First Sunday of Lent

We cannot turn on and off the joy of worship, like hitting the switch on the electricity, or turning a tap. We go to church to be inspired, and this means we depend on the power of the Holy Spirit. The great writers on prayer warn us that prayer does not always generate a great deal of feeling. The power of the Holy Spirit penetrates the whole human being, and there is more to a human being that feeling.

Yet we seek peace in prayer and worship. The trick is to try to be indifferent to feelings, not to be continually looking for "highs", which might be followed by very deep "lows". Instead we follow Our Lord into the desert, to trust in God alone, to live by God's word. We should remember, though, that Jesus also sang hymns at the Last Supper before he went to Gethsemane. Good music is a part of the worship of God, and the Psalms are fundamentally songs. The singing does not need to be perfect; it just needs to be sincere.

Above all, we should remember how important worship is. In the story of Christ's temptations in the wilderness, which we heard as today's Gospel, the devil was trying to disrupt Jesus' worship. It speaks volumes that the devil saw worship as the most important thing to disrupt in a human life. The devil wanted to be worshipped, not for its own sake, but because idolatry is the best way to stop people worshipping God.
