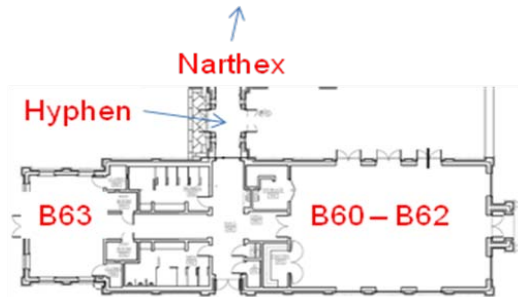

| B48 | Benches (x2) | The Narthex will provide room for restless toddlers and their parents. |

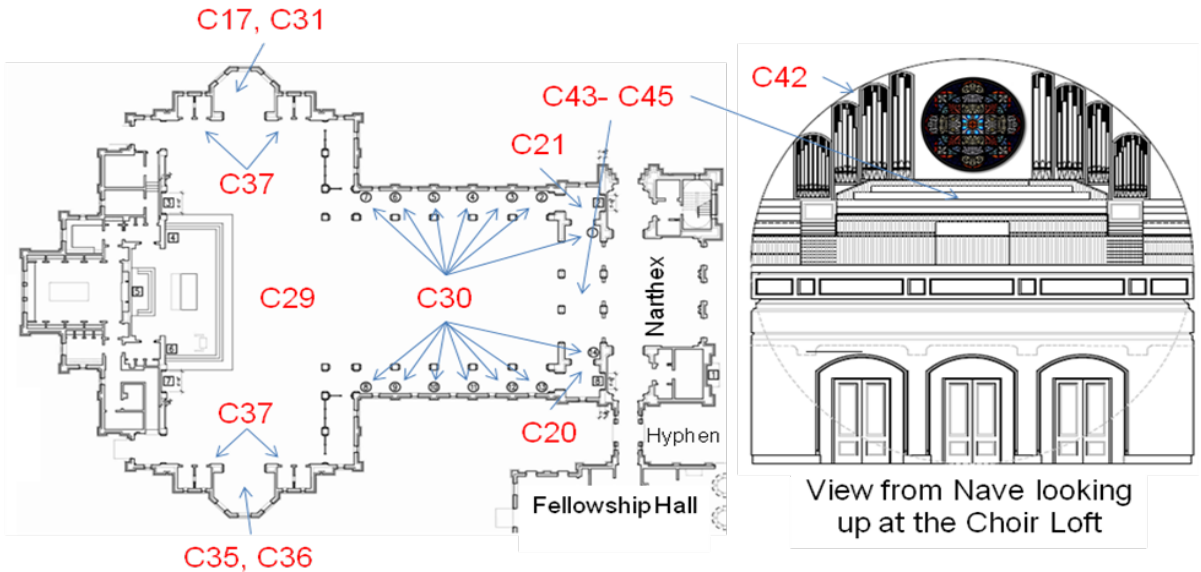

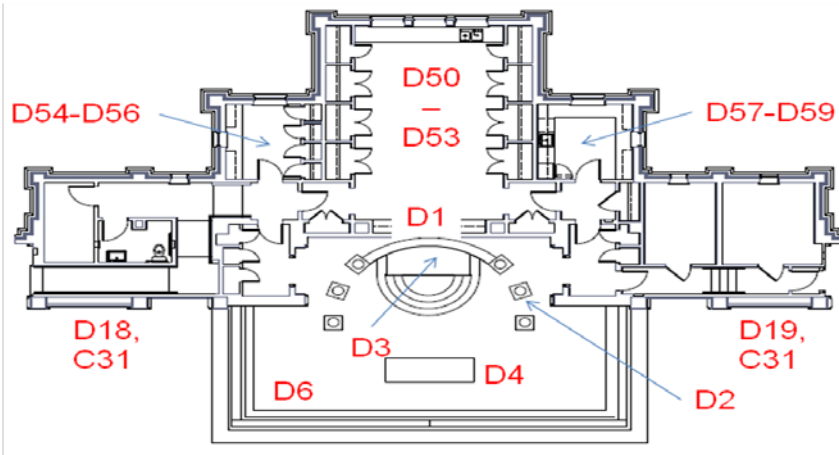

|  | <p>C17</p> <p>Sacred Heart Shrine</p> <p><i>Height: 5' 8"</i></p> | <p>Originally in the niche of the Reredos, the Sacred Heart statue will be placed in the transept opposite the Baptistry.</p> |
|  | <p>C20</p> <p>Blessed Pope John Paul II</p> <p><i>Height: 5' - 6'</i></p> | <p>Contemporary soon to be saint beloved by our generation. Quality statue will be found or commissioned.</p> |
| <p>C21</p> | <p>Blessed Teresa of Calcutta</p> <p><i>Height: 5' - 6'</i></p> | <p>Contemporary soon to be saint beloved to our generation. Quality statue will be found or commissioned.</p> |
|  | <p>C28</p> <p>Consecration Crosses (x12)</p> | <p>Twelve crosses will mark the places where the Church walls have been anointed with chrism (holy oil) during the dedication Mass. This tradition dates back to the 4th Century. Each cross will include a position for a candle which will be lit on the anniversary of the dedication each year and on other holy days.</p> |
| <p>C29</p> | <p>Pews (new)</p> | <p>New pews will be designed to reflect the ceiling line and crosses as depicted on the pews in the Little Church.</p> |

