



"Pilgrims of Hope"

TWO BY TWO.

Dear brothers and sisters, buongiorno!

The Gospel of today's Liturgy recounts the parable of the Good Samaritan (cf. Lk 10:25-37) — we all know it. In the backdrop is the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Jericho along which lies a man who had been beaten badly and robbed by brigands. A priest passing by sees him but does not stop; he keeps on going. A Levite, someone who performed services in the temple, does the same thing. "But a Samaritan", the Gospel says, "as he journeyed, came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion" (v. 33). Let us not forget these words — "he had compassion" on him. This is what God feels every time he sees us in a problem, in sin, in misery. "He had compassion" on him. The Evangelist makes it a point to specify that this Samaritan was on a journey. So, even though he had his own plans and was heading towards a distant destination, this Samaritan does not come up with an excuse but allows himself to get involved. He allows himself to get involved with what had happened along the road. Let us think about this: isn't the Lord teaching us to do just that? To look off into the distance, to our final destination, while paying close attention to the steps to take here and now in order to get there.

It is significant that the first Christians were called "disciples of the Way" (cf. Acts 9:2), that is, of the journey. In fact, believers strongly resemble the Samaritan — like him, the believer is on a journey, he is a wayfarer. Believers know they have not "arrived", but they want to learn each day, following the Lord Jesus who said: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6). "I am the way". The disciple of Christ walks along following Him and thus becomes a "disciple of the Way". He or she goes after the Lord, who is not sedentary but is always on the way. Along the way, he or she meets people, heals the sick, visits villages and cities. This is what the Lord did, he was always on the move.

The "disciple of the Way" — that is, we Christians — observes, therefore, that his or her way of thinking and of acting gradually changes, becoming more and more conformed to that of the Master. Walking in Christ's footsteps, the disciple becomes a wayfarer and — like the Samaritan — learns to see and to have compassion. He sees and has compassion on him. First of all, to see: his eyes are open to reality, not egotistically closed in on the circle of his own thoughts. Instead, the priest and the Levite see the unfortunate man, but they pass by as if they do not see him, they look the other way. The Gospel teaches us to see — it leads each of us to correctly understand reality, overcoming preconceptions and dogmatism each day. So many believers take refuge behind dogmatisms to defend themselves from reality. Then, it teaches us to follow Jesus, because following Jesus teaches us to

have compassion — to become aware of others, especially those who suffer, those who are most in need, and to intervene like the Samaritan, not to pass by but to stop.

Faced with this Gospel parable, it can happen that we might blame others or blame ourselves, pointing fingers at others, comparing them to the priest or the Levite — "This person, that person goes on, that one doesn't stop..." — or even to blame ourselves, counting our own failures to pay attention to our neighbours. But I would like to suggest another type of exercise to you all, not one that finds fault, no. Certainly, we must recognise when we have been indifferent and have justified ourselves. But let us not stop there. We must acknowledge this, it is a mistake. But let us ask the Lord to help us overcome our selfish indifference and put ourselves on the Way. Let us ask him to see and to have compassion. This is a grace we need to ask of the Lord: "Lord, that I might see, that I might have compassion just like you see me and have compassion on me". This is the prayer that I suggest to you today. "Lord, that I might see and have compassion just like you see me and have compassion on me" — that we might have compassion on those whom we encounter along the way, above all on those who suffer and are in need, to draw near to them and do what we can do to give them a hand.

Often, when I am with a Christian person who comes to speak about spiritual things, I ask if they give alms. "Yes", the person says to me.

"So, tell me, do you touch the hand of the person you give the money to"?

"No, no, I throw it there".

"And do you look into the eyes of that person"?

"No, it doesn't cross my mind".

If you give alms without touching the reality, without looking into the eyes of the person in need, those alms are for you, not for that person. Think about this. Do I touch poverty, even the poverty that I am helping? Do I look into the eyes of the people who suffer, of the people that I help? I leave you with this thought — to see and to have compassion.

May the Virgin Mary accompany us on this journey of growth. May she, who "shows us the Way", that is Jesus, help us also to become ever more "disciples of the Way".

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días!

