

POPE FRANCIS - ANGELUS- SAINT PETER'S SQUARE

(SUNDAY, 05 JULY 2020)

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Good morning!

This Sunday's Gospel reading (cf. Mt 11:25-30) is divided into three parts: first of all, Jesus raises a prayer of blessing and thanksgiving to the Father because he revealed the mystery of the Kingdom of Heaven to the poor and to the simple; then he reveals the intimate and unique relationship between himself and the Father; and finally he invites us to go to him and to follow him to find solace.

In the first place, Jesus praises the Father because he has kept the secrets of his Kingdom, of his truth, hidden "from the wise and understanding" (v. 25). He calls them so with a veil of irony because they presume to be wise, understanding, and therefore, very often, have a closed heart. True wisdom also comes from the heart. It is not only a matter of understanding ideas: true wisdom also enters the heart. And if you know many things but have a closed heart, you are not wise. Jesus tells them that his Father's mysteries are revealed to the "little ones", to those who confidently open themselves to his Word of salvation, who open their heart to the Word of salvation, who feel the need for him and await everything from him. The heart that is open and trustful towards the Lord.

Then, Jesus explains that he has received everything from the Father, and calls him "my Father", to affirm the unique nature of his relationship with him. Indeed, only between the Son and the Father is there total reciprocity: each one knows the other, each one lives in the other. But this unique communion is like a flower that blossoms to freely reveal its beauty and its goodness. And here then is Jesus' invitation: "Come to me..." (v. 28). He wishes to give what he receives from the Father. He wants to give us Truth, and Jesus' Truth is always free: it is a gift, it is the Holy Spirit, the Truth.

Just as the Father has a preference for the "little ones", Jesus also addresses those "who labour and are heavy laden". Indeed, he places himself among them, because he

is "gentle and lowly in heart" (v. 29): this is how he describes himself. It is the same in the first and third Beatitudes, that of the humble and poor in spirit, and that of the meek (cf. Mt 5:5): the meekness of Jesus. In this way Jesus, "meek and humble", is not a model for the resigned, nor is he simply a victim, but rather he is the Man who lives this condition "from the heart" in full transparency to the love of the Father, that is, to the Holy Spirit. He is the model of the "poor in spirit" and of all the other "blesseds" of the Gospel, who carry out God's will and bear witness to his Kingdom.

And then, Jesus says that if we go to him, we will find rest. The "rest" that Christ offers to the weary and oppressed is not merely psychological solace or donated charity, but the joy of the poor who are evangelized and are builders of the new humanity: this is solace. Joy. The joy that Jesus gives us. It is unique. It is the joy that he himself has. It is a message for all of us, for all people of good will, which Jesus still conveys today in the world that exalts those who become rich and powerful... But how often do we say, "Ah, I would like to be like him, or like her, who is rich, has a lot of power, lacks nothing...". The world exalts those who are rich and powerful, no matter by what means, and at times tramples upon the human being and his or her dignity. And we see this every day, the poor trampled underfoot... And it is a message for the Church, called to live works of mercy and to evangelize the poor, to be meek and humble. This is how the Lord wants his Church, that is, us, to be.

Mary, the humblest and highest of creatures, implore from God wisdom of heart for us, so that we may discern his signs in our lives and be participants in those mysteries which, hidden from the proud, are revealed to the humble.





PAPA FRANCISCO - ÁNGELUS - PLAZA DE SAN PEDRO

(DOMINGO, 05 DE JULIO DE 2020)

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días!

Fel pasaje evangélico de este domingo (cfr. Mt 11, 25-30) está dividido en tres partes: primero Jesús alza un himno de bendición y de agradecimiento al Padre, porque ha revelado a los pobres y a los sencillos el misterio del Reino de los cielos; después desvela la relación íntima y singular que hay entre Él y el Padre; y finalmente invita a acudir a Él y a seguirlo para encontrar alivio.

El primer lugar, Jesús alaba al Padre, porque ha ocultado los secretos de su Reino, de su verdad, «a sabios e inteligentes» (v. 25). Los llama así con un velo de ironía, porque presumen que son sabios, inteligentes, y por tanto tienen el corazón cerrado, muchas veces. La verdadera sabiduría también viene del corazón, no es solamente entender ideas: la verdadera sabiduría entra también en el corazón. Y si tú sabes muchas cosas pero tienes el corazón cerrado, tú no eres sabio. Jesús dice que los misterios de su Padre han sido revelados a los «pequeños», a los que se abren con confianza a su Palabra de salvación, abren el corazón a la Palabra de salvación, sienten la necesidad de Él y esperan todo de Él. El corazón abierto y confiado hacia el Señor.

Después, Jesús explica que ha recibido todo del Padre, y lo llama «mi Padre», para afirmar la unicidad de su relación con Él. De hecho, solo entre el Hijo y el Padre hay total reciprocidad: el uno conoce al otro, el uno vive en el otro. Pero esta comunión única es como una flor que brota, para revelar gratuitamente su belleza y su bondad. Y de aquí la invitación de Jesús: «Venid a mí...» (v. 28).

Él quiere donar lo que toma del Padre. Quiere donarnos la verdad, y la verdad de Jesús es siempre gratuita: es un don, es el Espíritu Santo, la Verdad.

Como el Padre tiene una preferencia por los «pequeños», también Jesús se dirige a los «fatigados y sobrecargados». Es más, se pone Él mismo en medio de ellos, porque Él es el «manco y humilde de corazón» (v. 29), así dice que es.

Como en la primera y en la tercera bienaventuranza, la de los humildes o pobres de espíritu; y la de los mansos (cfr. Mt 5, 3-5): la mansedumbre de Jesús. Así Jesús, «manco y humilde», no es un modelo para los resignados ni simplemente una víctima, sino que es el Hombre que vive «de corazón» esta condición en plena transparencia al amor del Padre, es decir al Espíritu Santo. Él es el modelo de los «pobres de espíritu» y de todos los otros bienaventurados del Evangelio, que cumplen la voluntad de Dios y testimonian su Reino.

Y después, Jesús dice que si vamos a Él encontraremos descanso: el «descanso» que Cristo ofrece a los cansados y oprimidos no es un alivio solamente psicológico o una limosna donada, sino la alegría de los pobres de ser evangelizados y constructores de la nueva humanidad. Este es el alivio: la alegría, la alegría que nos da Jesús. Es única, es la alegría que Él mismo tiene. Es un mensaje para todos nosotros, para todos los hombres de buena voluntad, que Jesús dirige todavía hoy en el mundo, que exalta a quien se hace rico y poderoso. Cuántas veces decimos: «¡Ah, quisiera ser como ese, como esa, que es rico, tiene mucho poder, no le falta nada!». El mundo exalta al rico y poderoso, no importa con qué medios, y a veces pisando a la persona humana y su dignidad. Y esto lo vemos todos los días, los pobres pisados. Y es un mensaje para la Iglesia, llamada a vivir las obras de misericordia y a evangelizar a los pobres, a ser mansos, humildes. Así el Señor quiere que sea su Iglesia, es decir nosotros.

María, la más humilde y la más alta entre las criaturas, implore a Dios para nosotros la sabiduría del corazón, para que sepamos discernir sus signos en nuestra vida y ser partícipes de esos misterios que, ocultos a los soberbios, son revelados a los humildes.