| C30  | Stations of the Cross (x14) | We anticipate repurposing stations from a historic church; one possibility is in Fitchberg, Mass. These stations are beautifully carved and painted. Of historical note as well – a St. John's parishioner was baptized and raised in this parish. The thumbnail picture is the 12 th Station depicting the crucifixion with Mary and John at the foot of the cross. |
| C31 | Votive Candle Racks (x4) | Votive candles will be positioned near each shrine. |
| C32 | Holy Water Fonts (x10) | Holy Water Fonts will be located at each entrance to the Sanctuary. |
| C33 | Frieze (above ambulatory) | Scriptural text will be painted above the ambulatory. Cost and materials vary widely. Estimate provided as a guideline for benefactor. |
| C34 | Sound System | State of the art sound system. A hard of hearing loop is being considered. |
| C35  | Baptismal Font | Our existing Baptismal Font will be refurbished. This Baptismal Font is the original font used in the Little Church. |
| C36 | Ambry | A cabinet for the Holy Oils consecrated every Holy Thursday will be located near the Baptismal Font. |
| C37 – C41 | Confessionals (x4) | Four full Confessionals will be available, each with screens and kneelers to aid in effective Sacramental Confession. |
| C42 | Pipe Organ | Daffer Organs of Jessup, MD is working the design layout and will install the organ. The selected organ is 42 Ranks, 3 Manuals by Wicks (made in USA), Opus 5873. Our hope is a single benefactor will step forward to fund the organ so that it can be dedicated with our Church. |
| C42a | Pipe Organ Fund | In the event a benefactor does not step forward to fund the Organ, a special fund has been set up to collect monies. Donations can be of any value. Should an Organ benefactor step forward monies in the Organ Fund will be used to fund other items for St. John's Music Ministry. |
| C43 | Grand Piano | Range of cost for a quality Grand Piano suitable for the music ministry varies greatly. Estimate provided as a guideline to benefactor. |
| C44 - C45 | Choir Loft | Our Church will provide a dedicated space for our Choir in the loft to facilitate beautiful music lofting throughout our Church. |

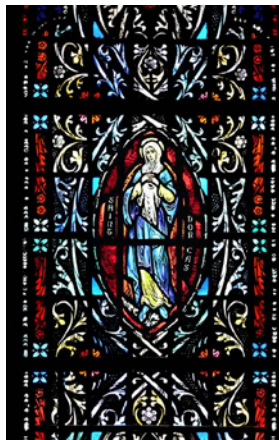
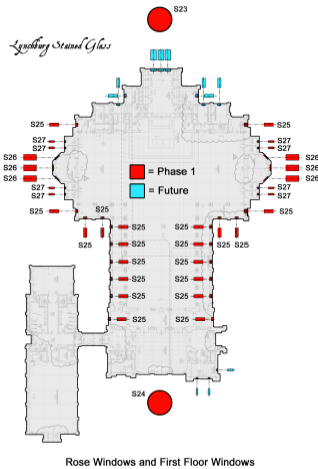

| D1 | Crucifix | A Crucifix is being commissioned for the top niche in the Reredos where the Statue of Sacred Heart previously stood. The Statue of Sacred Heart will be located in a Shrine in the Transept. |
|  | Reredos <i>Structure weighs 120,000 lbs, 28' high, 25' wide, and 13' deep</i> | The Reredos comes from Sacred Heart Church in Vailsburg, NJ. Bishop Fulton Sheen officiated at the dedication of Sacred Heart. The items being repurposed from Sacred Heart were made by Italian craftsman in the 1920's for Daprato of Chicago, New York, and Pietrasanta, Italy. A Reredos is an architectural element which unifies the tabernacle, altar and crucifix. |
|  | D2.1 Angels supporting Sacred Heart | Two beautifully carved angels from pure carrara marble at the bottom of the niche supported the Statue of the Sacred Heart and will now provide the same artistic support for our Crucifix. |
|  | D2.2 Columns <i>12' high, 3400 lbs each</i> | Massive Columns each weighing almost 3400lbs including their bases and towering 12' in height. This rare marble compliments the Altar and the main Reredos. Colonnade of six columns wrap around the sides of the altar, as Christ reaches out from the tabernacle to embrace the community. |