El Evangelio de la Liturgia de hoy narra la parábola del buen samaritano (cfr. Lc 10,25-37); todos la conocemos. Como telón de fondo, el camino que desciende desde Jerusalén hasta Jericó; a un lado, yace un hombre al que los ladrones han golpeado y robado. Un sacerdote que pasa lo ve pero no se detiene, sigue adelante; lo mismo hace un levita, esto es, un encargado del culto en el templo. «En cambio —dice el Evangelio—, un samaritano que viajaba por allí, al pasar junto a él, lo vio y tuvo compasión» (v. 33). No olvidemos estas palabras: “tuvo compasión”; es lo que siente Dios cada vez que nos ve en dificultad, en pecado, en una miseria: “tuvo compasión”. El evangelista desea precisar que el samaritano viajaba. Por tanto, aquel samaritano, a pesar de tener sus propios planes y de dirigirse a una meta lejana, no busca excusas y se deja interpelar por lo que sucede a lo largo del camino. Pensémoslo: ¿No nos enseña el Señor a comportarnos precisamente así? A mirar a lo lejos, a la meta final, poniendo al mismo tiempo mucha atención en los pasos que hay que dar, aquí y ahora, para llegar a ella.

Es significativo que los primeros cristianos fuesen llamados “discípulos del Camino” (cfr. Hch 9,2). El creyente, en efecto, se parece mucho al samaritano: como él, está de viaje, es un viandante. Sabe que no es una persona “que ha llegado”, y desea aprender todos los días siguiendo al Señor Jesús, que dijo: «Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida» (Jn 14, 6). Yo soy el Camino: el discípulo de Cristo camina siguiéndolo a Él, y así se hace “discípulo del Camino”. Va detrás del Señor, que no es sedentario sino que está siempre en camino: por el camino encuentra a las personas, cura a los enfermos, visita pueblos y ciudades. Así actuó el Señor, siempre en camino.

De este modo, el “discípulo del Camino”—es decir, nosotros los cristianos—ve que su modo de pensar y de obrar cambia gradualmente, haciéndose cada vez más conforme al del Maestro. Caminando sobre las huellas de Cristo, se convierte en viandante y aprende—como el samaritano— a ver y a tener compasión. Ve y siente compasión. Ante todo, ve: abre los ojos a la realidad, no está egoístamente encerrado en el círculo de sus propios pensamientos. En cambio, el sacerdote y el levita ven al desgraciado pero es como si no lo hubiesen visto, pasan de largo, miran a otro lado. El Evangelio nos educa a ver: guía a cada uno de nosotros a comprender rectamente la realidad, superando día tras día ideas preconce-

bidas y dogmatismos. Muchos creyentes se refugian en dogmatismos para defenderse de la realidad. Y, además, seguir a Jesús nos enseña a tener compasión: a fijarnos en los demás, sobre todo en quien sufre, en el más necesitado, y a intervenir como el samaritano: no pasar de largo sino detenerse.

Ante esta parábola evangélica puede suceder que culpabilizamos o nos culpabilicemos, que señalemos con el dedo a los demás comparándolos con el sacerdote y el levita: “¡Este y aquel pasan de largo, no se detienen!”; o que nos culpabilicemos a nosotros mismos enumerando nuestras faltas de atención al prójimo. Pero quisiera sugerir otro tipo de ejercicio. Cierto, cuando hemos sido indiferentes y nos hemos justificado, debemos reconocerlo; pero no nos detengamos ahí. Hemos de reconocerlo, es un error, pero pidamos al Señor que nos haga salir de nuestra indiferencia egoísta y que nos ponga en el Camino. Pidámosle que nos haga ver y tener compasión. Esta es una gracia, tenemos que pedirla al Señor: “Señor, que yo vea, que yo tenga compasión, como Tú me ves a mí y tienes compasión de mí”. Esta es la oración que os sugiero hoy: “Señor, que yo vea, que yo tenga compasión, como Tú me ves y tienes compasión de mí”. Que tengamos compasión de quienes encontramos en nuestro recorrido, sobre todo de quien sufre y está necesitado, para acercarnos y hacer lo que podamos para echar una mano.

A menudo, cuando me encuentro con algún cristiano o cristiana que viene a hablar de cosas espirituales, le pregunto si da limosna. “Sí”, me dice. —“Y, dime, ¿tú tocas la mano de la persona a la que das la moneda?” —“No, no, la dejo caer”. —“¿Y tú miras a los ojos a esa persona?” —“No, no se me ocurre”. Si tú das limosna sin tocar la realidad, sin mirar a los ojos de la persona necesitada, esa limosna es para ti, no para ella. Piensa en esto: “¿Yo toco las miserias, también esas miserias que ayudo? ¿Miro a los ojos a las personas que sufren, a las personas a las que ayudo?” Os dejo este pensamiento: ver y tener compasión.

Que la Virgen María nos acompañe en esta vía de crecimiento. Que Ella, que nos “muestra el Camino”, esto es, Jesús, nos ayude también a ser cada vez más “discípulos del Camino”.
