The Presentation of the Lord

In some traditions today marks the end of Christmastide: indeed, the continental custom of leaving the crib in the church until this feast day is becoming more widespread. The first two chapters of Luke's Gospel are effectively a Gospel within a Gospel. They are made up of the infancy narratives, which provide us with the good news that God has become incarnate, but by including the prophetic voices of Simeon and Anna they also introduce us to the passion and resurrection.

The Church reinforces the message of today's feast by using the prophet Malachi to help us see the significance of Jesus entering the Temple, and the letter to the Hebrews prepares our minds for the ultimate sacrifice, culminating in the passion and death which is the destiny of this child. In due course we will hear Jesus inviting us to bridge the gap between his people's history and the importance of the Temple because the new Temple will not be a building but himself.