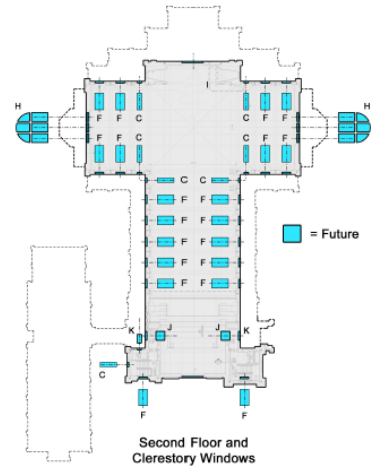

| D2.3  | Niche for Tabernacle | A home for the Tabernacle is centered in the Reredos in a marble niche immediately behind the Altar. Directly below the niche a carved relief of angels is depicted gazing lovingly on the tabernacle. |
| D2.4  | Left marble panel | Above the colonnade on the left sits a carved marble panel depicting Christ's birth. |
| D2.5  | Right marble panel | Above the colonnade on the right sits a carved marble panel depicting Christ's death. |
| D3  | Tabernacle | Classic brass Tabernacle with cross spanning the doors-- the center piece of the Reredos from Sacred Heart of Vailsburg, the largest parish church when it opened in 1929. |
| D4  | Altar | The Altar comes from Sacred Heart Church. This beautiful work of art is made of Algerian onyx. |
| D5 | Chalice & Ciborium | A Chalice and Ciborium purchased will be the resident sacred vessels of our new Church. Cost varies widely. Estimate provided as a guideline to benefactor. |
| D6 | Ambo (Pulpit) | An Ambo will be commissioned worthy of the magnificent Altar and Reredos. |
| D7- D9 | Chairs in Sanctuary | Chairs for the priest, concelebrants and altar servers. |
| D10  | Monstrance | Vessel for display of the Consecrated Host during Eucharistic Adoration. A Monstrance of sufficient size for this Church will be procured. Cost can range from \$5,000 - \$50,000. Estimate provided as a guideline to benefactor. |
| D11  | Processional Cross | Used in processions, the cross is brought up to the altar by an altar server who has been chosen to serve as crucifer. |
| D12 | Sanctuary Lamp | The sanctuary lamp is placed near the tabernacle as a sign that the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. |
| D13  | Mass Bells (x2) | The primary reason for the use of Sanctus/altar bells is to create a joyful noise to the Lord as a way to give thanks for the miracle taking place atop the Altar of Sacrifice. |
| D14 - D16 | Candle Holders and Flower Stands | 10 candleholders and 6 flower stands will be available to beautify our Altar. |

| <p>D18b</p>  | <p>Shrine</p> | <p>The Statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary is situated in a mosaic and carved marble shrine, placed on an all marble pedestal containing a large carved marble relief of the Annunciation. | <p>D19b</p>  | <p>Shrine</p> | <p>The Statue of St. Joseph is situated in a mosaic and carved marble shrine, placed on an all marble pedestal containing a large carved marble relief depicting Joseph's death. The shrine will be located prominently just to the right of the sanctuary. This shrine was one of five major elements of sacred furnishings commissioned for Sacred Heart of Vailsburg and created and marked by the Daprato Co.</p> |
| <p>D50 – D53</p>  | <p>Sacristy Room</p> | <p>The Sacristy will have one of the classic old vesting cabinets obtained from Sacred Heart of Vailsburg. This solid oak and poplar wood cabinet is almost 12 feet long and is being refurbished by furniture craftsmen. It will be placed in the front wall of the Sacristy.</p> |

The design will be inspired from the Rose Window at the Little Church and may include a scene of Mary and St. John at the foot of the Cross. The final design is under review and will be determined in the coming months. |
| S25 | Ambulatory Stained Glass Windows (x20) <i>22.5" x 66"</i> | All the lower windows along the ambulatory and in the transepts will replicate the beautiful design of the stained glass windows in the nave of the Little Church. It is under consideration to include a depiction of a saint in an oval in the center as depicted above. |
| S26 | Shrine Transept Stained Glass (x6) <i>48" x 112"</i> | Six windows on the main level of the Transept – 3 framing the Baptistry and 3 framing the Sacred Heart Shrine. These windows will be commissioned with scenes from the life of Christ and the saints. |
| S27 | Confessional Stained Glass Windows (x8) <i>16" x 47"</i> | Each Confessional will contain two stained glass windows which will be replicated from the design of the windows at the Little Church. |
| TBD | Clerestory Stained Glass Windows (x26) <i>Most 60" x 112'</i> | The priority is to furnish Stained Glass Windows on the main level of the Church for our Dedication.
